## GUARANTEES FOR JEWS REMAINING IN ALGERIA CONSIDERED INSUFFICIENT

LONDON, March 6. (JTA) -- The reported guarantees for Jews remaining in an independent Algeria will not solve all the problems they will face, R.N. Carvalho, president of the Anglo-Jewish Association, declared here tonight.

Speaking at a meeting of the group's council, he said the guarantees, which are understood to have been negotiated by Algerian rebel leaders with France, would be "an invaluable step," in that they would enable Jews wishing to leave Algeria to go to France on the same terms as non-Jewish Frenchmen.

He added, however, that the agreement "will not enable the Algerian Jews to realize their assets or make it any easier for those who want to remain to live in a Moslem state, particularly in one where the local population has been driven to 'hatred of French and Europeans.'"

He also urged that the French settlers were not likely to accept the terms of the agreement peaceably and that in many places, Algerian Jews had identified themselves with the extremists of the OAS, the European underground which violently opposes an independent Algeria. The Jewish community, he said, "cannot avoid the troubles which lie ahead; whichever side the Jews identify themselves with, they are bound to be involved in conflict."

Discussing the situation of Soviet Jewry, the Anglo-Jewish leader said there was nothing new to say about Russia except to "express our indignation and horror at what appears to be a recrudescence of some of the worst anti-Semitism of the Stalin era" on an official governmental basis.

He said it was "almost impossible to understand" why the Soviet Government had adopted this attitude toward "a relatively insignificant minority." He asked, "What if Russian Jews do establish contact with Jews abroad? What even if some of them decide they wish to live in Israel? What harm can this do to the monolithic Communist regime? Other smaller, weaker and more precarious Communist states have managed to withstand such batterings."

## ESHKOL CONCLUDES TALKS IN EUROPE ON COMMON MARKET; RETURNS TO ISRAEL

BRUSSELS, March 6. (JTA) -- Israel's Finance Minister Levi Eshkol continued today his whirlwind round of visits with officials of member countries of the European Common Market in his effort to mobilize support for a link between Israel and the European Economic Community.

Returning from a quick visit to Paris, the Finance Minister met today with Eugene Schaus, Foreign Minister of Luxemburg, and Professor Walter Hallstein, president of the EEC executive committee.

A communique issued after the one-hour conversation with Prof. Hallstein said merely that "problems of common interest were discussed." The EEC Council of Ministers, which Israel officials hope will take up Israel's request, continued its meetings today and scheduled a session for tonight. The Finance Minister will leave for Israel by El Al plane tomorrow.

## ISRAELI ARABS DISCOVERED SHELTERING SYRIAN SABOTEURS; SEVEN ARRESTED

JERUSALEM, March 6. (JTA) -- Seven Israeli Arabs were arrested today in the Galilee region, on suspicion of having aided and sheltered Syrian saboteurs who planted anti-vehicle mines near the national pipeline in the North.

The arrests followed the explosion of some mines near Kibbutz Beeri, when the explosives were touched off by some Israeli tractors used in the area. No one was hurt in the explosion.

Israeli authorities view the case of the seven suspects with extreme gravity, since this is the first time local Arabs have aided the attempts by Syrians to sabotage the national development project.

## MOSCOW CHARGES ISRAEL WITH PREPARING FOR AN ATTACK ON ARAB STATES

JERUSALEM, March 6: (JTA) -- A Moscow radio Arabic transmission monitored here today charged that Israel "had learned nothing from the Sinai campaign" and was "once more preparing to wage a war of aggression against Arab countries."

The broadcast asserted that Prime Minister David Ben-Gurion "hopes to get support of the imperialists for another adventure." In support of the charges, the broadcast declared that Israel had increased defense outlays.

## SOVIET TOP EXPERT ON ARAB AFFAIRS GETS HIGH POSITION IN UNITED NATIONS

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y., March 6: (JTA) -- One of the Kremlin's foremost experts on Arab affairs, formerly Moscow's Ambassador to Egypt, was named here today as Undersecretary of the United Nations, officially designated as one of the principal advisers to Acting Secretary-General U Thant. The new appointee is Eugeny D. Kiselev, who will succeed Undersecretary Georgy P. Arkadev. The latter resigned today, effective March 14.

