TRIAL OF EICHMANN'S AIDE COMPLETED IN GERMANY; CHARGED WITH KILLING JEWS

FRANKFURT, July 10. (JTA) -- The prosecution and defense completed their presentations today in the trial of Otto Hunsche, 50, a former wartime aide to Adolf Eichmann charged with complicity in the murder of 1,200 Hungarian Jews in 1944. The prosecutor demanded a term of life imprisonment at hard labor for Hunsche, the stiffest penalty for maximum crimes under West German law. The verdict is expected before the end of the week.

The prosecution had contended that Hunsche, as an attorney, had been closely connected with Eichmann's office, the Gestapo's Bureau for Jewish Affairs, and had knowledge of the Nazi plan for the "final solution" of the Jewish situation. It stressed that in 1941 he had taken part in the Wansee conference at which mass murder of Jews was decided on as "the final solution" of the Jewish question.

Dr. A. Laternser, Hunsche's defense counsel, asked for acquittal, contending that there was "default of proof" of the charges. He added that Hunsche had already served two years when he was convicted by a Recklinghausen court in 1947 for his activities as a member of the Gestapo. He has been practicing law in Westphalia since he was released from prison in 1949.

A former Hungarian legislator, Dr. Brody, who now lives in Brazil, testified today that Hunsche was also responsible for the murder of an additional 300 Jews who were deported from Sarva to Auschwitz. Dr. Brody's testimony was supported by that of another prosecution witness, Philip von Freudiger, formerly president of Budapest's Jewish community and a member of the Jewish Council there. Mr. von Freudiger, who succeeded in fleeing to Rumania, also charged that Hunsche blocked any action to rescue the Jews marked for deportation.

Among those present in the courtroom during the trial were Anne Kethly, president of the Social Democratic party of Hungary and Yoel Brand of Israel, a major witness in the Eichmann trial.

A sidelight of the final day of the trial was an interruption from a man in the audience, who yelled "I represent the nationalist press. Not murder but revenge is at stake in this trial." The prosecutor demanded immediate arrest of the man and the court agreed and imposed a three-day sentence on him, effective immediately. When the man was removed by court attendants, he raised his arm in a Nazi salute.

ISRAEL PARLIAMENT HEARS MINISTER OF INTERIOR ON SOBLEN'S DEPORTATION

JERUSALEM, July 10. (JTA) -- Dr. Robert A. Soblen, who fled to Israel to avoid serving a life sentence in the U.S. for espionage, did not ask permission to remain in Israel under the Law of the Return but even if he had, it would have been refused him, Interior Minister Moshe Shapiro declared today in the Knesset, Israel's Parliament. A full debate in Knesset on the Soblen case is expected tomorrow. (See page 2)

In a reply to questions by Communist deputies, the Interior Minister said deportation of Dr. Soblen was in line with the Government's policy against giving a haven to criminals from other countries. He added that Dr. Soblen was not expelled under the Law of the Return but under the law dealing with illegal entry. He also stated that the expulsion was not an act of extradition to the United States as one of the deputies had implied.

In reference to criticism that the expulsion action was for a seriously sick person, the Minister disclosed that Dr. Soblen was subjected to a physical examination, before he was expelled, which found him fit to travel. The Minister also told the Knesset that Dr. Soblen's attorney had three full days in which to seek a Supreme Court stay and that it was not the function of his Ministry to advise attorneys on procedures for their clients. To critics who said that Dr. Soblen had been expelled during a ten-day detention order issued by an Israeli magistrate, Mr. Shapiro replied that the police were empowered to hold a man to the prescribed detention period but that they were not obligated to do so.

KNESSET TO DEBATE TODAY SOBLEN EXPULSION; NON-CONFIDENCE VOTE SOUGHT

JERUSALEM, July 10. (JTA) -- Israel's Parliament was scheduled to hear tomorrow a motion of non-confidence in the Government which the Liberal Party has submitted on the handling of the case of Robert A. Soblen, the convicted spy who fled to Israel from the United States to avoid serving a life sentence. Soblen is now in Britain recovering from a suicide attempt and awaiting action on a writ for habeas corpus in his fight to avoid being returned to the United States.

