### EBAN ADDRESSES U. N. ASSEMBLY; OUTLINES ISRAEL'S STAND ON WORLD ISSUES

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y., Dec. 9: (JTA) -- Israel warned the world today that it will enter into no negotiations with the Arab states on any problem whatever unless Israel's sovereignty and integrity are first recognized as "an unchallengeable starting point."

That statement was made here before a plenary session of the General Assembly by Israel's Deputy Prime Minister, Abba Eban, who addressed the 115-nation body during its "general debate," when Governments state their over-all foreign affair policies and the specific issues affecting their countries.

In a long address touching upon virtually every problem of concern to the United Nations as a whole, Israel-Arab relations specifically, and issues of interest to Jewry the world over, Mr. Eban also:

- 1: Discussed the UN's financial crisis and the world body's peacekeeping operations, which affect Israel directly because the United Nations Emergency Force guards Israel against Egyptian incursions.
- 2: Praised the accomplishments of the recent Ecumenical Council at the Vatican, which adopted preliminarily a declaration that would vindicate the Jewish people from the ancient charge of deicide and would condemn anti-Semitism.
- 3: Requested that the UN itself condemn anti-Semitism forthrightly and by name.
- 4: Alluded to the persecution of Jews in the Soviet Union without, however, mentioning the USSR by name.
- 5: Insisted that Israel must be recognized as having a rightful place among the under-developed countries which are now organized inside the UN to obtain more assistance for the "have not" countries from the minority of affluent nations.
- 6: Spelled out Israel's role in the advancement of science and technology, offering to share such knowledge with the rest of the world.
- 7: Expressed dissatisfaction with West Germany's refusal to extend beyond next May the statute of limitation on prosecution of major Nazi war criminals.

Referring to the Arab states, he told the Assembly: "Israel has nothing to say or discuss in any context in which her sovereignty, integrity and statehood, are not taken as a starting point, beyond the realm of negotiation."

### Stresses Israel's Unchallengeable Place in Middle East

He vigorously supported the doctrine of prohibiting frontier changes by force. Turning to the Middle East, he said: "No more and no less is required, than the application of the principles of the UN Charter." He pointed out that Arab nationalism has no cause for complaint, that the Middle East is not a uniquely Arab area, but the authentic home of many peoples, cultures and faiths; and that the Arabs do not grasp the depth, passion and total authenticity of Israel's roots in Middle Eastern history and life. At the same time he stressed Israel's unchallengeable place in the group of developing countries;

In an impassioned call for peace and global unity, he urged proclaiming and strengthening the sovereignty and integrity of states; defining UN peace-keeping responsibilities; giving new impulse to the UN Disarmament Conference; accelerating the progress of the developing states; advancing towards the completion of decolonization; United Nations denunciation of discrimination and intolerance; and improving the UN's effectiveness for international unity;

There was loud and prolonged applause from the delegates at the Assembly when Mr. Eban concluded; All of the Arab delegations were present, although they refused demonstratively to join the applause for Mr. Eban's address. One Arab--Adnan M. Pachachi, of Iraq, speaking on behalf of the entire Arab bloc, replied to Mr. Eban. But his remarks, though brief, were seen here as marked by the customary Arab tone of anti-Israeli diatribe;

### ISRAEL APPEALS TO PARLIAMENTS WORLD OVER TO HAVE NAZIS PUNISHED

JERUSALEM, Dec. 9; (JTA) -- The Foreign Affairs Committee of Israel's Parliament appealed today to the parliaments of all countries with which Israel has diplomatic relations to do all in their power to have Nazi criminals punished. The appeal also asked the governments to assure that such crimes would not be subject to any statute of limitations.

The proposal was adopted unanimously and was prepared by a Knesset subcommittee to which the matter was referred following motions in Parliament on the announcement by West Germany that it would not extend the statute of limitations for prosecution of Nazi war crimes beyond next May 8;

### GERMAN MINISTER OF JUSTICE FIRMLY ON ENDING PROSECUTION OF NAZIS

BOHIN, Dec. 9; (JTA) -- Dr. Ewald Bucher, the West German Justice Minister, re-affirmed today his opposition to any extension of the statute of limitations for prosecution of Nazi war criminals;

He contended it would be better to put enough lawyers and public prosecutors on the task of checking still unprosecuted offenses before the deadline expired next May 8; He added that this was the general view of the Cabinet which, on November 11, said it could not extend the statute on constitutional grounds;

However, Gunther von Hase, the West German press spokesman, said earlier this week that a new situation would develop if too much material on unprosecuted criminals came in to be processed before the deadline; This was generally interpreted as preparing the way for the Government to retreat from its stand that the law could not be changed.

