## TWO YOUNG JEWISH GIRLS WOUNDED IN ATTACK ON ARGENTINE SYNAGOGUE

BUENOS AIRES, Oct. 29. (JTA) -- Two young Jewish girls were wounded by gunfire, and a Molotov cocktail was thrown into a synagogue at Florida, a suburb of Buenos Aires, when an anti-Semitic gang carried out another attack while religious services were being conducted in the house of worship Saturday evening.

According to eyewitnesses, three young men were in an automobile from which the incendiary "cocktail" was tossed into the synagogue which, however, was undamaged. Then the anti-Semites opened fire at a group of Jewish youngsters playing in front of the synagogue while their parents were at worship. Alicia Albert, 11, and Lucia Levy, 13, were wounded. The attackers sped away in their car.

## ISRAEL CONDEMNS WORLD ANTI-SEMITISM AT U.N., HITS RUSSIAN DISCRIMINATIONS

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y., Oct. 29. (JTA) -- Israel today spoke up sharply at the United Nations against anti-Semitism and racism throughout the world, pinpointing the recent outbreaks of anti-Jewish activities of neo-Nazis and neo-Fascists in Britain and the United States, and sharply condemning anti-Jewish religious and cultural discriminations in the Soviet Union.

The Israel statement, dealing with the entire gamut of "manifestations of racial prejudice and national and religious intolerance," was made before the General Assembly's 110-member Social, Humanitarian and Cultural Committee by Michael S. Comay, permanent chairman of Israel's delegation here. He did not cite any country by name, but his references to the lands involved in one form of anti-Semitism or another were unmistakable.

The Social, Humanitarian and Cultural Committee began this morning to debate a resolution, pending in various forms since January 1960, originally adopted by the Human Rights Commission's Subcommittee on Prevention of Discrimination and Protection of Minorities. Since 1960, that draft has gone through various stages, being watered down to the draft on the agenda today, so that the term "anti-Semitism" does not appear. Arab representatives, backed by the Soviet bloc, were chiefly responsible for deletion of specific mention of anti-Semitism. However, the draft is still considered a strong condemnation of all forms of racism.

Mr. Comay was the opening speaker in the committee debate on this issue. He expressed Israel's feeling that the text should "express reference to anti-Semitism" and requested not only that the resolution be adopted but also that the Assembly instruct the United Nations Secretary-General to report to the Assembly in 1963 on what steps, if any, member states had taken to wipe out anti-Semitism.

### Sees Soviet Jews Singled Out, Made Scapegoats for Economic Difficulties

Without naming the USSR, but aiming directly at the Kremlin regime, Mr. Comay told the committee: "I refer to what may broadly be termed cultural discrimination: cases where minority groups are denied the freedom and facilities to maintain their distinctive language, literature and traditions. It is painful for us to state that a large section of the Jewish people has been singled out for such discrimination, in a land which officially recognizes the identity of each ethnic, national and religious group within its borders--including the Jewish group, the members of which are formally described in their documents of identity as being Jewish in nationality.

"As a religious group, too, this community is deprived of the prerogatives which are still extended to other faiths, such as the production of sacred books and articles, the training of clerics, and contact between the different local communities within the country, or between them and Jewish communities elsewhere.

"In brief, the Jewish community of that country has been tragically cut off from its own rich religious and cultural heritage, as well as from its Jewish brethren in the rest of the world. Their helplessness is aggravated by the growing (though by no means original) trend to find Jewish scapegoats for economic difficulties."

### Denounces Smashing of Synagogue Windows, Branding Youths with Swastikas

Bracketing the situation of Jews in the Soviet Union and the anti-Semitic outbreaks in Latin America, Mr. Comay told the committee that "hardly a week has gone by during the current year without a report of some act of anti-Semitic violence in some country. Bombs

have been thrown at Jewish schools. Jewish business premises have been machinegunned. Synagogues have been bombed or set afire, or their windows shattered by stones or bricks. Gatherings have been attacked by organized gangs of hoodlums. Swastikas and filthy slogans have been smeared on buildings. Jewish cemeteries have been desecrated and tombstones uprooted. And, during this last summer, there were two incidents of young people abducted and tortured, with swastikas branded into their flesh."

Mr. Comay, who visited South America last summer, during the height of the resurgence of anti-Semitism in various countries, including Argentina, Uruguay and Guatemala, declared: "It might be tempting to dismiss most of these incidents as the work of lunatics or juvenile delinquents. But, of late, organized Nazi groups have become bolder in some countries. Their leaders are frustrated would-be fuehrers, surrounded by youthful and black-shirted storm-troopers who were hardly born when the Third Reich died. In their public rallies there are heard once again the obscene cries of the Nazi era."

