### TWO RABBIS ARRESTED IN ISRAEL IN 'YOSSELE' CASE; PARENTS HIDE YOUTH

JERUSALEM, July 9. (JTA) -- On suspicion that they had been involved in the hiding of 10 year old Yossele Schumacher from his parents, two young rabbis were arrested by police yesterday in Bnai Brak, a town near Tel Aviv, known for its Yeshivot and ultra-Orthodoxy.

Haim Weisner, 23, one of the rabbis arrested, is the son of the dean of the Hachemy Lublin Yeshiva, and a son-in-law of the late Rabbi Meislich of Jerusalem, whose name had earlier been connected with the abduction of Yossele Schumacher. The second rabbi arrested, Rabbi Maklef, is also 23.

Yossele remained hidden today by his parents in a resting place "somewhere in Israel." He was scheduled to appear today in the Jerusalem District Court in a case involving his abduction, but was excused at least for the time being. He had been subpoenaed at the request of attorneys for Zalman and Rifka Kutt, an Orthodox couple involved in his case. But the attorney for the Schumacher family got the court to excuse the boy on the grounds that a Government psychiatrist opposed the court appearance at this time as possibly harmful to the child.

The security chief, meeting today with editors of Israeli daily newspapers, said that the abductors of Yossele had considered having a plastic operation performed on the boy, to prevent his identification. The suggestion that the plastic operation had already been performed was used by his abductors in an attempt to blackmail certain religious personalities in Israel into continuing to work against the boy's return, the security chief declared.

According to the head of the security service, the abductors had not intended at any time to return the boy to Israel, as their main objective was a "holy war" against the State. The ultra-Orthodox groups involved in the Schumacher case, who were said to have headquarters in New York, Jerusalem, London and Switzerland, were alleged to be engaged in a wide anti-Israeli plot and to have acted against the incorporation of Jerusalem in the Jewish State.

Yossele was hidden by his grandfather, Nachman Starkes, nearly three years ago, when the elder man feared that the boy's parents, Alter and Ida Schumacher, would not give him a sufficiently Orthodox education. The boy was later spirited out of Israel by unknown persons, and was found living in Brooklyn last week. He has now been reunited with his parents in Holon, a suburb of Tel Aviv.

### ALGERIAN GOVERNMENT MUM ON ISRAEL'S RECOGNITION; FEARS PRO-NASSER GROUP

PARIS, July 9. (JTA) -- Despite Israel's confirmation that it has formally extended recognition to Algeria, the Algerian Government has, thus far, made no comment whatever in regard to its plans regarding Israel, it was reported here today from Algiers.

The Government of Benyousséf Ben Khedda, at Algiers, is believed inclined to avoid taking any part in the Arab-Israeli conflict. On the other hand, it is believed that Ben Khedda wants to avoid showing any cordiality to Israel that could be criticized by his principal internal opponent, Vice-Premier Mohammed Ben Bella. The latter has visited Cairo three times, conferring with Egypt's President Gamal Abdel Nasser, and is considered ready to follow the Arab League policies of anti-Israelism.

(In New York, Israel's Ambassador Avraham Harman, who was asked on a radio-television broadcast about his country's relations with Algeria, stated: "We wish the Algerians well, and we stand for the principle of national independence. We welcome the Evian agreement and the emergency of Algeria as a result of those agreements to independence. We wish them well. We are prepared to cooperate with them as we have cooperated with all other newly-independent countries.")

### ARGENTINE ANTI-JEWISH ACTIONS PROVOKE PROTEST IN CHILE

SANTIAGO DE CHILE, July 9. (JTA) -- A sharp protest against the spread of anti-Semitism in Argentina was made here today in a communication to Argentine President Jose Maria Guido, by the Chilean Writers Association and the Chilean PEN Club.

U.S. POLICY ON FINANCIAL AID TO NASSER OUTLINED BY STATE DEPARTMENT

WASHINGTON, July 9. (JTA) -- American assistance to the United Arab Republic would not increase Nasser's capability to import arms from the Soviet bloc, nor would withholding assistance decrease that capability, Assistant Secretary of State Frederick G. Dutton declared today.

