ONE ARAB KILLED, THREE MEN INCLUDING AN ISRAELI WOUNDED IN NEW CLASH

JERUSALEM, Feb. 18. (JTA) -- A three-pronged clash on the Gaza Strip frontier last night, involving Israeli border patrolmen, a unit of the United Nations Emergency Force, and a group of Egyptian infiltrators, has resulted in the death of one Arab and the wounding of three other men. The three injured are an Israeli soldier, another belonging to UNEF, and one of the Arab infiltrators.

Reports on the clash, varying on some of the details, were issued today by Israel's military spokesman and by UNEF headquarters at Gaza.

According to Israel's military spokesman, Arab ambushers opened fire on the Israeli patrol last night, a couple of miles inside Israel's frontier, near the Tel Reim settlement, east of Gaza. In the resulting exchange of fire, one Israeli border patrolman was wounded, but not seriously.

A short time later, the Israelis saw some suspicious movements along the border. When the Israelis challenged the group and received no reply, the Israelis opened fire. Soon afterward, a UNEF officer told the Israelis one of his men had been wounded, and asked for medical aid. The Israelis took the wounded UNEF soldier to an Israeli hospital.

UNEF sources reported that the Israelis had actually "encountered" the UNEF group, which had presumably crossed the Israel frontier by mistake.

Meanwhile, UNEF headquarters reported that one of its units encountered a group of Arabs inside Gaza territory, coming from the Israel border. When the Arabs opened fire on the UNEF unit, the United Nations soldiers retaliated, killing one Arab and wounding another. UNEF headquarters said also that one of the UN soldiers was slightly wounded when a UNEF patrol "was shot at by an Israeli patrol."

The Egyptian attempt to infiltrate into Israel last night was the second in two nights, the third in a week. Two nights ago, Israelis killed two Arab infiltrators in an exchange of fire inside Israel's border.

RUSSIAN RADIO ATTACKS U. J. A. SPECIAL FUND DRIVE AND GOLDA MEIR

MUNICH, Feb. 18. (JTA) -- The Soviet radio has renewed its propaganda attack against Israel. This time it lumps the United Jewish Appeal, Israel's Foreign Minister Golda Meir, and the Israel Defense Ministry in an alleged "plot" to flood Israel with immigrants so that Israel's army could be increased to 1,000,000 men, and thus defeat its Arab neighbors.

The latest Kremlin blast came in a Moscow Radio broadcast, in Arabic, beamed to the Near and Middle East and monitored here. Referring specifically to the current visit to the United States by Mrs. Meir, and to the 1959 UJA campaign for a special \$100,000,000 fund to aid the new immigration into Israel and the absorption of those newcomers, the Moscow Radio commentator stated:

"For the second figure in the Israeli Government to leave in person to collect contributions in the United States is not something accidental. The truth of the matter is that the world Zionist organization known as the United Jewish Appeal has launched a special large-scale campaign to step up contributions for Israel."

"But what is the aim of this campaign? It is learned from this organization that Israel is in need of 100 million dollars for the organization of new large-scale immigration of Jews to Israel."

"But why do the Zionist leaders seek to increase immigration? A comprehensive answer to this question was given recently by Shimon Peres, director general of the Israel Defense Ministry, when he called for speeding up immigration to Israel, as reported by the Israeli press. Peres said that, if we succeeded in organizing a great army of one million strong, then no Arab state can confront us."

"It is known that after drawing up plans for enlarging the Israeli Army in cooperation with Golda Meir, the United Jewish Appeal sought aid initially from the United States. This is further proof that Israel cannot fire its guns without American dollars, and that the United States is to be considered the principal financier of Israel and the main inciter of the Israeli military force."

JEWISH DOCTORS FROM RUMANIA GET INTENSIVE ISRAELI TRAINING

GIVATAIM, Israel, Feb. 18. (JTA) -- The special resettlement problems of the Jews of Rumania coming from the ranks of that country's intellectuals and professionals were vividly outlined here today in discussions with a group of some 200 such experts.