"I have no wish to exaggerate the size or importance of these groups, or the measure of their menace. Yet we cannot ignore them, or persuade ourselves that they will wither away before derision. Such movements feed upon intolerance and envy; they gain support from former Nazis who have found refuge elsewhere, or from local reactionary elements; and they seem to find ample funds for public demonstrations, floods of anti-Semitic pamphlets, and the legal costs of their defense on those occasions when they are prosecuted."

#### Names Rockwell, Jordan; Deplores Misuse of Democracy to Protect Totalitarians

Mr. Comay also criticized "law-abiding and liberal" countries like the United States and Britain, naming such neo-Nazis as England's Colin Jordan and America's George Lincoln Rockwell on whose behalf, "he charged, "freedom of speech is invoked to protect its very negation; the preaching of totalitarian doctrines. In the face of this democratic quandary," he said, "insufficient account has been taken of the fact that Nazism in all its manifestations became recognized as criminal after World War II, and that many Nazi leaders have been found guilty of this crime not only at the Nuremberg Trials but under various national legal systems since then. Freedom of expression has certain obvious limits; it cannot properly be exploited to propagate concepts which the civilized world has branded as inherently criminal."

"Let me say in all fairness," Mr. Comay added, "that the activities of the Rockwells and Colin Jordans, and their counterparts in Latin America and elsewhere, are arousing the contempt of responsible public opinion, and more serious attention than hitherto from the authorities of the countries concerned. These manifestations are far from being only a Jewish matter. They may start with anti-Jewish feeling, but the attack soon broadens out to include other groups against whom latent prejudice can be inflamed, and in due course it may undermine the whole fabric of society."

#### EUROPEAN PARLEY TO EVALUATE ANTI-SEMITISM; 16 BRITISH NEO-NAZIS HELD

LONDON, Oct. 29. (JTA) -- The World Jewish Congress announced today it had called a special European conference, to be held here December 1-2, to consider the problem of growing Nazi, Fascist anti-Semitic activities.

The conference will be attended by representatives of European Jewish communities and organizations affiliated with the WJC and will hear reports on such activities in a number of countries. It will also hear reports on the overt and covert international links of the neo-Nazi and fascist groups for which, the WJC said, there was a growing volume of evidence.

Sixteen neo-Nazis were held in jail today for a hearing November 9, on charges they staged a tour of London's heavily Jewish East End in a truck, shouting offensive remarks about Jews and Negroes. In court this weekend, they shouted slogans on behalf of Fascist Oswald Mosley's British Union movement.

Meanwhile, today, the Association of Jewish Ex-servicemen launched a nationwide campaign to train and organize Anglo-Jewish youth, "so that they will be better prepared to cope with anti-Semitism." The main purpose of the project is to make young Jews realize the dangers of anti-Semitism, and stimulate their interest in Jewish communal affairs, according to a spokesman for the veterans group.

#### STATE DEPT. JUSTIFIES ADMISSION OF MOSLEY AFTER J.W.V. PROTEST

WASHINGTON, Oct. 29. (JTA) -- Chief Hugh N. Whitaker, of the United States Visa Office, domestic services division, today justified the admission of Fascists like Sir Oswald Mosley as consistent with national security. He said that, following Mosley's departure, after a recent address at the University of Buffalo, there has been no reversal of the State Department's original view.

Mr. Whitaker published the Government's stand on admission of foreign anti-Semites in a letter to Joseph F. Barr, national executive-director of the Jewish War Veterans of the U.S.A. Mr. Barr, meanwhile, was informed by other sources in the State Department that only three organizations or individuals in the United States, including the JWV, had protested to the Department against the Mosley visa. The Department concluded that public opinion accepted the issuance of visas to ex-Nazis, Fascists, and other anti-Semites to a greater extent than it did in the emotional climate following World War II.

# BOMBAY JEWS PLEDGE SUPPORT IN INDIAN DEFENSE AGAINST CHINESE

BOMBAY, Oct. 29. (JTA) -- The Central Jewish Board, the representative body of Jews in Bombay, pledged the full support of the Jewish community today to measures taken by the Indian Government to repel the invasion by Communist Chinese forces of territory in Northern India.

The Board, which met in emergency session, condemned the "treacherous act of the Chinese against the peace-loving people of India," and pledged its "fullest support" of government efforts to "safeguard the integrity and freedom of the country."