In submitting the motion, Ishar Harari of the Liberal party said the non-confidence motion was based on the Government's "ignoring the rule of law" in its speedy expulsion of Soblen and also to protest the Government "attempt to deprive the opposition of an opportunity to express itself on such urgent important matters." The latter comment referred to the refusal by the Knesset presidium to recognize last week the urgency of the demand for debate on the issue.

The Knesset Finance Committee, during a discussion of the budget of Interior Minister Moshe Shapiro's ministry budget, asked him to appear to explain Soblen's expulsion. The principal opposition criticism was to the speed with which the expulsion was effected. The Ministry has contended that it was the duty of Soblen's lawyer to ask the Israel Supreme Court to intervene, which he did not.

ISRAEL MINISTER APPEALS TO GOVERNMENT TO CONSIDER 'YOSSELE' CASE CLOSE

JERUSALEM, July 10, (JTA) -- An appeal to the Government to halt any further prosecution in the Yoselle Schumacher case was made today in Israel's Parliament by Dr. Zorach Warhaftig, Minister for Religious Affairs.

He argued that the affair should be considered closed with the finding of the long-missing boy in New York and his re-union with his parents in Israel last week. He made his statement in the course of debate on his Ministry's budget in which the abduction and hiding of the boy for more than two years and the status of Bene Israel Jews in Israel were raised.

He said it was to Israel's credit that it had taken a "tolerant attitude" toward extremist religious groups and that once such a group acted against the state, it was time for the police to step in. He added that now that the boy was back with his parents it would be "a great act" if the case were closed.

Police meanwhile began questioning Rabbi Aaron Katzenellenbogen, head of the Torah Veyirah Yeshiva, in connection with various aspects of the Yoselle case.

ISRAELI SCIENTISTS DEVELOP CRYSTALS TO TRANSMIT SIGNALS TO VENUS

JERUSALEM, July 10, (JTA) -- An Israeli scientist disclosed today that Hebrew University laboratories have developed special crystals of a type which have been used to transmit and receive radar signals to and from the planet Venus.

The disclosure was made by Dr. Zeev Levy in connection with an announcement that the first world conference on paramagnetic resonance will open at the Hebrew University next Monday with the participation of 150 scientists from 17 countries, including the United States and Soviet Russia. Other countries sending delegates are Italy, Japan, Britain and France.

Paramagnetic resonance makes possible transmission and reception of high power radar signals and very low power electromagnetic waves. The field is of interest to civilian and military industry and to the medical profession.

Prof. Levy noted that the special crystals can be used to transmit sharply focussed light rays which theoretically could be used to supply energy to space-ships. Experiments have indicated that these rays can melt steel at distances of 700 feet.

Participants in the conference will include Prof. M. Mankov of the USSR, scientific advisers to NATO and the United States Navy and Air Force, representatives of such firms as International Business Machines, Lockheed Aircraft Co., Radio Corporation of America and General Electric Corp.

ISRAELI MANUFACTURERS ASSOCIATION ASKS MEMBERS TO KEEP PRICES STABLE

JERUSALEM, July 10, (JTA) -- The Israel Manufacturers Association called today on its members to keep their prices stable when the cost of living allowance for workers is raised this month.

Representatives of the Association told Finance Minister Levi Eshkol and Trade Minister Pinhas Sapir that the manufacturers were willing to work with other groups in the task of preserving price stability and that they would support the Government's new economic policy which is aimed at greater productivity as a means of keeping prices steady and for greater export sales.

ARGENTINE JEWS PRAISED FOR ACTING WITH DIGNITY DURING OUTBREAKS

BUENOS AIRES, July 10. (JTA) -- Dr. Israel Goldstein, world president of Keren Hayesod, the fund-raising arm of the World Zionist Organization, voiced high praise here today for the "great dignity and discipline" with which the Argentine Jewish community has faced the recent outbreaks of anti-semitism in this country. Dr. Goldstein, who came here two weeks ago to aid the annual United Jewish Campaign, made his statement before leaving for Montevideo to participate in a similar campaign in Uruguay.