### 2,000 DEMONSTRATE IN PARIS AGAINST GERMANY'S DECISION ON NAZIS

PARIS, Dec. 9; (JTA) -- More than 2,000 persons attended a mass demonstration here last night to protest against West Germany's decision to permit the statute of limitations on prosecution of Nazi war criminals to become effective next May; The meeting, organized by the Federation of Jewish Societies, was one of the largest ever held in Paris under Jewish auspices;

Raymond Schmittlin, vice-president of the French National Assembly, one of the speakers, called on the United Nations to intervene on the issue so that "justice will be upheld;" He also protested strongly against the continued activities of some 500 West German scientists in Egypt, working on advanced weapons systems; He said they "now plot Israel's destruction and the finish of a task they were unable to complete during the Second World War;"

He also recalled that he, together with Deputy Coste Floret, submitted a bill to the Assembly which would bar any ban on prosecution for war crimes and genocide in France. He said the bill, which will come up for discussion next week, seemed to have the support of deputies of all French parties and of all political views;

Leon Boutbien, vice-president of the French National Resistance Council, also assailed the scheduled application in West Germany of the limitations statute next May; He called on the world powers to pass an international convention to exempt from any limitation laws crimes against humanity and genocide;

Salomon Friederich, the secretary-general of the French-Israel Alliance, appealed to French Jews to make their voices heard in the issue and not to let "murderers and torturers get away scot free;"

### ARGENTINE JEWS HOPE BONN WILL CONTINUE TO PROSECUTE NAZIS

BUENOS AIRES, Dec. 9; (JTA) -- The annual plenary session of the D.A.L.A., the central body of Argentine Jewry, expressed the hope today that West Germany would extend the deadline for the prosecution of Nazi war criminals beyond next May 8;

President Isaac Goldenberg said that a consolidation of the internal situation of Argentine Jewry had taken place during the past two years, and that frictions among Jewish institutions had "happily diminished;" The session adopted a declaration that the D.A.L.A. was the only body competent to act as the political representative of Argentine Jewry.

Mark Turkow, South American representative of the World Jewish Congress, reported on the preliminary vote of approval by the third session of the Ecumenical Council on the declaration holding Jews, past and present, innocent of the charge of deicide, and condemning anti-Semitism. He said the "political consequences" of the vote were probably only now getting started;

### BALTIC JEWS IN ENGLAND SEND CLOTHING PARCELS TO RELATIVES IN RUSSIA

LONDON, Dec. 9; (JTA) -- A total of 7,291 parcels containing various items of clothing were dispatched to needy Jewish families in the Soviet Union during 1964 by the Association of Baltic Jews in Great Britain, it was reported here tonight by Jacob Lossos, chairman of the Association at its annual dinner; Custom duties on the parcels were paid in Britain so that the recipients got their parcels free of any cost;

## NATIONAL CONFERENCE OF U. J. A. OPENS TODAY; DELEGATES TO HONOR J. D. C.

NEW YORK, Dec. 9. (JTA) -- More than 2,000 key leaders of American Jewish communities from coast to coast will attend the United Jewish Appeal's 27th annual national conference which opens its four-day sessions at the New York Hilton Hotel tomorrow, Joseph Meyerhoff, UJA general chairman, announced today.

United States Chief Justice Earl Warren and Avraham Harman, Israel's Ambassador to the U. S., head the roster of speakers. Mr. Harman is taking the place of Israel's Foreign Minister, Mrs. Golda Meir, who was forced to cancel her appearance because of illness. Highlight of the Conference will be special programs honoring the 50th anniversary of the Joint Distribution Committee. The Conference tribute will inaugurate nationwide observances of JDC's 50th year.