## Nehru Appeals to Israel for Support Against Communist China's Aggression

JERUSALEM, Oct. 29. (JTA) -- Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru of India has requested Israel's support, "together with that of all peace-loving countries" in the current border dispute with Communist China, it was disclosed here by Premier David Ben-Gurion. He sought Mr. Nehru's cable to the attention of the Cabinet yesterday. Similar cables were sent by the Indian Premier to all members of the United Nations. India does not maintain diplomatic relations with Israel.

# BRAZILIAN DAILY OPPOSES SEPARATE JEWISH CULTURAL LIFE, URGES INTEGRATION

SAO PAULO, Oct. 29. (JTA) - A leading Brazilian daily newspaper voiced opposition today to the concept of "a separate Jewish cultural life in Brazil," and called for complete integration of the Jewish community into Brazil.

The newspaper, O Estado do Sao Paulo, the largest in Brazil, has been consistently friendly to the State of Israel and vigorous in its condemnation of anti-Semitism. It took its position on the status of Jews in the Brazilian community in the course of an editorial which it criticized Dr. Nahum Goldmann, president of the World Jewish Congress, for urging Latin American Jewish leaders to fight against assimilation. Dr. Goldmann delivered the keynote address here, last week, opening a conference of representatives of Jewish communities in 10 Latin American states.

The paper said that, instead of fighting against assimilation, Brazilian Jews should seek complete integration in the general population.

# MORE THAN 200,000 EMIGRATED THIS YEAR, 10,000 FROM CUBA, HIAS HEAD REPORTS

GENEVA, Oct. 29. (JTA) - More than 200,000 Jews had to leave their homes this year, including 10,000 Jews from Cuba, of whom more than two thirds left for the United States, at the eighth annual World Migration Conference was told here by James P. Rice, executive director of United Hias Service. He said that most of the displaced Jews had come from Eastern Europe, Egypt, North Africa and Cuba.

The meeting was attended by representatives of 23 international voluntary agencies concerned with immigration, and government representatives from the United States, Australia, Canada, France and Israel. Mr. Rice reported that more of the Jews still in Cuba are still hoping to leave.

# FORMER EX-NAZI CONFESSES PUBLICLY TO PARTICIPATING IN MASS MURDER OF JEWS

COBLENZ, Oct. 29. (JTA) -- Still one more of the 14 ex-Nazis on trial here for the murder of 70,000 persons, including more than 35,000 Jews, in the Minsk area during the war, was pressed to the judge and jury here today that he participated in the mass slaughter of Jews, Russians and Gypsies in White Russia.

Ernst Werzholz, 55, the latest of the group to confess publicly, told the court: "I did not approve of the brutal method of killing. But, under nonsensical pressure, I participated in horrible outrages." He admitted that, in 1942, he killed "some 60 Jews." Today was the seventh day of the trial which is expected to continue for several weeks more.

# HEAD OF EUROPEAN COAL-STEEL POOL ADMITS HE WAS MEMBER OF HITLER SS

BONN, Oct. 29. (JTA) -- Dr. Karl Hettlage, newly appointed director of the European Coal and Steel pool, admitted today that he had been a member of Hitler's Elite Guard, the SS, but insisted that he had merely held "honorary rank," customarily conferred upon government officials. He denied ever having been an "active" member of the Nazi Party, or of having served the National Socialist regime in any capacity other than as a police officer in the Berlin city administration.

Hettlage was named to the post by the Council of Ministers of the six-nation European Community, on the recommendation of the West German Government. He had served previously as Secretary of State for Financial Affairs in the Bonn Federal Government.

His S. S. record was exposed by the Belgian Resistance Journal, The Voice of International Resistance. The Journal charged that Hettlage, now 59, had been a member of the SS from 1936 on, and had been attached to S. S. general headquarters in 1938. The Journal asked whether the German Government had been unaware of Hettlage's record, or whether it had recommended him for the post in full knowledge of his past.

# ISRAEL CALLS ON U.N. TO URGE NUCLEAR TEST BAN ON BIG THREE POWERS

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y., Oct. 29. (JTA) -- Israel today requested the General Assembly here to pass a unanimous resolution, calling upon the three big nuclear powers--the United States, Britain and the Soviet Union--to adopt a treaty banning nuclear testing. The demand was voiced in the Assembly's political and security committee by Gideon Rafael, deputy director-general of Israel's Foreign Ministry. He is one of the ranking members of this year's Israeli delegation to the Assembly.

