NASSER SAYS HE IS PREPARING FOR WAR ON ISRAEL; WILL USE ROCKETS

LONDON, July 23. (JTA) -- Egypt's two topmost leaders, President Gamal Abdel Nasser and War Minister-Field Marshal Abdel Hakim Amer, announced boldly in Cairo today that the rockets fired by the Egyptians Saturday, and other armaments exhibited in a "Revolution Day" parade today, are being amassed for a war against Israel, according to Cairo dispatches received here today.

"I want the world to know," said President Nasser, "that we will not allow Palestine to remain in the hands of Israel. As the world has seen, we are getting ready."

Marshal Amer took the salute of Egypt's armed forces, alongside President Nasser, as Cairo watched the military parade celebrating the tenth anniversary of the Nasser coup which overthrew King Farouk, and declared:

"The United Arab Republic air force has full command of the skies in our area. Its armed forces are the strongest in Africa and the Middle East. The enemy facing the Arab world is Israel, an imperialist base. The fact that Israel has an atomic reactor, functioning in secret, leads us to believe that she will use it for aggressive purposes."

The reports from Cairo indicated that, in addition to the rockets fired Saturday, Egypt also possesses now MIG-21 jet fighters recently acquired from the Soviet Union, as well as the new, Soviet TU-16 bombers, plus Russian tanks and new Soviet types of artillery.

Nasser boasted in his speech opening the "Revolution Day" celebration that he has still other, secret armaments. He told his crowds: "You will not see all of my new weapons. Some will remain secret." He said also that, soon, he will open a factory for the production of "Egypt's own jet planes." Thus far, all of Egypt's tanks have been acquired from the Soviet Union.

Press commentators here pointed out that the rockets fired by Egypt Saturday, launching pads 50 miles west of Cairo, put Israel within range of Nasser's rockets.

Israelis Told They Must Take Their Security Problems Seriously

JERUSALEM, July 23. (JTA) -- Egypt's firing of rockets must remind Israel that "we must take our security problems seriously," Maj. Gen. Zvi Tsur, chief of staff of Israel's defense forces, declared last night. At the same time, both Gen. Tsur, and Shimon Peres, Deputy Minister of Defense, stated that, thus far, Egypt's rocketry program has greater importance as propaganda than as an immediate military threat. Both spoke as Israel artillery started a series of exercises that will last four days.

Gen. Tsur warned that President Nasser, of Egypt, "must be judged by his actions, and not by his words." He pointed out that Nasser's recent speeches, termed "moderate" in some quarters, were delivered while Egypt was developing rockets with the help of West German, Swiss and Italian experts. He warned that, with the help of the foreign experts, Egypt could make its rockets operational in a few years.

The Israeli press today requested that the Israel Government approach the Western powers again for defensive weapons made more necessary than ever in the light of Egypt's heavy armament. Israel applied to the United States a number of years ago for permission to buy defensive arms in the U.S., but no action on its application has as yet been taken by the State Department in Washington.

JEWISH REFUGEES FROM ALGERIA ORGANIZE IN PARIS; 600 HOLD MEETING

PARIS, July 23. (JTA) -- Algerian Jewish refugees held their first organizational meeting here today, planning a permanent group to protect the interests of the many thousands of Algerian Jews who have fled to France.

The move was launched by refugees from Oran, whence all but about 100 of the 30,000 Oranian Jews have fled to this country. About 600 Oranian Jews crowded an old Orthodox Ashkenazic synagogue, on Rue de Tournelles. The house of worship has been turned over to the former Oranians for use as a Sephardic synagogue.

The meeting opened with the chanting of the El Moleh Rachmin and recitation of the Kaddish in memory of the Jews who died during the Algerian revolution. Holy Scrolls brought to France by the Oranian refugees were held up by the participants in the meeting. It was revealed by a spokesman for the Oranian refugees that 90 Holy Scrolls had been brought out of Oran, 40 of the Torahs being kept here, while 50 others have been sent to Israel.

The meeting demanded that the Central Jewish Consistory furnish religious facilities for the Algerian refugees, particularly for those former Algerian Jews now living in small communities in the provinces, who lack all religious facilities. M. Jais, chief rabbi of Paris, addressed the refugees and promised, both on behalf of the Consistory and for the Grand Rabbinate here, that all religious needs for the refugees would be met.

The French Chief Rabbinate yesterday sent a number of rabbis to various areas to help organize deliveries of kosher food and establishment of other religious facilities which the Rabbinate hopes to have in operation before the end of July.

GERMAN MINISTER ADMITS GUILT OF APPOINTING NAZI AS CHIEF PROSECUTOR

BONN, July 23. (JTA) -- The West German Minister of Justice, Dr. Wolfgang Stammberger, has submitted his resignation to Chancellor Konrad Adenauer because of the former's responsibility in the appointment of Wolfgang Fraenkel, who was dismissed earlier this month from his post as Federal Chief Prosecutor after disclosure of Fraenkel's participation in Nazi court judgments, it was reported here today. Dr. Stammberger's resignation, however, was not accepted by the Cabinet.