In its business agenda, the UJA Conference will set the national campaign goal for 1965, chart plans to achieve that goal, elect a new general chairman and choose other officers for the year ahead.

Selected student leaders from 26 American campuses will hold a three-day leadership institute as part of the United Jewish Appeal's national conference. The institute is under the joint auspices of UJA and the B'nai B'rith Hillel Foundations. First of its kind to involve college students, it grew out of a proposal by Rabbi Benjamin M. Kahn of Washington, Hillel's national director, that Jewish organizations "make it a deliberate policy to expose Jewish college youth to the concerns of Jewish life and the Jewish people."

## \$7,000,000 EDUCATIONAL TRUST NAMED FOR WEISGAL AT NEW YORK DINNER

NEW YORK, Dec. 9. (JTA) -- The establishment of an International Scientific Educational Trust at the Weizmann Institute of Science, with an initial fund of \$7,000,000, to be named for Meyer W. Weisgal, its chairman, to enlarge Israel's scientific manpower and to increase the Weizmann Institute's contribution to peace through science, was announced tonight at a dinner at the Americana Hotel marking the 20th anniversary of the Weizmann Institute of Science and honoring Mr. Weisgal as its master builder, on the occasion of his 70th birthday.

Announcement of the Meyer Weisgal Scientific Educational Trust, a proposal of Sir Isaac Wolfson, one of Britain's great industrialists and philanthropists, was made by Sir Isaac, who will serve as international chairman. Although no formal solicitation of funds has been undertaken, the Trust has come into being with gifts in the sum of \$1,820,000, representing a million-dollar gift from a donor in England and 12 gifts from friends of the Weizmann Institute in the United States.

As projected by Sir Isaac, \$7,000,000, the initial fund to be put into the Trust, will represent the pooling of gifts from a group of private and family foundations as well as individuals, and will be raised in its entirety within the coming months. Its purpose is to increase the reservoir of scientific manpower in Israel, make available fellowships to students from abroad and to enlarge the scope of the Weizmann Institute's contribution to peace through scientific collaboration.

The announcement of the Meyer Weisgal Scientific Educational Trust was made to an audience of 1,500, attending a dinner arranged under the auspices of an International Committee of more than 460 statesmen, scientists, and leaders in the arts, sciences, business, labor, professions, and education, from 18 countries, headed by the President of Israel Zalman Shazar as honorary chairman, with former President Harry S. Truman, Israel Prime Minister Levi Eshkol; former Prime Ministers David Ben-Gurion and Moshe Sharett; and Mrs. Chaim Weizmann as honorary co-chairmen.

The announcement of the Meyer Weisgal Scientific Educational Trust was made in the context of a series of brief speeches which hailed the Weizmann Institute as "unique in the world"; called for a "creative dialogue between science and statesmanship" to resolve the perilous problems of the world; and which described Meyer Weisgal as an "authenticated genius" with a profound understanding of the scientific spirit, responsible for creating Israel scientific tradition and as the Master Builder of the Weizmann Institute of Science.

Speakers included Dr. I. I. Rabi, University Professor of Columbia University, 1944 Nobel Laureate in Physics; Dr. Jerome B. Wiesner, chairman of the Science Division of M. I. T., former Special Assistant on Science and Technology to Presidents Kennedy and Johnson; Deputy Prime Minister of Israel Abba Eban, and Meyer Weisgal. Dewey D. Stone, chairman of the board of governors of the Weizmann Institute, presided.

The Bronze Medallion of the City of New York was awarded to Mr. Weisgal by Mayor Robert F. Wagner in tribute to "half a century of service to cultural and scientific advancement in our society." A musical program was presented by the Philadelphia Orchestra with Isaac Stern, violinist, as soloist. Jan Peerce, Metropolitan Opera star, was heard in a number of songs. The proceeds of the dinner, at \$350 per person, will be turned over to the Research Fund of the Weizmann Institute.

### AMERICAN NAZI PARTY DEMONSTRATES AT BRITISH EMBASSY IN WASHINGTON

WASHINGTON, Dec. 9. (JTA) -- The American Nazi party staged a demonstration today at the British Embassy in an attempt to protest to British Prime Minister Harold Wilson over restrictions on British Nazis.