Mr. Kiselev, who is 54, has been in the Soviet diplomatic service since 1938, and his last position was as head of the Department of Near Eastern Countries in the Moscow Foreign Ministry. Consul-General in New York from 1943 to 1945, he held various other important posts, and was Ambassador to Egypt from 1955 to 1958, Minister at the same time to Yemen, and Ambassador to the United Arab Republic in 1958 and 1959.

At the same time today, it was announced that Dr. Omar Loutfi, former UAR permanent representative here, recently appointed as Undersecretary, has been designated officially as one of the two top Secretariat members in charge of special political affairs. The other official holding that title is Dr. Ralph J. Bunche.

## ISRAEL'S EXPORT TARGET FOR 1962 IS \$500,000,000, MINISTER ANNOUNCES

JERUSALEM, March 6: (JTA) -- Israel's export target for 1962 is the sale abroad of \$300,000,000 worth of "visible exports," and \$500,000,000 from all exports, Minister of Commerce and Industry Pinhas Sapir declared here today. He made this optimistic statement at ceremonies honoring several of Israel's foremost exporters with special certificates of "approved exporter."

Emphasizing that Israel's economy could operate effectively under the new exchange rate of three Israeli pounds per dollar, Mr. Sapir declared "we can meet the export test." Much, he added, will depend on organizing production more efficiently, gaining confidence and raising Israeli productivity. The exporters who received certificates were congratulated by President Izhak Ben-Zvi, who expressed the hope that they will achieve still greater heights in the coming years.

Fifty-one Israeli firms, last year, exported goods valued at \$1,000,000 or more each, accounting for more than 50 percent of the country's overseas sales, Mr. Sapir disclosed. A total of 150 other firms piled up exports of \$100,000 or more each, totaling among them 30 percent additional of the country's aggregate exports.

Among the 1961 exporters who sold a million dollars worth or more each were the Citrus Marketing Board, with sales totaling over \$40,000,000; the diamond industries, Israel Mining Industries, Alliance Tires, Samson Tire and Rubber, Ata Textiles, Neshet Cement Works, the Rogsin Industries, and the Kaiser Ilin Industries.

## AMERICAN JEWISH INVESTORS TO CONSTRUCT HOUSES FOR ARABS IN NEGEV

JERUSALEM, March 6: (JTA) -- American Jewish investors will construct 3,000 housing units in the Arab section of the Negev, it was announced here today by the Ministry of Housing. In the first stage of this undertaking, the announcement stated, 1,200 units will be built at a cost of \$1,000,000.

The Ministry today approved an agreement for this investment made in the United States by its director, David Tanne. The investors are American Jews in the building and real estate industries. Construction on the first stage of the program, the Ministry stated, is expected to start by the end of this year.

Dr. William Haber, world president of the ORT, said here today his organization plans to build vocational training schools in Nazareth and Acre to help train Arabs there. The schools also will serve Jewish elementary school graduates in those areas. He said other projects included four schools for apprentices to be set up in the main cities and that talks were now underway with municipal and Israel Government officials for the schools.

## KING OF MOROCCO RECEIVES JEWISH DELEGATION HEADED BY CHIEF RABBI

CASABLANCA, March 6: (JTA) -- Grand Rabbi Danan, president of the Supreme Rabbinical Tribunal of Morocco, accompanied by members of the Jewish Committee of Rabat, conveyed to King Hassan II today the unswerving loyalty of Moroccan Jewry to the throne. The King received the Jewish delegation in connection with the anniversary of his accession to the throne after the death of his father, Mohammed V.

## BALTIMORE HAS REPORTS COLLECTING \$2,000,000 FROM GERMANY IN CLAIMS

BALTIMORE, March 6; (JTA) -- More than two million dollars in indemnification claims benefits have been collected from the West German Government by Hias of Baltimore, over the past 12 years for the more than 700 victims of Nazism now living in Baltimore, it was announced here by Jacob J. Edelman, who was re-elected president of the agency for the third successive year.

