## U. S. AGREES TO PROVIDE ISRAEL WITH HEAVY WATER FOR RESEARCH PROJECT

WASHINGTON, July 16. (JTA) -- The United States Government has agreed to provide Israel with four tons of heavy water for use in a research project at the Technion-Israel Institute of Technology in Haifa.

This is the first time the United States has agreed to supply heavy water to Israel. It is to be provided pursuant to an agreement for civil, peaceful uses of atomic energy between the United States and Israel. Periodic safeguard inspections will be conducted to assure that it will not be diverted by Israel to non-peaceful uses.

The department of nuclear science at the Technion, in collaboration with the Israel Atomic Energy Committee, is in process of establishing a nuclear science center on the new Technion campus to broaden programs in nuclear engineering research and instruction, including graduate work.

The laboratory will have a small reactor, pulsed neutron generator, reactor physics laboratory, associated nuclear instrumentation, and related facilities. The laboratory will house as a principal item a natural uranium exponential experiment for lattice. It is termed a "Heavy Water-Uranium Oxide (D29-U02) Lattice Research Project." The heavy water will be used in this experiment.

The United States Atomic Energy Commission decided to fulfill Israel's request after the Department of State was consulted, and raised no objection. It was noted here that the new project is not connected with the Israeli nuclear activities at Dimona, in the Negev.

## EGYPT FIRES FIRST GROUND-TO-AIR MISSILE; MAY ORBIT SPACE SATELLITE

LONDON, July 16. (JTA) -- Egypt may attempt to orbit a space satellite to coincide with the celebration next Tuesday of the 11th anniversary of the Nasser Egyptian revolution. This was made known in Cairo today following the firing yesterday of Egypt's first missile built with German technical assistance. The rocket fired was of the ground-to-air type. President Nasser witnessed the demonstration.

In the House of Commons here, Edward Heath, Lord Privy Seal, was asked yesterday whether Britain would bring up the Middle East arms race at the Soviet-American-British talks, now taking place in Moscow, on the banning of nuclear tests. Mr. Heath answered "the proposals at the Moscow talks are already defined. We are trying," he said, "with other countries, to limit the supply going to the Middle East. But, at the same time, there are indications that some were already there."

Mr. Heath's statement was, at first, believed to imply that nuclear weapons were already on hand in the Middle East. Later, however, it was explained officially by the Foreign Office that he meant only to say that there were now in the Middle East missiles capable of carrying nuclear warheads. "He certainly did not intend to imply that nuclear warheads are in the possession of any Middle Eastern country," officials stressed.

Meanwhile, an unsuccessful effort to find out how many arms have been sold by Britain to countries in the Middle East in the last three years was made today by Stephen Swingle, a Labor member of Parliament.

Mr. Swingle asked the president of the Board of Trade to reveal which countries have been the principal purchasers of British arms in the last three years, and "what kind of arms have been principally involved." Alan Green, Joint Minister of State of the Board of Trade, replied in writing: "It is not our policy to disclose the total value or details of the kind of arms exported to other countries."

The London press is featuring today the reports from Cairo about yesterday's launching there of Egypt's first ground-to-air missile. No details of the capacities of the missile were disclosed in Cairo, but it is believed here that Egypt now has several types of missiles.

#### NEUMANN PROPOSES EIGHT-POINT PROGRAM FOR AMERICAN ZIONIST MOVEMENT

TEL AVIV, July 16. (JTA) -- An eight-point program for the American Zionist movement was proposed here today by Dr. Emanuel Neumann, ZOA leader and member of the Jewish Agency executive, addressing the 1,000 delegates and guests attending the 66th annual convention of the Zionist Organization of America.

Dr. Neumann said that leaders of the Zionist movement in the United States were also great American patriots. He said he saw "not the slightest contradiction" between their Zionism and their Americanism.

Dwelling on what he called the "unique nature of Jewish identity stemming from our past history and Jewish statehood as a spiritual fact," he stated: "We look on Israel as the destined center and focus of our life, as a sacred altar on which the ancient flame kindled by prophetic souls may glow again as a beacon for us and for all mankind."

He set forth his program as calling for the education of fellow Zionists and all friends of Israel to a fuller and clearer realization "of the nature of our Jewish identity, of the meaning of Jewish nationhood and its implications in thought and action."

Second, he urged the continuation and expansion of all practical programs of aid to Israel. "It will not be enough for us to regard ourselves as teachers and preachers of Zionism, leaving the hard task of fund-raising to others," he said. "There can be no place in our ranks for shirkers."

Third, he proposed renewal and intensification of efforts to inform the American people of the critical problems Israel faced in economic development, international relations and, above all, its urgent security problems.

His other points included fostering and spreading knowledge of Hebrew, development of Zionist youth movements to reach "ever larger circles," encouragement of aliyah, "moulding and shaping" the character of the American Jewish community, and keeping open and developing lines of communication between Israel and Jews outside of Israel.

#### Alienation of Israeli Youth from World Jewry Is Scored

Jacques Torczyner, chairman of the ZOA national advisory board, asserted that "the continuous weakening influence" of the World Zionist Organization during the past 15 years had resulted in the erection of "an invisible wall" between Jewish youth in Israel and those outside of Israel.