Pointing out that the long-drawn nuclear negotiations among the three powers, at Geneva, have resulted in many areas of agreement on important points, Mr. Rafael, requested that the positive achievements be given the Assembly's strongest endorsement. Beyond such endorsement, he stressed, the Assembly should call upon the negotiating powers to deal with the remaining problems "with utmost expedition." "In the view of my delegation," he stated, "one of the roads which will lead toward conditions in which mankind can live without fear of nuclear annihilation is the conclusion of a nuclear test ban treaty with guarantees for its faithful observance. We stand united in our insistent demand that the nuclear powers reach that goal by the shortest road."

## ESHKOL TO HEAD ISRAEL DELEGATION FOR NEGOTIATING LINK WITH EUROMART

JERUSALEM, Oct. 29. (JTA) - Finance Minister Levi Eshkol will head Israel's delegation to Brussels next month, when negotiations will get underway on trade agreements between Israel and the six member nations of the European Common Market. The decision to name Mr. Eshkol as head of the Israel trade delegation was made yesterday by the Cabinet, which felt it important that the Israeli group be headed by a Cabinet minister at least at the initial stage. The negotiations are scheduled to begin November 19.

## ISRAEL CHIEF RABBI APPEALS AGAINST DESECRATION OF MT. OLIVES CEMETERY

JERUSALEM, Oct. 29. (JTA) -- Chief Rabbi Yitzhak Nissim said today he had cabled leaders of Zionist, rabbinical and community organizations throughout the world, asking them to use their influence to halt the desecration of the Jewish cemetery on Mount of Olives in Jerusalem's Old City.

The Chief Rabbi said he took the action after a visit to Mount Zion, whence he was able to see the ancient Jewish cemetery through a recently installed telescope. He said he could clearly see a highway being laid from Jericho Road, through the cemetery, to a new hotel being built by International Hotels, a subsidiary of Pan-American Airways.

## ISRAELI ARABS ASSURED THEY MAY MAKE ISLAMIC PILGRIMAGES TO MECCA

JERUSALEM, Oct. 29. (JTA) -- Dr. Zorach Warhaftig, Minister for Religious Affairs, assured Israel Arab leaders today that the Government would grant permission to Israel's Moslems to undertake pilgrimages to Mecca, Islam's holiest shrine in Saudi Arabia. Moslems are required to make at least one pilgrimage to Mecca during their lifetime, as one of the four tenets of the Islamic faith. He expressed concern, however, that the Arab States might refuse to permit the transit of Israeli Arabs.

## AGENCY WARNS IMMIGRATION STRAINS FINANCES; ASHDOD HOUSING DEDICATED

JERUSALEM, Oct. 29. (JTA) -- Jewish immigration into Israel continues "at a steady pace, exceeding the numbers envisaged in this year's budget estimates," while expected revenues for immigration and absorption are falling short, Aryeh Pincus, treasurer of the Jewish Agency, reported here today.

Mr. Pincus made his report to a joint all-day meeting of the executives of the Jewish Agency and the Jewish Agency, Inc., with the two chairmen, Moshe Sharett and Dr. Dewey D. Stone, alternating as presiding officers. Joseph Meyerhoff, general chairman of the United Jewish Appeal, here as head of the 145-member UJA study mission, reported on the progress of the UJA's efforts on behalf of immigration and absorption financing.

Mr. Pincus, summarizing the financial situation as of the first half of this year, stated that, unless incomes are increased, "the Agency would be obliged to incur further debts to meet the needs of the Aliyah organization and the commitments towards housing and initial absorption of the immigrants."

The dedication of several hundred housing units in Ashdod, a project financed through the American Associates Company, was held today in the presence of the UJA mission members now touring Israel. During the ceremonies, Housing Minister Yosef Almogi presented Jack Weiler, a member of the mission and chairman of American Associates, with a certificate of appreciation for his part in having set up the company.

The Housing Ministry has built over 2,000 housing units in various parts of the country, financed by American Associates. The company itself invested \$1,000,000 in the housing scheme, and secured loans totaling \$9,000,000--half of this amount from a group of American insurance firms.

#### BEN-ZVI SLATED FOR RE-ELECTION TO PRESIDENCY TODAY; TO SERVE THIRD TERM

JERUSALEM, Oct. 29. (JTA) - Izhak Ben-Zvi, President of the State of Israel for the last 10 years, was slated by Parliament here today for re-election tomorrow to a third term. The choice of the next President will be the first order of important business on the agenda of the Knesset, Israel's Parliament, which reconvened this morning after a 10-week recess.