They discussed their problems with a group of visiting American radio and newspaper correspondents, and reported a general belief that the exodus from Rumania was motivated by economic reasons--and apparently has the approval of the Soviet Union.

Apparently much more happy with their new homeland and much less demanding than similar, earlier emigrants from Poland, these professionals are taking intensive Ulpan courses to learn Hebrew quickly as the essential first step toward resuming their professional careers in Israel. They include doctors, lawyers, engineers, accountants, civil servants and similar highly educated types. In age they range from 35 to 60 years and over.

Their families are supported by the Jewish Agency on loans repayable after they obtain employment. The professionals live free in dormitories while studying Hebrew eight hours a day. Free from the worries of making a living during the immediate post-arrival period, they represent part of a total of more than 2,000 similar immigrants in such intensive Hebrew study in the Ulpan courses.

Virtually all of them, regardless of their age, are convinced that, as soon as they know Hebrew, they will become self-supporting quickly. Speaking with love of Israel, they express determination to adjust themselves speedily to life in Israel.

The obstacles the professionals face are best illustrated in the problem presented by the large number of doctors coming in the Rumanian influx. Israel now has 4,000 physicians, a ratio of one to 500 inhabitants, the highest in the world. Moreover, Israel has more opportunities for general practitioners than for the specialists arriving from Rumania.

Nevertheless, vigorous efforts are underway to assure that incoming doctors will be able to resume their profession. The Federation of Physicians Union at a meeting in Tel Aviv last night urged the doctors in Kupat Holim, the health service sponsored by the Histadrut, to forego overtime work and to make place for about 100 immigrant physicians.

Delegates at the meeting were told that the Histadrut was ready to share in the budget needed to absorb newcomers in the Kupat Holim. It was estimated at the meeting that employment for 200 immigrant doctors could be found by extending public health services, that 100 could find positions in preventive medicine and sanitation, and another 150 could find self-employment in private practice.

Meanwhile, physicians from the East European immigration are being sent to hospitals for two to 24 weeks to learn modern medical procedures as used in Israel, and are thus becoming general practitioners.

Israel's industrial expansion makes the problem of absorbing engineers a much simpler one. Lawyers begin their rehabilitation by preparing to pass new examinations.

Authorities estimated that such professionals constitute 14 percent of the current immigration, a percentage expected to rise.

LEADER SAYS MASS IMMIGRATION CUES MAJOR CHANGE IN ISRAEL ECONOMY

NEW YORK, Feb. 18. (JTA) -- Israel's integration of the new mass immigration requires "a new orientation, involving a major change in its economy," Joseph Saphir, the Jewish State's former Minister of Communications, declared here today.

Mr. Saphir made his statement at a press conference at national headquarters of the Zionist Organization of America. The ex-Cabinet minister is one of the top leaders of the General Zionist Party in Israel.

Israel's success in its second decade, said Mr. Saphir, "revolves around its ability to overhaul its economy so as to make it receptive to business investments thus expanding its economic base and creating additional opportunities for employment." He explained that "while during the first decade of its independence the bulk of public funds were invested in the promotion of agriculture rather than industry, in the second decade the process will have to be reversed if we are to concentrate on the creation of additional means of employment."

He further emphasized that, while "absorption of large numbers of immigrants requires considerable financial assistance from abroad, their integration would be speedy and less costly by putting the Israel economy on a business footing." Mr. Saphir also maintained that "as the Israel market will always be small, the entire Israel economy must be oriented for its exports, whether in agriculture or in industry."

ANGLO-JEWISH ASSOCIATION NOT ANTI-ISRAEL, URGES ALL-OUT AID

LONDON, Feb. 18. (JTA) -- An official delegation of the Anglo-Jewish Association will visit Israel next year and will thus make "abundantly clear that there is no question about the Association being anti-Israel or even lukewarm about Israel," R. N. Carvalho, president, declared last night.