In a letter addressed to Representative Leonard Farbstein, New York Democrat, the Assistant Secretary asserted that charges that Egypt would have to divert money from domestic needs to pay for Russian arms were "not valid." He said Egypt had "an excess of unused Soviet credits upon which to draw."

The State Department, said Mr. Dutton, recognizes "Israel's deep concern with the issues arising from the Arab-Israel problem." However, he added that "prospects for its settlement and for stability in the region as a whole are improved, if the countries involved are assisted to pursue their legitimate goals for economic development."

Mr. Dutton said that "by demonstrating American interest and support for the U. A. R.'s efforts for economic development, there will be a stronger foundation on which mutual problems can be worked out." He stressed that the State Department was "convinced" of the determination of the Egyptians "to search for progress and to maintain their independence. They urgently require foreign aid in pursuit of these goals," he said.

Israel "Very Concerned" About Egypt's Rearmament, Harman Says

NEW YORK, July 9. (JTA) -- Israel is "very concerned" about Egypt's general rearmament, Israeli Ambassador Avraham Harman said in an interview here last night, given to Senator Kenneth Keating on the latter's weekly radio-television program.

"We're very concerned, of course, by the general picture of rearmament in Egypt," he stated. "It has been going on since 1955, and has been stepped up in the past year. The air aspect of it is, of course, one which concerns us most, but Egyptian rearmament is not limited to the air and it's not limited to MIGs. It has also included in recent months the receipt by them of long-range heavy bombers."

"Also from Russia?" asked Sen. Keating.

"Yes," replied Mr. Harman. "But their plans include a heavy build-up and motorization of their infantry, development of armor and, of course, a rather impressive increase as far as their naval force is concerned."

In reply to a question as to whether increased American aid to Egypt contributes to stability in the Middle East, the Israel Ambassador stated:

"It has always been our view that economic development of countries is a stabilizing factor, and I'd like to make that clear. I think that we, in Israel, would like to see our Arab neighbors concentrate upon the essential job of improving their economic and social situation, and any help that they get in that respect is something to which we would take no exception at all. We'd like to see them concentrate on that.

"Our only doubt about Egypt, in particular, is to what extent Egypt is concentrating upon her own internal affairs. Our feeling is that she is still devoting a considerable degree of her resources to external ventures."

Asked by the Senator whether he saw any "mellowing in Arab antagonism toward Israel," Mr. Herman declared: "I would say that, in recent months, there has been an increase in vituperation. There has been a lot of very wild talk about the destruction of Israel as the Arab plan. I would say that there has been no public mellowing of the Arab attitude toward us -- possibly the contrary."

U.S. CHIEF JUSTICE WARREN HONORED IN ISRAEL; CALLS ON PRESIDENT BEN ZVI

JERUSALEM, July 9 (JTA) -- United States Chief Justice Earl Warren, who is spending a week in Israel, called on President Izhak Ben-Zvi today. Later he visited the Justices of the Supreme Court in their chambers and in the evening was the guest of honor at an informal dinner tendered by Chief Justice Yitzhak Olshan, president of Israel's Supreme Court.

At a reception in his honor yesterday, at the Schocken Institute for Jewish Research, Justice Warren called for the establishment of a "School of Wisdom of the World" to help create the foundation of a world culture and create the basis for real world unity.

Earlier he had visited Mount Herzl and the Hadassah Medical Center and had been the luncheon guest of Education Minister Abba Eban. He also called on the Minister of Justice, Mr. Dov Joseph.

ITALIAN GOVT. ASSURES PARLIAMENT ON ACTION AGAINST ANTI-SEMITES

ROME, July 9. (JTA) -- The Italian Government has given assurance it intends to prevent any recurrence of such anti-Semitic developments as the invasion of the Jewish quarter of Rome in May by election campaigners of the right-wing Movimento Sociale Italiano.