Out of respect for Mr. Ben-Zvi, the opposition parties, which object on principle against a third term, are expected to leave their ballots blank. Thus, unopposed, Mr. Ben-Zvi is certain of re-election.

At the reopening of Parliament today, three new members were sworn in to succeed others who died since the recess was begun. Mrs. Hannah Landman and Gideon Ben-Israel, of the Mapai party, are replacing the late Dr. Giora Josephthal and Herzl Berger. To succeed to the vacancy left by the death of Hanah Rubin, of Mapam, the Knesset gave the seat to Yosef Kushnir.

#### Medallions Commemorating Ecumenical Council Sent to Ben-Zvi by Pope

JERUSALEM, Oct. 29. (JTA) -- President Ben-Zvi has received from Pope John XXIII a gift of a series of medallions, coined by the Vatican to commemorate the opening of the Ecumenical Council, his office disclosed today.

They were given to Israel's Ambassador in Rome, Maurice Fischer, who headed the Israeli delegation at the Council's opening ceremonies. He sent the mementos to the President.

#### BRITISH SCIENTIST URGES EXPANSION OF NEGEV DEVELOPMENT ENTERPRISES

JERUSALEM, Oct. 29. (JTA) -- The immediate expansion of Israel's Negev development enterprises was urged here today by Sir Ben Lockspeiser, prominent British scientist. "We are now at the turning point, from which we can begin to double the output of development companies in the Negev," Sir Ben declared at the conclusion of the seventh meeting of the Development Ministry's Technological Advisory Board.

He said that progress made by the development companies proved the viability of various extractive and chemical industries in the Negev, and suggested that now was the time to begin searching for the large-scale financing necessary for the manifold expansion of their operations.

#### ISRAELI ADVISES DIVESTMENT OF GOVERNMENT HOLDINGS TO FINANCE SECURITY

TEL AVIV, Oct. 29. (JTA) -- Joseph Saphir, member of the Israel Parliament and leader of the Liberal Party, called upon the Government today to sell its holdings in private industry, in Development Authority lands, and in State-owned telephone service. He urged the use of the proceeds to cover the expenses of security.

Mr. Saphir told a press conference here that the solution to the nation's economic problems lay, not in increased forced savings aimed at reducing demand, but in more efficient production and in freezing of salaries.

Outlining a plan to finance the country's security needs, Mr. Saphir suggested that one-quarter of the required sum be raised by cuts in the regular budget; one-half by reducing subsidies, compensation for higher prices and other items; and one-quarter from the proceeds of the sale of the Government-owned industrial, telephone and land holdings.

#### PUBLIC COUNCIL URGES TAKING 'KOL ISRAEL' OUT OF POLITICAL CONTROL

JERUSALEM, Oct. 29. (JTA) -- The Public Council of Kol Israel, Israel's broadcasting service, recommended today the creation of a state authority which would assure the independence of the broadcasting system from political pressures. The Council also urged that no commercial broadcasting be permitted. The report followed a study of the structures of various public authorities and broadcasting services in other countries.

The report proposed adoption of a basic principle that Kol Israel should become a state service, rather than a Government service as it is at present. The Council proposed that Parliament should exercise control through its approval of the Kol Israel budget, while the Prime Minister would name the chairman of the proposed State Authority. Under such an arrangement, the Council said, the Authority would be independent of Government influence, and the appointment of political party personnel to the Authority would be prevented.

#### ALLOCATIONS MADE FOR 300 RESEARCH PROJECTS SPONSORED BY HEBREW U.

JERUSALEM, Oct. 29. (JTA) -- Allocations totaling 3,500,000 Israeli pounds (\$1,666,666) for more than 300 research projects sponsored by the Hebrew University were announced today for the 1962-63 year. Carried out by the university's Authority for Research and Development, the projects are financed by such institutions as the Ford and Rockefeller Foundations and UNESCO. They include 90 projects for the Hadassah Medical Center; 70 for the natural science, humanities and social science faculties; 40 for the agriculture faculty; and others for law, education and social work.

STATE DEPT. READY TO PROTEST USE OF ARAB BOYCOTT AGAINST U. S. FIRMS

WASHINGTON, Oct. 29. (JTA) -- The Department of State today revealed that it is prepared "to protest boycott actions which cause injury to American commercial interests" in connection with anti-Jewish restrictions applied by Arab governments.