Dr. Goldstein lauded particularly the DAIA, the central organization of Argentine Jewry, and the organization's leadership, for the manner in which it has met the anti-Semitic attacks by Nazi and other right-wing elements. He warned that, though calm prevails here now in regard to racist activities, a critical situation may recur since the economic situation here continues unstable."

The shocks felt by Argentine Jewish youth, as a result of the recent events, said Dr. Goldstein, "have led many of them to think seriously of emigrating to Israel." The Jewish college youth here, he said, "has been alienated from Jewish life and, unfortunately, very little is being done about that situation."

Meanwhile, today, Federal police continued probing the origin of the anti-semitic disturbances. Police raided and searched the headquarters of six organizations, three of which are aligned with the extreme right wing, and three lined up with the Communists. Several persons were apprehended and released after several hours of questioning.

(The Indian Express, large-circulation, influential daily newspaper in New Delhi, today blamed Argentina's "tradition of giving asylum" to Nazis and fascists for the recent anti-Semitic manifestations in that country. "Argentine," said the newspaper, "has extended asylum to men whose crimes against humanity make them unwelcome in any other civilized country.")

GERMAN SCHOOL INSPECTOR DISCOVERED AS AUTHOR OF ANTI-SEMITIC BOOK

WIESBADEN, July 10. (JTA) -- A school inspector named Hertrich, who has conducted a number of tours to Israel for German school teachers, had been the author of an anti-Semitic book during the Hitler period, according to charges made yesterday in the Hesse Parliament, here, by representatives of the Free Democratic Party.

According to the charges, the man's anti-Semitic book had quoted from "Der tuermer," the notoriously rabid anti-Semitic journal published during the Nazi years by Julius Streicher, and carried a preface written by Streicher. The Hesse Minister of Education was requested to tell Parliament whether his Ministry knew of Hertrich's alleged Nazi background. The F.D.P. representatives said that Israel authorities recently obtained a copy of Hertrich's book.

RELIGIOUS REVIVAL IN U.S. ATTRIBUTED TO ACTIVITIES OF MILITARY CHAPLAINS

MIAMI BEACH, July 10. (JTA) -- Religious revival in the United States since World War II, by and large "may be attributed to the spark and nurture of chaplains of all religious faiths during military service," Rabbi Israel Miller, chairman of the executive committee of the Commission on Jewish Chaplaincy of the National Jewish Welfare Board, told the 26th annual convention of the Rabbinical Council of America here today.

Rabbi Miller, who is also vice-president of the Rabbinical Council of America, asserted that "military chaplains are far more effective in the administration of their theological duties than their civilian counterparts in the clergy. On the personal level, the chaplain in the armed forces has developed a greater affinity for his congregants by making himself more accessible and available whenever the need for guidance and assistance arises."

He said that more than 200 Orthodox rabbis have served as full-time chaplains in the armed forces of the United States during the past 25 years. "The Orthodox chaplains in the armed forces have greatly altered the image of Orthodox Judaism in the general and Jewish communities," he stated. "Orthodox Judaism is no longer considered an anachronism in the Twentieth Century which can only survive or live in a ghetto surroundings."

Rabbi Emanuel Rackman, honorary president of the Council, asserted that Orthodox Judaism is enriching the American heritage. He stated that America needed Orthodox Judaism's emphasis on a duty-oriented law, rather than a right-centered law.

UNITED APPEAL IN CINCINNATI SETS \$7,005,437 GOAL FOR 1962-63 DRIVE

CINCINNATI, July 10. (JTA) -- The 1962-63 United Appeal here, to be launched in September, has set a goal totaling \$7,005,437, it was announced today by Mark Upson, general chairman of the drive. The campaign will be carried on intensively for eight weeks, he said.