Speaking at the annual meeting of the Association, he appealed to British Jewry in general, and to Association members in particular, to respond generously to Israel's appeals for help in absorbing the current mass immigration from Eastern Europe.

He urged every Association member "to squeeze himself until the pipes squeak, both in money and service," and said British Jewry should regard the new immigration as one "for which it is responsible." He said British Jews should welcome the latest influx "as it welcomed other mass immigration from Eastern Europe 50 years ago."

In a review of Association activities in the past year, he said "the most remarkable single phenomenon" in British Jewish life last year was "the rapid rise" in the number of synagogues, Jewish schools and Jewish communal offices. He also reported that young Jews, in growing numbers, were joining Jewish clubs and Jewish social groups, and that more Jewish parents were showing a desire for their children to receive a Jewish education.

Discussing the German problem, he said it was not merely the question of speeding up West German restitution for individual losses by victims of the Nazis that was the greatest problem. He explained that "all of us have been upset by the constant demonstrations of the existence of deeply-entrenched anti-Semitism among the German people."

BRITISH MINISTER SAYS GERMAN PEACE TREATY MUST CURB NAZI REVIVAL

LONDON, Feb. 18. (JTA) -- The prevention of a Nazi resurgence in Germany should be one of the points in any negotiation on a peace treaty for Germany, D. Ormsby-Gore, British Minister of State for Foreign Affairs, declared today in Parliament. But he also called reports of anti-Semitism "grossly exaggerated."

He spoke in comment on a question by A. Swingler, Labor MP, who said that "many people in this country are very dissatisfied with the status of de-nazification." Swingler asked if Ormsby-Gore was aware of the appointments of ex-Nazis as judges and public prosecutors, the formation of an underground SS, and the spread of anti-Semitic propaganda in various parts of Germany. He urged the British Government to pay "serious attention" to the problem.

In his reply, Ormsby-Gore said he was aware of such reports, but he expressed the opinion they were "grossly exaggerated" and imputed part of such reports to Communist activity.

HAMBURG MAGAZINE CONFISCATED BECAUSE IT AIRS CHARGES OF NAZI CODDLING

BONN, Feb. 18. (JTA) -- A new controversy about anti-Semitism in West Germany developed today when the Ministry of the Interior ordered the confiscation of "Der Stern," a Hamburg illustrated magazine.

The action was ordered because the current issue contained an article charging that the West German Office for the Protection of the Constitution has become "a facade" behind which former Nazis are re-established in official positions.

Count Meinhardt Nayhauss, author of the article, asserted that a "clique of former SS men, who organized the Nazi terror and anti-Semitic outrages," has been quietly reinstated, and that they were building "their own network" throughout West Germany.

LONDON LIFTS BAN ON RED FILM ATTACKING GERMAN GENERAL IN NATO

LONDON, Feb. 18. (JTA) -- The London County Council yesterday lifted a ban on the showing of the East German-made anti-Nazi film, "Teutonic Sword," and overruled a similar ban by the Public Control Committee.

The Control Committee and the British Board of Film Censors had banned the film for its alleged attack on West German Gen. Hans Speidel, commander of the NATO Central European Land Forces.

The County Council ruled that, if Gen. Speidel considered himself defamed by the film, he could sue the importers and distributors. Gen. Speidel has indicated no interest in the matter to date.

FIRST GERMAN MADE CARS, TINY ISETTAS, IMPORTED IN ISRAEL

JERUSALEM, Feb. 18. (JTA) -- The first import of German-made cars was recorded in Israel with the arrival today of 120 tiny two-seater Isetta vehicles at the Haifa port.

The cars will sell for 3,500 pounds, about half the price charged for the Israel-assembled four-seat Dauphine Renault cars. The importers said that if the Isettass sell well, an assembly plant may be opened in Israel to produce them.

GLUBB PASHA, STARTING U. S. TOUR IN CAPITAL, BLASTS BALFOUR DECLARATION

WASHINGTON, Feb. 18. (JTA) -- Lt. Gen. Sir John Bagot Glubb, the famous Glubb Pasha who organized and commanded the Arab Legion in Jordan, is in this country for a lecture tour and has unveiled, in this city, the substance of his doctrine.