Mr. Edelman, who made the announcement at the annual meeting of Hias, said that the \$2, 069, 414 collected as of December 31, 1961, represented 946 individual claim cases; He also said that during this past year alone \$314, 723 had been collected on behalf of 151 clients.

In his annual report, Mr. Edelman said that in addition to lump sum settlement for Nazi victims, Hias of Baltimore had secured monthly life pensions averaging \$62 per month for 134 clients; The filing and processing of indemnification claims against the West German Government now comprises 40 percent of the local Hias activity, Mr. Edelman said.

Mr. James P. Rice, executive director of the United Hias Service, addressing the meeting, pointed out that during 1961, United Hias had resettled throughout the free world 7, 200 refugees from Eastern Europe, North Africa, the Middle East and Cuba, including over 4, 000 in the United States; "Of the 4, 000," Mr. Rice said, "over half came from Cuba;" He also expressed the hope that there would be a renewal of Public Law 86-648 under which refugees from the Middle East and Eastern Europe come, and which expires as of June 30 of this year.

## PHILADELPHIA LAUNCHES 1962 ALLIED APPEAL; RAISES \$1,813,967 AT OPENING

PHILADELPHIA, March 6; (JTA) -- The 1962 Allied Jewish Appeal was launched last night with a near-record opening total of \$1,813,967; Bernard Weinberg, campaign general chairman, announced the amount, largest in ten years.

The pledges were made in a "Roll Call for Freedom" following a plea by Moshe Sharett, former Prime Minister of Israel and present chairman of the Jewish Agency for Israel, who called on the Philadelphia Jewish community, together with other Jews of the free world, to share with Israel in aiding mounting numbers of migrating Jews; Samuel H. Daroff and Myer Feinstein, past presidents of the AJA, conducted the roll call.

While no specific goal has been set for the 1962 AJA, Mr. Weinberg stressed that the campaign aims to surpass last year's \$4,161,000 result by at least a million dollars, primarily to assist the increasing immigration to Israel; The total announced last night included money raised in pre-campaign solicitation since December.

Mr. Sharett declared that the rescue of thousands of Jews who can now migrate depends on the prompt action of those "who are secure in the enjoyment of the boons of freedom and material well-being;" Their reward, he said, will be their recognition of the fact that they did not miss the opportunities offered now for the rescue of a vast number of Jewish men, women and children.

Mr. Sharett stirred the gathering with a new description of Jewish migration to Israel -- a migration sharply in contrast to the disorganization, terror, persecution and murder which forced Jews to flee for safety in the days before the founding of Israel; "Those of us who have visited the main centers of assembly for refugees now on their way to Israel have witnessed a powerfully dramatic spectacle," he said.

"We have seen our people on the march -- no longer helpless and confused, knocking haphazardly at any door and finding most doors closed, but moving confidently toward an historic destiny," he told the audience; The era of aimless drift in Jewish history has ended; The State of Israel has invested it with purpose; The refugees bound for Israel know that they are returning home;

The speaker emphasized that the new immigrants are aware that they are in for a difficult period of readjustment; "But they expect help and believe that they are entitled to it," he said; "The provision of this help, on a scale commensurate with the rapidly growing needs, is a matter of crucial, sharply focussed responsibility, which must be shared by the State of Israel itself and the Jewish communities of the free world -- particularly by the Jews of the United States," he said.

The opening dinner also was addressed by Donald B. Hurwitz, Federation executive director; Chet Huntley, television reporter and commentator, also addressed the meeting, giving an eyewitness account of his observations on the situation and needs of Jewish populations in the Old World and Israel; The Allied Jewish Appeal is sponsored by the Federation of Jewish Agencies of Greater Philadelphia; President of the Federation is Edwin Wolf 2nd.

## BOSTON REFUSES TO RENT HALL TO AMERICAN NAZI PARTY FOR RALLY

BOSTON, March 6; (JTA) -- The management of the Boston Arena today turned down a request by George Rockwell, leader of the American Nazi Party, who sought to rent the facility for a rally next week; Arena officials told Rockwell that "it was not available."