Police arrested one Nazi, Leslie Hudson, who manacled himself to a rail fencing the Embassy ground and displayed an appeal for "free speech for British Nazis" printed on his sweater. He was arrested and charged with disorderly conduct, the police listing his address as the headquarters of the George Rockwell movement in nearby Arlington, Va.

### ROCKWELL WARNED AGAINST USING CALIFORNIA HOME AS HEADQUARTERS

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 9. (JTA) -- George Rockwell, leader of the American Nazi Party, who boasted over a televised press conference that the California wing of his party would open its headquarters in the City of Glendale bordering on Los Angeles, was warned today by Glendale officials that the use of a home in that city by the Nazi Party for any other function than a home would not be tolerated.

Glendale Mayor Herman E. Barnes and City Manager C. E. Perkins, after examining the proposed Nazi California headquarters, said occupation of the house for other than dwelling purposes would be a violation of the Glendale City ordinances. "If Rockwell, Forbes (Ralph Forbes, captain of the Nazi Party wing) or any other of this gang attempt to do so they will be prosecuted immediately," said the two officials. Even the posting of a sign in front of the building would be cause for prosecution, they emphasized.

### CANADIAN SOCIAL SCIENTIST URGES COMMONS TO GO SLOW ON BIGOTRY LAWS

OTTAWA, Dec. 9. (JTA) -- A Canadian social scientist suggested today that Parliament go slow in legislating against racial bigotry until all the implications of such legislation are thoroughly studied. Professor Charles Hendry, director of the University of Toronto's school of social work, appeared before the House of Commons External Affairs Committee, which is considering a bill that would outlaw genocide and another that would ban hate-literature from the mails.

He said legislation is neither inappropriate nor unnecessary in controlling the abuses of freedom. But, he added, "until and unless evidence can be produced to indicate convincingly that the actual threat to any minority group is undeniably substantial and significant, I personally would prefer to delay passage of the two bills, pending the considered judgment of legal experts and social research scientists."

### ISRAEL TO PROVIDE TECHNICAL AID TO BRAZIL FOR WATER DEVELOPMENT

RIO DE JANEIRO, Dec. 9. (JTA) -- The Israel Government signed an agreement with Brazil according to the terms of which Israel will provide \$100,000 in technical aid for water development in the underdeveloped northern province, Rio Grande do Norte. Ambassador Joseph Nahmias signed the agreement for Israel and Governor Alvison Alves of Rio Grande do Norte, signed for Brazil.

### EXHIBITION OF 26 ISRAELI ARTISTS OPENS AT NEW YORK JEWISH MUSEUM

NEW YORK, Dec. 9. (JTA) -- "Art Israel," an exhibition by the 26 Israeli painters and sculptors, was opened tonight at the Jewish Museum here. The exhibit was organized by the Museum of Modern Art in New York, under auspices of the American-Israel Cultural Foundation and the International Council of the Museum of Modern Art; Dr. William C. Seitz, associate curator of the Department of Painting, and Sculpture Exhibitions at the Museum of Modern Art, made the selections.

Dr. Seitz said that the selections "make up a cross-section of Israeli art today" even though "certain artists very popular in Israel are not represented." He said international characteristics predominated over national ones. The exhibition here will end on Jan. 24.

### HEBREW LANGUAGE AND CULTURE BUILDING INAUGURATED IN SAO PAULO

SAO PAULO, Brazil, Dec. 9. (JTA) -- A Hebrew language and Culture Building was inaugurated here today in the presence of Dr. Shaul Levin, cultural attache of the Israel Embassy, and Leon Feffer, the Israel Consul General in Sao Paulo. Situated in the finest residential quarter of the city, the new building will serve to strengthen the cultural links between Brazil and Israel, and will offer Brazilians the opportunity to study Hebrew.

### CHAVER PAVER, AUTHOR OF JEWISH CHILDREN'S BOOKS, DIES IN LOS ANGELES

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 9. (JTA) -- Funeral services will be held here tomorrow for Gershon Einbinder, a Yiddish writer and author of numerous books under the pen-name Chaver Paver, who died here yesterday at the age of 63. Born in the Ukraine, Mr. Einbinder came to the United States in 1923 and wrote a number of children's books.
