ZIONIST CONGRESS ISSUES APPEAL TO WORLD JEWRY TO MIGRATE TO ISRAEL

JERUSALEM, Jan. 8. (JTA) -- The 25th World Zionist Congress, which is scheduled to adjourn tomorrow night, adopted a resolution tonight, declaring that "immigration to Israel shall form the principal point of Zionist life in the Jewish communities all over the world."

In the resolution, the Congress appeals "to the Jewish people, wherever they may be, to come to Israel by the thousands, so as to live a full Jewish life, help build the country, and reconstruct their own lives."

The Congress noted two "encouraging" factors in regard to recent immigration. One related to the beginning of the emigration of Hassidim from the United States. The other took note of the recent influx of Jewish physicians from Argentina who have volunteered to settle in border villages.

The resolution requested that a joint study be set up by the Israel Government and the Jewish Agency executive to bring to Israel "all Jews desiring" to emigrate to the Jewish State, and "to avoid recurrence of instances when rescue came too late."

One of the "urgent" goals pinpointed in the resolution calls for immediate aid to the emigration of North African Jewry, the Agency executive being instructed to "take the most energetic action" to implement this emigration.

Special areas regarded by the resolution as needing increased emigration to Israel are "small Jewish communities, where there is danger of spiritual degeneration"; bringing to Israel of North African Jews now residing in France; and bringing to this country of "the remnants of Jews in Cochin China."

The Congress expressed "anxiety" over the relatively small number of recent immigrants who are scheduled to undertake pioneering activities in Israel. It recommended that a special framework for immigrants and for prospective immigrants be established in countries outside Israel.

To help speed Jewish immigration to Israel and facilitate the absorption of the immigrants, the Congress proposed these steps: Transfer of capital and property to Israel, the construction of apartments along standards suitable for the immigrants; the erection of new housing for rental wherever such housing is required, the grant of adequate mortgages for the purchase of apartments, constructive loans to professionals and artisans that would allow these to establish themselves in Israel, and the establishment of a fund to guarantee mortgages.

Deadlocked on Composition of New Executive of Jewish Agency

The Congress was deadlocked today on the question of the composition of a new Jewish Agency executive. Last night Dr. Nahum Goldmann submitted to the Standing Committee of the Congress, tentative proposals as to the executive's composition. However, the proposals were not accepted by the two confederations of General Zionists, which are competing for chairmanship of the New York section of the executive, as well as by the labor parties which oppose the admission of the Herut into the executive.

Discussion on the composition of the executive will come up after midnight tonight before the Steering Committee of the Congress which is composed of representatives of all parties. Dr. Goldmann indicated that, should no agreement be reached on the composition of the executive, he will announce his resignation from the presidency of the World Zionist Organization. The possibility was expressed here that the Congress may authorize the Zionist Actions Committee to elect the new executive, if no agreement is reached during the night. However, this solution is said to be unacceptable to Dr. Goldmann.

EICHMANN TRIAL MAY BE POSTPONED FOR ONE MONTH; MORE PREPARATION NEEDED

JERUSALEM, Jan. 8. (JTA) -- A possibility that the trial of Adolf Eichmann, the Nazi who directed the killing of 6,000,000 European Jews, may be postponed for a month beyond the scheduled date of March 6 was seen here today. Government sources said that various preparations for the trial, including the adoption of necessary special legislation, may not be completed in time for the March date.

AFRICAN 'SUMMIT MEETING' IN CASABLANCA ADOPTS ANTI-ISRAEL RESOLUTION

CASABLANCA, Jan. 8. (JTA) -- A resolution declaring that Israel is "an instrument of imperialism and colonialism, not only in the Middle East but also in Africa" was adopted here last night at the summit meeting of five African states that call themselves "neutralist" in regard to the East-West cold war.

Israel had not been on the agenda of the conference, but the resolution was pushed through by Gamal Abdel Nasser, President of the United Arab Republic. Observers here expressed the opinion that adoption of the Nasser resolution was a slap at Kwame Nkrumah, President of Ghana, and President Modibo Keita, of Mali, both of whom have had good relations with Israel. Other leaders attending the conference, in addition to Nasser, Keita and Nkrumah, were King Mohammed V of Morocco and President Sekou Toure of Guinea.