The issue arose in the Italian Senate during a debate on the clashes between Jews and rightists which followed the entry of the campaigners into the Jewish section. Senator Nencioni, a member of the MSI, said his party abjured anti-Semitism and accused Interior Minister Taviani of showing partiality in his action on the incident. When the campaigners threw stones at a synagogue and shouted anti-Semitic epithets, enraged Jews attacked and injured some of the right-wingers before police halted the fighting.

In reply to the Senator, the Minister declared that the Government firmly intended "to prevent any reappearance of anti-Semitic manifestations." He said this objective was "in accordance not only with the constitutional guarantees of freedom for every citizen but also with the moral imperative of the civilized conscience which refutes any kind of discrimination."

The Minister noted he had already given that assurance to the Rome Jewish community. He implied that anti-Semitism was forced on the Italian people during the Hitler-Mussolini partnership "against their will and against their sentiments" and added that Italians had "their own reasons to join the whole civilized world in its condemnation of anti-Semitism."

REQUESTS FOR DISMISSAL OF ANTI-SEMITIC TEACHER MOUNT IN ENGLAND

LONDON, July 9. (JTA) -- The Coventry Education Committee, local school board which has been employing Colin Jordan, leader of the British National Socialist movement, as a school teacher, has received letters from all over England, "demanding overwhelmingly that he not be allowed to continue teaching," it was stated here today by Tom Locksley, vice-chairman of the Coventry Education Committee.

The Coventry board, said Mr. Locksley, will meet July 19, to consider Jordan's possible dismissal from the local school system. Jordan came into renewed prominence last week, following a rally held by his group in Trafalgar Square here. Anti-Semitic slogans and speeches at the rally attracted a crowd of 5,000, and police were forced to arrest 20 of the anti-fascist hecklers before Jordan's group gave up its efforts to continue with the meeting.

Sir Ronald Gould, general secretary of the National Union of Teachers, which had previously announced that it would support Jordan's fight against dismissal, stated today that such support would be "no more than routine." Jordan is entitled to that "routine" help, said Sir Ronald, "like any other member is entitled to the services of the union's legal officers and other union officials."

BONN SUSPENDS ATTORNEY GENERAL FROM POST; CHARGED WITH SERVING HITLER

BONN, July 9. (JTA) -- While an investigation by a special committee of prominent jurists is still under way into charges that Attorney General Wolfgang Fraenkel had served in Hitler's Peoples Court --and had altered court rules so as to result in death sentences for minor crimes --the Federal Ministry of Justice here was determined today to push the Fraenkel probe to a quick conclusion. Fraenkel has been suspended, and there were rumors that he may resign.

Some of the charges are that Fraenkel had been a member of the Nazi Party from 1933 on. He was an assistant to the prosecutor of the Hitlerian Peoples Court at Leipzig. Dr. Wolfgang Stammberger, Minister of Justice, appointed him only recently to the post of Attorney General. In that position, he served as West Germany's Chief Federal Prosecutor until his suspension.

The charges against Fraenkel had first been made by East German Communist sources and were, therefore, suspect. However, over the weekend, original documentation from the old Leipzig Peoples Court, which is in East Germany, were supplied to the Justice Ministry here, strengthening the accusations against Fraenkel despite the Communist sources. It was expected today that the three-man committee of jurists probing the Fraenkel case would report before the week is over.

WEST GERMANY SCHEDULES LARGEST MASS TRIAL OF NAZI CRIMINALS SINCE 1946

BONN, July 9. (JTA) -- The largest war crimes trial since the Nuremberg proceedings of 1946 will open early next year in Bonn, when nearly 30 of Adolf Eichmann's principal assistants will be tried, the Government prosecutor announced here today. Hundreds of witnesses, most of them survivors from Auschwitz have been called from all parts of the world where they now live, to give evidence at the trial.

#### PLEA TO EASE DUTIES OF RABBIS VOICED AT RABBINICAL CONVENTION

MIAMI BEACH, July 9. (JTA) -- An appeal to synagogue leaders, to relieve the rabbi from various business administration, fund-raising and public relations duties, so that he might devote more of his time and energy to spiritual matters, was made here today before the 26th annual convention of the Rabbinical Council of America.