He pointed out that while Jewish youth outside of Israel had not been afforded the inspiration of spiritual aspects in terms of cultural ties with Israel, it was Israeli youth which had been alienated from the idea that they were also part of the Jewish people.

This had happened, he said, because Jewish youth in Israel were under the constant burden of the struggle for economic independence and security, and had no time to look toward the outside Jewish world. At the same time, Jewish youth in the United States were enjoying unprecedented economic prosperity and were taking Israel for granted while becoming more integrated into an assimilationist environment.

Asserting that there was a strong tendency toward assimilation among Jewish youth in the United States, he called for an intensified education and cultural program and direct intimate cooperation between Israeli youth leadership and Jewish youth outside of Israel to assist the Zionist movement to develop leadership for the future.

Abba Eban, Deputy Prime Minister, addressing the convention tonight at an open air session, under floodlights, at Kfar Silver, said that American Zionism must adapt itself to a new system of priorities centered on education and immigration. These activities, however, he cautioned, must engage the ZOA "in addition to, not instead of, public activity in support of Israel's rights."

"While Israel is sovereign in the responsibility of framing and executing its own politics," he said, "and can in no way share this responsibility, it is still the task of American Zionism to get more friends for Israel. Many governments tend to accept public opinion in forming their attitudes, therefore, the rallying of friendship for and support of Israel is essential for Israel," he stressed.

#### SIX PERSONS ON ISRAELI BOAT KIDNAPPED BY SYRIANS ON LAKE TIBERIAS

TEL AVIV, July 16. (JTA) -- Syrian officials informed Israel today through United Nations observers, that they were holding six persons missing since Saturday after departing for a boat trip on Lake Tiberias.

Israel demanded the immediate return of the group, which included three Belgian citizens, charging that they were kidnapped by Syrians who entered Israeli waters. According to reports here, the excursion group, composed of three men and three women, sailed to the northeastern shore of the lake, which is completely within Israeli territory, and were arrested there.

### ANTI-SEMITIC 'BLACK MUSLIMS' DISMISSED FROM GOVERNMENT JOBS

WASHINGTON, July 16, (JTA) -- The United States Government today began moving against the anti-Semitic Negro extremist group known as the "Black Muslims," firing a dozen from Federal jobs. The extremists were dismissed from Government employment because they indicated their first allegiance was to the "Nation of Islam" rather than the United States.

The Civil Service Commission stated that the discharged employees declared that they would support the "Nation of Islam" in any conflict with the United States Government, and would refuse to defend or serve the United States. A number of Muslims have refused to serve in the army, and failed to register for selective service.

The Justice Department recently revealed to the Jewish War Veterans that an active investigation of the fanatic activities of both the "Black Muslims" and the American Nazi party is under way in connection with current integration tensions. Malcolm X, the most articulate leader of the Muslim group, has denounced the American Jewish community and justified contacts with American Nazis.

### BAIL RAISED FOR LEADER OF ANTI-SEMITIC NATIONAL RENAISSANCE PARTY

NEW YORK, July 16, (JTA) -- Bail for James Madole, the leader of the National Renaissance party, who was among the eight alleged neo-Nazis arrested Sunday in connection with anti-racist picketing of a Bronx diner, was raised to \$7,500 today, while the others were held in \$5,000 bail.

Three of the suspected Nazis have already posted bail. They are: Paul Joachim and John Corrigan, who were arrested Sunday morning when police found an arsenal of guns and ammunition in a truck they were driving, and Peter Kraus, in whose home police said they found arms, ammunition and anti-Semitic literature.

The alleged Nazis will appear in court here July 23, when they will face charges of possession of deadly weapons, incitement to riot and "anarchy."

### BONN BANS INTERNATIONAL RALLY OF EX-MEMBERS OF NAZI ELITE CORPS

LONDON, July 16, (JTA) -- An international rally of former SS members which was to have taken place in Hamelin, West Germany next September, has been banned following representations by civic organizations in Germany and abroad, it was announced here today by the World Jewish Congress.

The ramifications of international anti-Semitism and Nazi-Fascist movements will be discussed at a global gathering of World Jewish Congress leaders in Montreux, Switzerland, from August 11 to 13th. The meeting has been summoned by Dr. Nahum Goldmann, WJC president.

### BULGARIA OBSERVES ANNIVERSARY OF RESISTANCE TO DEPORTATION OF JEWS

LONDON, July 16, (JTA) -- The 20th anniversary of a demonstration conducted in 1943 against the Nazis' order for the deportation of the Bulgarian Jews, described as "another instance of Jewish resistance, almost forgotten," was observed in Sofia, capital of Bulgaria, according to dispatches received here today.

The observance recalled Jewish and Bulgarian reactions to the Nazi deportation order of 20 years ago. When the Nazis made that order public, the Jews of Sofia, supported by Bulgarians, staged a demonstration in the capital's Clementine Square. The Jews were supported by the Orthodox Church, Socialists and Communists, liberals, writers, artists and many leading citizens.