## WIDE DISTRIBUTION OF ANTI-SEMITIC MATERIAL REPORTED IN MASSACHUSETTS

BOSTON, March 6: (JTA) -- Evidence of religious and racial discriminations practiced by clubs in New England, and reports of anti-Semitic literature being disseminated in the Western part of the state, were given here to a meeting of the board of directors of the New England region of B'nai B'rith's Anti-Defamation League.

Analysing the ADL's recent national survey of club discriminations, Morton R. Godine of Brookline, told the board that the study had shown 68 percent of the clubs in New England practiced racial or religious discrimination.

Isadore Zack, of the ADL's civil rights staff, reported that there has been wide distribution of anti-Semitic materials in the area of Pittsfield, Springfield, Holyoke and Northampton, all in the Western part of Massachusetts. The material, he said, bore the imprint of the American Nazi Party. He also reported on the activities of "radical right-wing" groups in New England. Leon J. Kowal, of Newton, was chairman of the board-meeting.

## MONTREAL AMENDS CITY'S ZONING ORDINANCE FOR CANADIAN JEWISH CONGRESS

MONTREAL, March 6: (JTA) -- Montreal's City Council adopted today a special by-law, amending the city's zoning ordinance, to permit the Canadian Jewish Congress to use property in a residential area for the erection of its planned, new national headquarters.

The building, to be called Samuel Bronfman House, may, as a result of the new by-law, be erected on the site in the area where many diplomatic missions and foreign consulates have their headquarters. Word was still awaited from several foreign governments with headquarters in the area as to their willingness to allow the CJC to build its new structure in the restricted area.

Major General Georges P. Vanier, Governor-General of Canada, accepted today an invitation by the Canadian Jewish Congress to address the opening plenary session of the CJC's next annual meeting. The meeting will open at Toronto June 21, and will close June 24.

## NEW YORK MAYOR PROCLAIMS 'ORT DAY'; TO BE OBSERVED THROUGHOUT U.S.

NEW YORK, March 6: (JTA) -- Mayor Robert F. Wagner today proclaimed Wednesday, March 14, as ORT day in recognition of the organization's 82 years of service dedicated to the "building and rebuilding of human lives." In the proclamation issued by the Mayor at City Hall, ORT was praised for supplying "trained manpower to the nations of the free world and to awakening nations."

Ceremonies will be held next Monday when the name of Times Square will be changed to ORT Square, for one week. ORT Day is observed by the more than 400 chapters of Women's American ORT throughout the country and is meant to acquaint the public with the worldwide ORT program of vocational training.

## AMERICAN CANCER SOCIETY GRANTS \$53,200 TO BRANDEIS U. FOR RESEARCH

WALTHAM, Mass., March 6: (JTA) -- The American Cancer Society has granted Brandeis University a special award of \$53,200, to establish Dr. William T. Murakami, of the Brandeis Graduate Department of Biochemistry, as a faculty research associate, it was announced here today.

Dr. Murakami will investigate the biochemical reactions involved in the conversion of virus-infected cells into tumors. The scientist, who received his doctorate at the University of Southern California in 1958, has spent the last two years on a post-doctoral grant at the Pasteur Institute, in Paris, continuing research he had previously begun at Brandeis as a post-doctoral fellow from 1958 to 1960.

## BERNARD NEWMAN NAMED JUSTICE OF NEW YORK STATE SUPREME COURT

ALBANY, N.Y., March 6: (JTA) -- Bernard Newman, former chairman of the New York City Republican Committee, was named by Governor Rockefeller last night a N.Y. State Supreme Court Justice, and was immediately confirmed by the State Senate. He succeeds the late Justice Henry Epstein, and will serve in his post for the unexpired term ending next December 31.

## PIONEER WOMEN PRESENT \$50,000 TO MRS. SHARETT AS GIFT FOR ISRAEL

NEW YORK, March 6: (JTA) -- Pioneer Women, the Women's Labor Zionist Organization of America, presented today to Mrs. Moshe Sharett, wife of the chairman of the Jewish Agency executive, a check for \$50,000 to be transmitted to Moetzet Hapoalot, the organization's sister group in Israel. Mr. and Mrs. Sharett are currently visiting the United States.