The new goal is \$261,212 higher than the \$6,744,225 raised last year, Mr. Upson said. The 1961 goal was \$6,665,600. Of the increase, he explained, \$61,000 is due to the inclusion of six agencies in the campaign for the first time.

NEW YORK POLICE RENEWS DRIVE TO ENFORCE SUNDAY LAW ON JEWISH STORES

NEW YORK, July 10. (JTA) -- A renewal of the New York city police effort to enforce the city's Sunday law, which hit hardest at such Jewish enterprises as delicatessen stores and bakeries, evoked sharp criticism today from leaders of Jewish organizations.

The new crackdown began Sunday. Police canvassed residential areas and gave summonses to merchants selling some foods which cannot be sold at all or only during certain hours under the law. Butchers, who were supposed to be closed, and delicatessen stores and bakeries, which can sell cooked or prepared foods only between 4 p.m. and 7:30 p.m., were hardest hit.

Saul Bernstein, administrator of the Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregations, said the law was "so full of inconsistencies and exceptions that any kind of enforcement is impossible and absurd." Noting that drug stores "sell every conceivable thing without harassment" on Sundays, he asked why the police "pick on food stores."

He added New York State should follow the example of 12 states which have amended Sunday laws to end discrimination against merchants who observe the Sabbath on a day other than Sunday. Efforts to obtain such a law in the last New York State legislative session earlier this year were unsuccessful.

Will Maslow, executive director of the American Jewish Congress, said that the renewal of enforcement of the city's "archaic" Sunday law apparently discriminated against one type of person, operators of food stores.

Rabbi Israel Mowshowitz, president of the New York Board of Rabbis, said he was "very surprised by the renewed drive." Dr. Dan M. Potter, executive director of the Protestant Council of New York, said his organization favored a Sunday law which would provide "equal competitive ability" on the market for persons whose Sabbath is a day other than Sunday. Fines for violations are \$5 for the first offense, \$10 for the second and \$25 for each subsequent offense.

U.S. CHRISTIAN BIBLE SCHOLARS PARTICIPATE IN STUDY COURSE IN ISRAEL

JERUSALEM, July 10. (JTA) -- Sixteen Christian Bible scholars of 15 religious denominations, from all parts of the United States met here today with leading members of the Israel Bible Society for a six-week study course. The Israelis included Prime Minister David Ben-Gurion.

GROUP OF JEWISH TEENAGERS GOES TO ISRAEL FOR SIX WEEK STUDY-TOUR

NEW YORK, July 10. (JTA) -- A group of 36 teenagers left today via El Al Airlines, on a six week visit and study tour of Israel under the sponsorship of the Young Zionists of the Zionist Organization of America. The group, comprised of Jewish high school students ranging in ages from 13 to 16, were accompanied by counsellors. Their stay in Israel will include 6 days in the teenage summer camp in Kfar Silver, ZOA agricultural high school.

DR. CHAIN, JEWISH NOBEL PRIZE WINNER, HONORED BY BUENOS AIRES U.

BUENOS AIRES, July 10. (JTA) -- Dr. Ernest Boris Chain, Jewish biochemist who was awarded a Nobel Prize in 1945 for discovering penicillin, was given high honors today by the Buenos Aires University. He came here to conduct a series of lectures under the joint auspices of the World Jewish Congress and the Weizmann Institute of Science at Rehovoth, Israel. Dr. Chain is an honorary fellow of the Weizmann Institute.

GOVERNMENT OF PERU TO ELEVATE ITS LEGATION IN ISRAEL TO EMBASSY

LIMA, July 10. (JTA) -- The Peruvian Government indicated today it has decided to elevate its Legation in Israel to an Embassy. Mario Sosa Parde de Zela, who represented Peru in Vienna, handling relations with Israel from that city, will establish his ambassadorial residence in Israel.

JEWISH CEMETERY IN AUSTRIAN TOWN DESECRATED FOR SECOND TIME

VIENNA, July 10. (JTA) -- A Jewish cemetery in the Austrian town of Horn was desecrated for the second time in two months last night when 27 tombstones were overturned.