A special Cabinet committee, meanwhile, has been established by the West German Government to investigate East German charges about the alleged past of judges, prosecutors and police officials now serving in the Federal Republic. The formation of the committee was the result of repercussions following the "compulsory retirement" of Fraenkel, whose participation in Nazi legal proceedings was originally disclosed by the East German Government.

Fraenkel was forced to retire after investigators confirmed East German charges that he once held a position in the Nazi prosecutor's office in Leipzig in which he was involved in cases that resulted in the imposition of death sentences for relatively minor offenses. The Justice Ministry started disciplinary proceedings against Fraenkel on the insistence of Federal President Heinrich Lübke.

The Cabinet committee, which consists of the state secretaries of the ministries of Foreign Affairs, Justice and All-German affairs, is expected to consider whether to accept an invitation by the East German authorities to send officials to East Berlin to check on documents that the Communists said prove the Nazi past of West German officials. The committee is expected to submit its first report in the near future.

ANOTHER SOVIET JEW SENTENCED IN RUSSIA FOR 'ECONOMIC CRIMES'

LONDON, July 23. (JTA) -- Another Soviet Jew has been singled out by the Soviet Union for a long prison term on charges of having "speculated in gold coins," according to a Moscow dispatch received here today.

The Jew is Usher I. Reznik, of Moldavia, near the Rumanian border. His trial, conviction and sentencing to eight years' imprisonment were reported in the newspaper Sovetskaya Moldavia. The Soviet court claimed Reznik had been a member of a "big merchant family" in Bessarabia.

FRENCH NEWSPAPER REPORTS PRODUCTION OF TALEISIM IN SOVIET RUSSIA

PARIS, July 23. (JTA) -- A factory to produce taleisim (prayer shawls) has been established in the Soviet Union, it was reported here today in an article in the mass-circulation newspaper L'Aurore by M. Zitron, French-Jewish journalist who returned from a three-week visit to the Soviet Union. The writer said that the talis factory was located on the outskirts of Moscow.

J. T. A. STARTS NEW RADIOPRINTER CIRCUITS FOR NEWS TRANSMISSIONS

NEW YORK, July 23. (JTA) -- The Jewish Telegraphic Agency opened today its first directly operated radioprinter circuits from London to its headquarters in New York and to its affiliated Israeli News Agency in Tel Aviv.

The new system permits instantaneous office-to-office communication at the rate of 66 words per minute. It parallels the communications system established by JTA in New York for delivery of the JTA news service to distribution centers in London, Tel Aviv, Johannesburg, Buenos Aires, Sao Paulo and Lima, Peru. Operators based in the JTA headquarters in New York directly key the signal over landlines to powerful transmitters at Centreach, Long Island, leased from Press Wireless, Inc.

In London, operators working in the JTA's Fleet Street office, similarly feed the signal over landlines to the transmitters some 50 miles from London, which JTA has leased from the British Post Office. The London signal to New York is intercepted by automated, pre-tuned Press Wireless receivers at Northville, Long Island, and automatically relayed over leased landlines to the JTA office. The London signal to Tel Aviv is received by an automated, pre-tuned receiving station maintained in Tel Aviv by JTA and INA.

The new transmission system in London replaces one employed for several years in which the British Post Office performed the actual operation for JTA. The new system will speed the delivery of news copy and will effect substantial savings in costs.

AMERICAN ANTI-SEMITE SENDS INCITING ANTI-JEWISH MAIL TO ARGENTINA

BUENOS AIRES, July 23. (JTA) -- An American anti-Semite took a hand today in helping stir anti-Jewish propaganda in Argentina, by sending threatening letters against Jews to Argentine newspapers. The letters are signed: Ku-Klux-Klan Dragon Horace Sherman Miller, and the address given is Post Office Box 5062, Waco, Texas.

Correo de la Tarde, an important afternoon paper here today published a photostat of the letter which reads: "Very soon, the Argentine Jews will have to declare a strike for 1,000 hours, when we shall start working." The letter was obviously referring to the fact that, last month Jewish businessmen here, joined by many non-Jews, conducted a half-day business stoppage in protest against renewed, intensified anti-Semitism in Argentina.

(According to the national offices of the B'nai B'rith Anti-Defamation League, in New York, a man named Horace Sherman Miller, at the given address in Waco, Texas, has been operating a hatemongering apparatus, almost entirely personal, with no significant following, for many years. His literature, sent often to Latin American countries, is anti-Jewish and anti-Catholic. Miller usually calls himself the Grand Dragon of the Aryan Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, but has no affiliation with the KKK organizations operating in the South, the ADL records show.)

Canadian Jews Ask Argentine Government to Check Anti-Semites

MONTREAL, July 23, (JTA)-- Assurances that the Argentine people condemn racial and religious prejudice, and that the Government at Buenos Aires has taken all steps to suppress anti-Semitism in that country, were given to the Canadian Jewish Congress today by the Argentine Ambassador to Canada, Gen. Angel E. Petuffo.