The resolution, among other things, appealed to African states to oppose the "new" way by which "imperialism" was trying to "create bases" in Africa. This phrasing was considered a reference to Israel's technical assistance program in West Africa, particularly in Ghana.

Prior to the close of the conference, King Mohammed V pledged himself to do his "utmost" to defend "Arab Palestine." He promised that the conference, along with Arab rulers, will defend the "rights" of the Arab refugees from Palestine and their "right" to be "restored to their country."

ZIONIST DELEGATES HEAR REPORT ON NASSER'S MILITARY STRENGTH

JERUSALEM, Jan. 8. (JTA) -- President Nasser of the United Arab Republic has more tanks today than Marshall Montgomery had in his desert victory over Nazi Field Marshall Rommel at El Alamein, Shimon Peres, Israel's Deputy Defense Minister, reported today.

Mr. Peres made the disclosure in a report on Nasser's growing military strength at a meeting of the political committee of the 25th World Zionist Congress.

BILLS IN CONGRESS SEEK TO PROHIBIT U.S. AGENCIES TO YIELD TO ARAB BOYCOTT

WASHINGTON, Jan. 8. (JTA) -- Bills to prohibit United States agencies from imposing contractual provisions which put ships trading with Israel at economic disadvantage, were introduced in Congress this weekend. The bills were prompted by practices followed in the past by the Navy which were considered as a "surrender to the Arab boycott."

Three Democratic members of the House--Mrs. Edna F. Kelly, Herbert Zelenko of New York, and Thomas J. Lane of Massachusetts--reintroduced bills to prevent any U.S. Department or agency to enter into any charter containing provisions which would make ship owners liable for expenses incurred, if their ships are penalized by Arab authorities for having traded with Israel.

A clause to this effect was included in forms of the Military Sea Transportation Service, inviting bids to carry cargo, mainly oil, for the Navy. The clause was intended to discourage ships trading with Israel from participating in these bids, since an oil tanker was refused facilities by Saudi Arabia for having traded with Israel, and the ship's company sued the Navy for damages.

When these practices became public knowledge about a year ago, after having been followed for two years, the Navy came under sharp criticism both in Congress and in the press. Following the public indignation over the "surrender to the Arab boycott," the Navy announced that it will discontinue the use of the offending clause. But Vice Admiral Roy Gano, MSTC commander, said at the same time that "a business man whose ship has traded with Israel will be very foolish to bid on MSTC oil cargoes," explaining that the owners will still be held responsible for extra expenses.

Some legal experts felt legislation was necessary to prevent the recurrence of past practices. Bills were introduced in the last Congress, but it was too late in the crowded legislative session for them to be considered. They have now been re-introduced in the 87th Congress.

DEMAND FOR JEWISH EMIGRATION FROM RUSSIA TERMED 'ABSURD' IN MOSCOW

WASHINGTON, Jan. 8. (JTA) -- The Moscow newspaper "Trud" today replied to the World Zionist Congress in Jerusalem with a denunciation of Zionism, Israel, and rejecting as "quite absurd" the "declaration of the leaders of Zionism and Government leaders of Israel about oppression of the Jewish population in the Soviet Union and their demand for immediate migration of 1,500,000 Jews from the USSR to Israel."

Trud termed Zionism "a tool of American imperialism" and said the Jerusalem meeting was "a rally of bankrupts." The Communist newspaper, reflecting the Kremlin view, said: "The most reactionary Zionist elements, headed by Ben-Gurion, have come to power in Israel and have turned Israel into a tool of imperialism, above all of the monopolies of the U.S.A."

According to Trud, Jewish workers in Israel are subjected to terror. "In Israel," said Trud, "thousands of Jews are unemployed, ill-housed, and Jews from Asia and Africa are discriminated against by Israelis of European origin."

BILL IN CONGRESS RECOMMENDS DEATH PENALTY FOR BOMBING SYNAGOGUES

WASHINGTON, Jan. 8. (JTA) -- The bombing of a church or synagogue, or other public building would be made punishable by death, under a bill introduced in the new Congress this weekend by Rep. Victor L. Anfuso.