L. Oppenheimer & Co., of New York, had been asked to arrange shipment of 10,000 kilograms of Idaho hops to a brewery in Egypt. Then the firm received a questionnaire from the Arab Boycott Office pertaining to the order. It asked whether the firm traded with Israel, supported Jewish causes, or had Jews among its directors.

Senator Jacob K. Javits, New York Republican, forwarded the company's protest to the State Department. In a letter to Senator Javits, Thomas R. Mathews, Assistant Secretary of State for Congressional Relations, made known that the State Department is now prepared "upon request by the company involved to protest" because the boycott action injured American commercial interests.

Mr. Mathews added that "the Department has repeatedly made known its objections to the general principles of the Arab boycott to the various Arab states concerned. The Department will refer to the example cited by Mr. Oppenheimer in its continued representations."

FORMER JUDGE WINNET HEADS PHILA. FEDERATION; OTHER OFFICERS NAMED

PHILADELPHIA, Oct. 29. (JTA) -- Nochem S. Winnet, former judge of the County Court here, was elected tonight as president of the Federation of Jewish Agencies of Greater Philadelphia. After his installation next month, he will succeed Edwin Wolf, 2nd, who has served three successive terms. He will be the third president of the Federation since the organization was formed in 1956 through the merger of the Federation of Jewish Charities and the Allied Jewish Campaign. The first president was Judge Abraham L. Freedman.

Other officers elected, at tonight's meeting of the Federation's board of trustees, were: Vice-presidents, Jack F. Adler, Albert M. Bershad, Frank G. Binswanger, Alfred J. Goldsmith, William S. Rudenko and Bernard Weinberg; treasurer, Frank L. Newburger; associate treasurer, Emanuel Meyer; secretary, Paul Rosenbaum; and associate secretary, Stanley I. Sherer.

ROBERT FROST, FOUR OTHERS RECEIVE FIRST MIAMI-ISRAEL CULTURAL AWARDS

MIAMI, Oct. 29. (JTA) -- Five prominent Americans, including the poet Robert Frost, received the Miami-Israel Cultural Awards here at a dinner conducted by the Great Miami Israel Bond Organization. The others, to whom the awards were presented by Dr. Henry King Stanford, president of the University of Miami, were: Cellist Leonard Rose, author Philip Wylie, scientist Joseph Weil and architect A. Herbert Mathes.

The awards, the first granted here, were made at a Festival of Arts, attended by 750. The dinner was preceded by an exhibit of new works by leading Israeli artists brought here for the occasion by Yurika Mann, director of the Jerusalem Art Center.

MORRIS WEINBERG, DAY-JEWISH JOURNAL PUBLISHER, HONORED BY BONDS GROUP

NEW YORK, Oct. 29. (JTA) -- Morris Weinberg, publisher of the Day-Jewish Journal, the Yiddish language daily newspaper, was honored here tonight at a testimonial dinner on behalf of Israel Bonds by 500 Jewish communal, civic and cultural leaders. More than \$300,000 in Israel bonds were purchased in tribute to Mr. Weinberg.

Dr. Emanuel Neumann, a member of the executive of the Jewish Agency, and president of the World Confederation of General Zionists, was the principal speaker at the dinner, which was sponsored by the Zionist Organization of America and the landsmanshaften division of bonds organization. The Israel Bond Organization presented to Mr. Weinberg a scroll citing him for his "lifetime of distinguished and memorable service to his people," and "as a forceful and imaginative leader on the American-Jewish scene."

FIRST JEWISH CHIEF OF FEDERAL CHAPLAINCY HONORED BY J. W. B. BOARD

NEW YORK, Oct. 29. (JTA) -- Rabbi Morris A. Sandhaus, newly appointed chief of the chaplain service of the United States Veterans Administration, was honored here today at the fall meeting of the board of directors of the National Jewish Welfare Board, when he was awarded a special scroll by Solomon Litt, president of the JWB. Rabbi Sandhaus is the first Jewish chief of any of the Federal Government's chaplaincy.

MRS. SARA KAHN DIES AT 77; WIDOW OF 'FORWARD' OFFICIAL WAS ACTIVE ZIONIST

NEW YORK, Oct. 29. (JTA) -- Mrs. Sara Kahn, widow of Alexander Kahn, the late general manager of the Jewish Daily Forward, died here today at the age of 77. Mrs. Kahn, who was active in Zionist affairs, served for many years as a member of the national advisory board of Pioneer Women, and was national chairman of the organization's Israel Bond efforts. Mr. Kahn died earlier last spring.