The appeal to the convention of the Orthodox rabbis was made by the organization's past president, Rabbi Theodore L. Adams, of New York. "Lay synagogue and community leaders," he asserted, "are reducing the power of the rabbi in the purely religious areas of Jewish life. The control of religious policies is constantly being transferred from the rabbis to the lay leaders.

"Synagogue leaders should relieve the rabbi of such functions as business administration, fund-raising and glorified public relations operations, so that he can be restored to a position of deep spiritual distinction, authority and persuasiveness. The hope for a truly creative resurgence cannot rest with narrow 'organization men.' It must be based on the consecrated commitment of individuals of high ethical and religious eminence, such as the rabbi."

At a session last night, Rabbi Harold H. Smith, of Chicago, sharply criticized the recent "dialogue" held in Jerusalem between American Jewish and Israeli leaders, who had discussed the relationships between Israeli and American Jewries. He challenged one conclusion resulting from that "dialogue," which, he said, held that "Israeli-American Jewish ties could be re-emphasized through the simple process of learning the Hebrew language."

"For more than 3,000 years," Rabbi Smith maintained, "the Jewish people the world over had retained its identity and heritage, not because of language but because of the close spiritual ties of the Torah, which has guided the Jewish people in their day-to-day living. Religion, and its common ideals, have always been the unbreakable chain of Jewish unity and continuity. Unless the young Jews of Israel and America are imbued with the realization that our bond of unity rests in the spiritual obligations which we share, that bond will be jeopardized."

#### SUNDAY LAW BECOMES EFFECTIVE IN MASSACHUSETTS; JEWS SCORE GOVERNOR

BOSTON, July 9. (JTA) -- Gov. John A. Volpe and Lt. Gov. Edward F. McLaughlin, Jr., were accused by a Jewish leader here today of "conspiring to smuggle" into State law an amended Sunday Blue Law measure which has been passed by the Legislature with "religious prejudice" against Sabbath-observing minorities, including Jews. Mr. McLaughlin signed the measure last week, making it effective.

The accusation was voiced by Rabbi Samuel J. Fox, vice-president of the Massachusetts Council of Rabbis, who is chairman of the Council's social actions committee. According to Rabbi Fox, Gov. Volpe, who was out of the state, had the new bill "rushed" by the State Police, so that the measure could become law after Lt. Gov. McLaughlin signed it.

Calling for a state-wide referendum on a proposed amendment permitting Sabbath-observers to keep their businesses open Sunday if they close Saturdays, Rabbi Fox said efforts should be made first to get the Legislature to reverse itself. The Legislature killed an amendment favored by observant Jews and other Sabbatharians, thus discriminating against 250,000 Jews and other Sabbatharians, Rabbi Fox declared.

Under the new law, which had been amended through 43 changes, various businesses like taverns are now allowed to open Sundays. However, "due to religious prejudice," said Rabbi Fox, "Sabbatarians who close Saturdays because of religious belief" are "restricted to a four-and-a-half day livelihood."

#### DOROTHY B. MOYER, NATIONAL VICE-PRESIDENT OF C. J. F. W. F., DIES IN DAYTON

DAYTON, Ohio, July 9, (JTA) -- Mrs. Dorothy B. Moyer, national vice-president of the Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds, died here yesterday, aged 58. She was the wife of Elmer L. Moyer, president of the Jewish Community Council of Dayton.

Mrs. Moyer, one of the outstanding Jewish communal leaders here, has served as vice-president and secretary of the Jewish Community Council, secretary of the Community Welfare Council, chairman of the Jewish Community Center, and campaign chairman of the women's division of the United Jewish Campaign. She was also treasurer of the National Federation of Temple Sisterhoods, president of the Ohio Federation of Sisterhoods, and national treasurer of the Alpha Epsilon Phi Sorority Foundation.

Mrs. Moyer was also active in all major civic and community endeavors in the Greater Dayton area. Funeral services will be held here tomorrow, at Temple Israel.