The Brooklyn Democrat proposes to amend the U.S. Code so as to make bombings of public religious or other buildings, with an explosive transported in interstate commerce, a crime punishable by death. Present laws were considered too "soft" to deter potential criminals from carrying out their design--particularly after the bombing craze in the South last year.

BONN INVESTIGATES ANTI-JEWISH CHARGES LEVELED AGAINST ADENAUER'S AIDE

FRANKFURT, Jan. 8. (JTA) -- Dr. Fritz Bauer, prosecutor for the State of Hesse, confirmed here today that a criminal investigation has been launched into the wartime activities of Dr. Hans Globke, West German State Secretary and right-hand man to Chancellor Konrad Adenauer. Reports that such a probe was under way had emanated recently from Communist sources in East Germany, Czechoslovakia and the Soviet Union.

The State Attorney declined to reveal the specific reasons for the new probe. Dr. Globke was the commentator of the Nuremberg race laws during the Nazi regime, and has been accused of interpreting the laws in a fashion which made their application of maximum harm to German Jews.

In recent weeks, Soviet, East German and Czechoslovak authorities have accused him of direct cooperation with Adolf Eichmann, the SS Colonel who directed the extermination of the 6,000,000 European Jews, and who is now awaiting trial in Israel. The Communist accusers charged that Dr. Globke implemented laws in Nazi-occupied territories which prepared the way for the mass murder of Jews.

A spokesman in the Chancellor's office told the Jewish Telegraphic Agency that the investigation against Dr. Globke was only of a "preliminary" nature. The spokesman declared that Chancellor Adenauer and Dr. Globke had filed libel charges against some unidentified persons who have accused Dr. Globke of preventing the liberation of 10,000 Greek Jews and their travel to countries abroad. The spokesman said Dr. Globke had declared he never spoke with Eichmann, and that there was no foundation for the report about the Greek Jews.

MOROCCAN JEWS PROHIBITED TO ADOPT NAMES WHICH ARE NOT IN OLD TESTAMENT

CASABLANCA, Jan. 8. (JTA) -- The Chief of Police in Casablanca today received an order to prohibit Moroccan Jews from adopting first names which are not in the Old Testament.

The order bans the adoption of such names as Serge, Michel, Bernard, Paul, Andre, Albert, etc., which are in use among Moroccan Jews. Under the order, the only permissible names are Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, etc.

Meyer Obadia, president of the Casablanca Jewish community, made a formal protest to Casablanca authorities and it was indicated that the dispute would be settled to the satisfaction of the Jewish community.

MOROCCAN POLICE ARREST JEWISH CHILDREN WEARING BLUE-WHITE SKULL CAPS

CASABLANCA, Jan. 8. (JTA) -- Casablanca police carried out a night raid in the Jewish quarter in which they systematically detained Jewish children wearing blue and white skull caps and arrested some 20 Jewish youth; it was reported here today.

The police action coincided with the arrival in Casablanca of President Nasser of the United Arab Republic for the African "summit" conference. Police even arrested M. Toblay, brother of the president of the Jewish community in Sefrou, because he was wearing a blue tie with his white shirt. He was released on intervention by Max Loeub of the Casablanca Municipal Council.

The raids, which caused a deep stir among Moroccan Jews, apparently were carried out in other parts of Morocco as well.

JEWISH STUDENTS IN FRANCE PROTEST SOVIET SUPPRESSION OF JEWISH RIGHTS

PARIS, Jan. 8. (JTA) -- The Jewish Students Union of France, an organization considered leftist in its tendencies, adopted a resolution last night expressing "concern" over the "deprivation of legal rights" inflicted upon Jews in the Soviet Union, it became known here today.

As a result of that resolution, the overall French Students Union, with which the Jewish group is affiliated, was reported today planning to launch a campaign calling upon the Soviet Government to cease its discriminations against the Jews in the USSR.

The entire subject of Russian persecutions against Jews is in the forefront here now, as two well-known French Jews are preparing to make separate trips to Russia to probe the situation. One is Andre Blumel, former president of the French Zionist Organization. The other is Daniel Mayer, president of the International League for the Rights of Man.