Facing such mass resistance, the Nazis cancelled the deportation order. The anniversary demonstration in Sofia, according to today's dispatches, was attended by Jews, many non-Jews, and leaders of the ruling Bulgarian Communist Party.

### JEWSH COOPERATIVES IN POLAND STRESS NEED FOR TRAINING SKILLED WORKERS

LONDON, July 16, (JTA) -- A two-day national conference of Jewish cooperatives in Poland has decided to put more stress on training their members for skilled work, it was reported here today from Warsaw.

Speakers at the conference pointed out that there was no more room for the output of semi-skilled craftsmen in any branch of industry, and that unless all members were highly skilled, there was no future for the cooperatives. They said the cooperatives had fulfilled their functions since the Second World War by giving Jewish craftsmen an outlet for their products. The speakers hailed ORT and other vocational training facilities as being of significant value to the training program. It was also decided to introduce a systematic cultural program as a permanent feature of the activity of the cooperatives in place of the sporadic cultural projects carried out in the past.

### SURVIVAL OF JEWISH LIFE IN U.S. ANALYZED AT YOUNG ADULTS CONVENTION

STARLIGHT, Pa., July 16. (JTA) -- Delegates to a national Jewish young adult convention were told here today that their positive commitment to Jewish ideals and values was the key to the survival of Jewish life in America. The warning was sounded by Dr. Ira Eisenstein, president of the Jewish Reconstructionist Foundation of America, who called for a "young adult-inspired extraordinary effort."

"Jewish young adults must break through the vicious cycle of ignorance and indifference which has caught this generation in its grip," Rabbi Eisenstein told the more than 100 delegates attending the 18th annual convention of the B'nai B'rith Young Adults. He said he was singling out Jewish young adults for "this vital mission" because today's Jewish adult community has "neglected to discipline itself in the study and application of Jewish ideals." In addition, he said "the children growing up today are too young to assume such a responsibility, especially if they are being brought up in homes where Jewish knowledge and loyalty are meagre."

Young adults, "the rabbinic leader said, "have to make the great decision to put an end to drifting and begin directing American Judaism in the way that it may go." Dr. Eisenstein said Jewish young adults should have the "enthusiastic support and co-operation of rabbis and teachers of all the wings of Judaism" in their efforts.

### ISRAEL'S JEWISH BIRTHRATE DECLINES; ISRAEL'S ARAB BIRTHRATE RISES

JERUSALEM, July 16. (JTA) -- Israel's Jewish birthrate fell by one-third during the past decade, while that of the Israeli Arabs rose by about 10 per cent in the same period, Deputy Health Minister Yitzhak Raphael declared today in Parliament.

He disclosed the data during debate on the Ministry budget and in reply to critics who had urged Government measures to promote birth control. He reported that while Jewish births fell from 32.9 per thousand to 22.5, the Arab rate rose from 46.5 per thousand to 51. He also reported that there were 20 known abortions to every 100 births, currently, as compared to 15 per hundred in 1952.

### PRESIDENT OF TANGANYIKA SAYS ISRAEL IS NO DANGER TO AFRICAN UNITY

WASHINGTON, July 16. (JTA) -- President Julius K. Nyerere of Tanganyika, visiting Washington as a guest of President Kennedy, today defended his country's relations with Israel and Israel's role in Africa.

Faced with hostile, pro-Arab questions at the National Press Club, the Tanganyikan President has asked about the concern of Egypt and other North African states over Israeli "neo-colonialism" in Africa, and the alleged dangers constituted by Israel to African unity.

President Nyerere told the Press Club that some of his country's avowed friends were not "friends" themselves. He said "we pick our friends and we don't allow our friends to pick enemies for us." He emphasized that "we don't believe that our relations with Israel undermine African unity." Israel and Tanganyika maintain cordial relations, and many Israelis are working there on development projects.

### DR. HOLLENDER NAMED HEAD OF CHICAGO FEDERATION'S \$6,448,000 DRIVE

CHICAGO, July 16. (JTA) -- Dr. Samuel S. Hollender, Chicago business leader, has been named general chairman for the Jewish Federation's 1963 Campaign for \$6,448,000. The appointment was announced this week by Joseph L. Gidwitz, president of the Jewish Federation of Metropolitan Chicago. Dr. Hollender has served on the Federation's Board of Directors and was president of the Jewish Federation for three years.

### GIDEON PAZ APPOINTED CHIEF FISCAL OFFICER IN U.S. FOR ISRAEL

NEW YORK, July 16. (JTA) -- The Israel Ministry of Finance has appointed Gideon Paz chief fiscal officer in the United States for Israel, it was announced here today. Mr. Paz replaced Samuel Selinger, who completed his tour of duty. He had previously served as assistant to the director general of the Finance Ministry and as legal adviser to the Economic Minister of Israel to the United States.

### LOUIS GROSS, PRESIDENT OF BRUSSELS JEWISH COMMUNITY, DEAD; WAS 78

BRUSSELS, July 16. (JTA) -- Funeral services preceded by Jewish religious rites were held here today for Louis Gross, a member of the Jewish Consistory of Belgium, and president of the Brussels Jewish Community. He died here yesterday at the age of 78.