His preachment was seen here, on the basis of his American lecture debut, in the capital, as advocacy of Western rapprochement with the Arab states and reversal of Anglo-American friendship policies regarding Israel.

The Balfour Declaration, issued by Great Britain in 1917, favoring the establishment of a Jewish homeland in Palestine, is seen by Glubb Pasha as the root cause of all present Middle East difficulties. The United States, he holds, "fell into the same trap" of offending the Arab nationalists when it endorsed the Balfour Declaration.

Glubb Pasha made his American lecture debut here before 1,000 members and guests of the Middle East Institute and the English-Speaking Union.

He declared that the Arabs believe Britain deliberately aimed at injuring the Arabs when it "built" a Jewish State. Asserting that he would "not for a moment defend the terrible muddles over these problems," he held that the Western powers, in general, have sought to divide and exploit the Arabs.

Israel, he said, triumphed militarily over the Arabs in 1948 because the Western powers refused to supply the Arab states with sufficient military materiel. The arms embargo enforced by the West in 1948, he held, worked against the Arab side.

The General, who was fired by Jordan's King Hussein, said that Jordan's present economic difficulties are largely attributable to the fact that the little Arab state has been cut off from "its natural export route" via Haifa.

"Warmer approaches" should be made toward the Arabs by Americans, he advised. He asked that the Arabs be given more understanding in regard to their pride and aspirations.

ANTI-SEMITIC AGITATOR, LINKED WITH ATLANTA BOMBING, CONTACTS NASSER

WASHINGTON, Feb. 18. (JTA) -- George L. Rockwell, a Washington area anti-Semitic agitator linked with a suspect in the bombing last October of the Jewish Temple in Atlanta, Ga., was found today to have communicated this month by mail with President Nasser of the United Arab Republic.

Rockwell had participated in anti-Jewish demonstrations that included picketing of the White House and simultaneous picketing in Atlanta.

It was previously revealed that Rockwell received financial support from wealthy Harold N. Arrowsmith, Jr., of Baltimore. According to information that emerged here today, Arrowsmith may now be in contact with Salem Bader, head of the so-called "Arab-Asian Institute," an anti-Israel propaganda front.

It was reported that photographs of anti-Jewish picketing operations in which Rockwell figured have been forwarded to Cairo, and Rockwell's photo, with flattering captions, has appeared in Cairo newspapers.

DENVER RABBINICAL COUNCIL BANS BINGO IN JEWISH HOUSES OF WORSHIP

DENVER, Feb. 18. (JTA) -- The Rabbinical Council of Denver has banned bingo, raffles and games of chance in Denver synagogues and temples, despite the recent legalization of such activities.

The Council, in a statement to all congregations in the area, said that "the congregations of the city and their affiliated groups should not avail themselves of the recently-voted permission to conduct bingo games or raffles. This policy should also apply to organizations that rent or use the facilities of the local synagogues and temple."

U. S. EXPORT-IMPORT BANK VOTES LOAN TO TEXTILE FIRM IN ISRAEL

WASHINGTON, Feb. 18. (JTA) -- The Moller Textile Corporation of Israel will be loaned 1,500,000 Israeli pounds to expand its facilities, the U.S. Export-Import Bank announced today. The loan will be in local currency, and will come from funds derived by the United States in Israel from sale of United States surplus agricultural commodities.

FORTY COLORADO LEGISLATORS BACK BILL BANNING HOUSING DISCRIMINATION

DENVER, Feb. 18. (JTA) -- Forty members of the Colorado Legislature have joined in sponsoring the Alien Bill which would ban discrimination in housing in Colorado, it was disclosed today.

A second bill, aimed at plugging loopholes in the penal code and to provide protection for schools, churches, synagogues and other buildings from malicious mischief, was introduced in the House by Rep. Joe Dolan.