IMPORTANCE OF J. T. A. TO ISRAELI PRESS STRESSED BY EDITORS ASSOCIATION

JERUSALEM, Jan. 8. (JTA) -- The importance of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency for the press in Israel was emphasized here by Gershon Shoken, publisher of Haaretz, a leading Israeli daily newspaper, and president of the Association of Israeli Editors, at a luncheon given by the Association in honor of Eleazar Lipsky, JTA president.

Louis Segal, member of the Jewish Agency executive, who is also a member of the JTA's board of directors, spoke at the luncheon about the vital role which the Jewish Telegraphic Agency plays in serving as a link between Jewish communities throughout the world. Mr. Lipsky outlined JTA plans and problems at the gathering.

OUTLOOK FOR JUDAISM IN U.S. DISCUSSED AT CONSERVATIVE CONVENTION

NEW YORK, Jan. 8. (JTA) -- "Within 25 to 50 years in America, a Jew will find it difficult to define the title Jew unless the name bears unmistakable relationship to religion and to the synagogue," Rabbi Edward T. Sandrow, president of the Rabbinical Assembly of America, declared today. He addressed the 1961 biennial convention of the New York Metropolitan Region of the United Synagogue of America, central body of the Conservative religious movement. More than 1,000 delegates are attending the parley.

Rabbi Sandrow, who attended the World Zionist Congress in Jerusalem as a representative of a non-Zionist national rabbinical body, took issue with the organizations in the United States that criticized Israel's Prime Minister David Ben-Gurion for the remark which he made in his speech at the Zionist Congress, quoting the sages as declaring that any Orthodox Jew who does not live in Israel is not fulfilling the Mizvot (commandments) of the Torah.

"The totality of Ben-Gurion's speech was lost; he is completely consistent and did not say anything he has not said right along," Rabbi Sandrow emphasized. He reported that "the Rabbinical Assembly of America, as the only national rabbinic body represented at the Zionist Congress, recommended, not the liquidation of the World Zionist Organization, but its broadening into the Jewish community of the world."

Speaking about the future of Judaism in the United States, Rabbi Sandrow said that "the real Jew in this country is doomed not to perpetual extinction but to perpetual frustration and conflict." He urged Conservative Jews in this country to work for Israel, because, outside America, it is "the only place that can contribute to the survival of our way of life."

N. Y. TIMES SETS RECORD STRAIGHT ON BEN-GURION'S SPEECH AT ZIONIST CONGRESS

NEW YORK, Jan. 8. (JTA) -- Wide attention was focused in Jewish circles in the United States today on a New York Times reprint of the complete text of the address delivered ten days ago in Jerusalem by Israel's Prime Minister David Ben-Gurion, before the 25th World Zionist Congress. Today's Times devoted nearly two full pages to the entire Ben-Gurion text.

Zionist spokesmen here and in Jerusalem had contended that the Times, in its original report from the Zionist Congress on December 29, had quoted Mr. Ben-Gurion "out of context" in regard to a statement by the Israeli leader, charging Orthodox Jews with "godlessness" if they do not settle in Israel.

Today's full quotation of the entire text by Mr. Ben-Gurion was seen as an effort of the Times to set the record straight. The complete text of Mr. Ben-Gurion's speech, originally delivered in Hebrew, was in the English-language version furnished by the World Zionist Organization. According to the Times, today, "the theme of the Israeli leader's speech is that Israel and Jews outside of Israel are interdependent" and that both depend for survival on "pioneering and productive" Jewish immigration to Israel and on "Jewish education for the younger Jewish generations outside Israel."

The space allotted by the Times to Premier Ben-Gurion's address is usually accorded only to major addresses by the United States President or other world leaders speaking on major issues of international importance.

BRANDEIS STUDENTS TO GO TO ISRAEL FOR STUDY UNDER OWN FACULTY

WALTHAM, Mass., Jan. 8. (JTA) -- Brandeis University will launch a "traveling university" in Israel next summer, when a select number of Brandeis juniors will go to Israel to study and travel in the Jewish State under the instruction of members of the Brandeis faculty, according to an announcement made here today by Dr. Abram L. Sachar, president of the university.

The program has been underwritten by an initial \$250,000 grant from Mr. and Mrs. Jacob Hiatt, of Worcester, Mass., in its second year of operation. Dr. Sachar said, the program will be opened to qualified students regardless of race, color or creed, from any accredited American college or university.