Gen. Petuffo voiced his assurances to Michael Garber, president of the Canadian Jewish Congress, who presented to the envoy a protest from the Canadian Jewish Congress against "the recent anti-Jewish acts of violence in the Argentine Republic." Expressing "shock" over the manifestations of "hatred and animosity" against Argentine Jews, the Congress called on the Argentine Government "for immediate police action and protection" against anti-Semitism.

(A resolution protesting vigorously against the recent anti-Semitic manifestations in Argentina was adopted and made public in Holland today by the Dutch Labor Party. Representatives of the party filed their protest, denouncing "anti-Semitic excesses," with the Argentine Ambassador at The Hague, requesting that he send the protest on to his Government in Buenos Aires.)

KENNEDY NAMES JUDGE MITCHELL H. COHEN AS MEMBER OF FEDERAL COURT

WASHINGTON, July 23, (JTA) -- President Kennedy has nominated Judge Mitchell H. Cohen, of the New Jersey Superior Court, to be a member of the United States District Court of New Jersey.

ANTI-SEMITIC STUDENT GROUP FORMED AT SOUTH AFRICAN UNIVERSITY

JOHANNESBURG, July 23. (JTA) -- The formation of an anti-Semitic student organization, calling itself The Fascist Society, was announced on posters put up at the University of Natal. The group is reported to be recruiting members at Capetown University.

A day after the announcements had been posted, an anti-Semitic letter was received by D. Levy, chairman of the local Jewish student chapter at the University of Natal, stating: "Jews, get out, go back to Palestine, or you will be wearing the yellow arm-bands in a Kaffir Ghetto."

GROUP OF 48 U.S. COLLEGE EDUCATORS AND CLERGYMEN LEAVE FOR ISRAEL

NEW YORK, July 23. (JTA) -- A group of 48 college educators and Christian clergymen, representing 11 denominations from 18 states and the District of Columbia, left today for a 30-day tour of Israel sponsored by the Inter-University Committee on Israel in cooperation with the Hebrew University in Jerusalem.

The group, which includes two university presidents, college deans and department chairmen as well as outstanding churchmen and scholars, will meet with Prime Minister David Ben-Gurion and other Government leaders as well as Israeli religious leaders and scholars.

They will tour all of Israel, devoting special attention to the holy places, recent archaeological excavations, the work of the Afro-Asian Institute, and various academic institutions. They will also conduct a study of the acculturation and integration of diverse ethnic and religious groups in the country.

PIONEER WOMEN ANNOUNCES SUMMER CAMP PROGRAM FOR ISRAELI CHILDREN

NEW YORK, July 23. (JTA) -- One hundred and forty summer day camps for 7,000 school-age children, half of whom are newcomers in Israel, have been opened in Israel under a Pioneer Women-Moetzet Hapoalot program, it was announced today by Mrs. Sidney Leff, president of the Pioneer Women, an American labor Zionist group.

The camps provide hot meals, organized recreational activity, and special arts and crafts instruction for the youngsters, who range in age from 5 to 14. They also serve as a vital "training ground" for the future integration of the 3,500 immigrant children among the school children of Israel.

Mrs. Leff, who returned from a six-week stay in Israel, also announced the dedication of three new Pioneer Women-Moetzet Hapoalot day nurseries in Ramle, Pardess Katz, and Kfar Saba, and the dedication of a new wing of the Beersheba Vocational High School for Girls. The school, attended by 250 students, is administered by the Beersheba municipality and Pioneer Women-Moetzet Hapoalot.

CARDINAL CUSHING CONTRIBUTES \$500 FOR JEWISH EDUCATION IN ISRAEL

NEW YORK, July 23. (JTA) -- Richard Cardinal Cushing, Roman Catholic Archbishop of Boston, has contributed a personal gift to a women's religious-Zionist organization in the U.S. to further education of Jewish children in Israel.

In a note accompanying a contribution of \$500 to the Mizrahi Women's Organization of America, Cardinal Cushing wrote that "no education is complete without a knowledge of God that prompts us to love Him and one another." The gift, presented by the Cardinal to Mrs. Samuel Rubin, president of the Greater Boston Council of Mizrahi Women, will help to provide tuition scholarships for recently arrived children.

58TH ANNIVERSARY OF DEATH OF DR. THEODOR HERZL OBSERVED IN ISRAEL

JERUSALEM, July 23. (JTA) -- More than 1,000 persons participated here yesterday in ceremonies marking the 58th anniversary of the death of Dr. Theodor Herzl, founder of political Zionism. The observances opened at sundown at Mount Herzl, where a children's choir chanted melodies, laid bunches of crimson flowers on Herzl's grave, and presented readings of Herzl's writings.

Included among the guard of honor were Israel Bar-Yehuda, Minister of Transport; Yosef Burg, Minister of Social Welfare; Zorach Warhaftig, Minister for Religious Affairs; Knesset Speaker Kaddish Luz; Chief Rabbi Yitzhak Nissim; Supreme Court Justices, members of the Jewish Agency executive, and Jerusalem Mayor Mordechai Ish-Shalom.
