REPORT HARSH NEW MEASURES AGAINST SYRIAN JEWS, INCLUDING IMPRISONMENT

NEW YORK, Jon., 31 (JIA) -- Reports of new harsh measures against Syrian Jews have reached the United States. According to Rabbi Stephen S. Goldrich; of Euclid, Ohio, more than 100 Syrian Jews were imprisoned early this month, all of whom were tortured. They were released Jon. 15. Three required hospitalization

Goldrich, who is chairman of the Commitference of American Rabbis (CCAR), the rab-binic branch of American Reform Audism, said he received his information from Abe Dwek, head of the Syrian Jewish community in New

If was further reported that during the past month or two, a 7 p. m. curfew has been tim-posed on lews in Syrian cities. The restrictions on travel by lews within Syria, litted some time aga, have been reimposed. Syrian lews are increasingly under surveillance and it is reported that Jews are now forbidden to sell real property, Goldrich said.

REAL AUTHOR OF ANTI-SEMILIC BOOK IDENTIFIED AS SAUDI ARABIAN-AGENT By Rochelle Saidel Wolk

Lehrer said that the Grimstad book, which is sold by the National States Rights Party headquartered in Marietta, Cd., was originally published in late 1977. The northwal author. the Committee for Truth in History and the copyright is held by Media Research Associates, both of which are "phony," he sold.

Although the real author-had never been disclosed; Latirer explained, the ADL discov. ered in October, 1978 that the book had been written by Grimstad. The ADL further discov ered that in 1977 Grimstad had registered with the U.S. State Department as an agent of andi Arabia, he said.

According to Lehrer, ADL believes that the Saudis paid \$20,000 to Grimstad for his account that the Holocaust never occurred. In addition to being a paid agent of Soudi Arabia, Grimstod is the former editor of "White Power, a newspaper published by an extreme rightwing Nazi group, Lehrer said.

#### Danger Of Extremist Groups

Lehrer also discussed Nazism throughout the world and pointed out the swastike has a visceral effect on Jewish groups, regardless of the real threat implied. Although other rightwing groups, such as the Ku Klux Klan and the Liberty Lobby bear no swastika, they are

equally as dangerous, be said. He emphasized that the ability of Nozi and other extreme rightwing aroups to get media attention for out of proportion to their very small numbers is a serious problem that requires vigilance

Dr. David Sidorsky, a professor of philosophy at Columbia University, stated that he doesn't see Nazism as a real threat to the Jews in the United States today. The three major threats to world Jawa according to Sidorsky, come from the left and are the current situation in Iran, the Palestine Liberation Organization, and the Soviet Union's policies of not giving Jews equal rights nor allowing them to emigrate.

#### TENG, CARTER FOCUS ON MIDEAST By Joseph Polakoff

WASHINGTON; Jon. 31 (JIA) :- Presiden tial press secretary Jody Powell said that President Carter and Chinese Vice Premier Teng Hsrao-Ping spent more time on the Middle East than on any other regional topic at their White House conference yesterday.

Responding to a question by the Jewish Telegraphic Agency also news briefing, Powell said that "basically" the President reported to leng on the "situation as he saw it" in the Middle East and in "general terms" on the recent mission there of special am bassador Alfred Atherton.

Powell indicated that the two leaders discussed what they know of the Middle East problem, their understanding of the leaders; the availab tions and the activities taking place there. Powelldeclined to say if the President perceived a wider or different role for China in the Middle East.

Powell also said that "all speculation about another summit conference on the Middle East is de citedly premature." He noted that Carter has stated that he would "not hesitate," to call another meeting between himself, President Anwar Sodat of Egypt and Premier Menachem Begin of Israel under appropriate circumstances. But "those circumstances don't exist ar present, -- Powell said.

He asserted today that Carter would not. participate in another summit conference until he is convinced that both Egypt and Israel have shown greater flexibility. "The requisite pre-conditions, flexibility by both sides, do not exist at this point he said in reviewing the failure of the latest effort by the U.S. to end the stalemate in the peace talk Powell nated that another summit would only raise false hopes and waste the time of Carter, Begin and

Sadat unless flexibility was shown.

At the State Department, chief spokesman Hodding Carter coutioned reporters yesterday that "there are other possibilities than a presidential summit or a ministerial symmit on the Midale East: "I don't want to suggest these are the only two ways we can go," he said. "There are more than just two. boxes possible for the future."

## DA YAN ENDING VISIT TO FRANCE, WIDE DIFFERENCES REMAIN

PARIS, Jan. 31 (JTA) -- Foreign Minister Moshe Dayan of Israel is returning home tomorrow after a three-day visit to France during which he me President Valery Giscard d'Estaing, Prime Minister Raymond Barre and Familia Minister Raymond Barre and Familia Minister Raymond Barre and France by a member of Menachem Begin's Cabinet and has permitted the two countries to exchange views on the Middle East and the current peace process.

France's and Israel's positions have become clearer to each other but remain as widely divergent as ever before on practically all main issues. Even on a relatively minor issue, but highly symbolic, that of Begin's visit to France's no solution is in sight and the visit is no nearer than its was before Doyan's arrival.

Giscard, during his 90-minute meeting yesterday with Dayan, roised the issue of Begints visit, saying he hoped the Israeli leader will avail himself of this opportunity. But the problems linked to the visit have not even been broached. Giscard and Dayan also exchanged views on a solution to the Middle East conflict, with the French President stressing the need for a global settlement and warning Israel that, in his eyes, a separate Egyption-Israeli peace would be neither lasting nor just.

#### Areas Of Disagreement

French opposition to the peace negotiations between Israel and Egypt is well known. According to reliable diplomatic sources, Giscard twice in resent months advised President Anwar Sadat of Egypt not to sign the Camp David accords or the tentative agreements mached on the ministerial level during the Blair House talks in Washington in November, at least not in their original form. These sources said Giscard's advice may have contributed to Sadat's decision to make new demands on Israel, Jeading to the present

In his contacts with other Arab leaders, such as King Hussein of bordon, the French President reportedly went out of his way to efficie withe Camp David agreements and the current peace process. He is said to have congravilated Hussein for adopting a "wait-and-ser" attitude and assured him that "hiere is always time for you to pin (the talks) later. "Bardonian displamats have self-that France's attitude during Hussein's recentrip to Western Europe was "the friendliest and most understanding."

The French attitude stems from Giscord's belief that only a "global peace" Can bring about a lasting settlement. The French tofally disagree with Israel's assertion that an Egyptian-Israel's ettlement can pave the way for a large, more comprehensive agreement. According to the French, as separate agreement between Israel and Egypt would set back the prospects for a general peace in the Middle East and Euripe complicate the problem.

On the Palestinian issue, the French government backs fully the principle of Palestinian participation in any peace process. It does not believe in the West Bank autonomy plan contained in the Camp David frameworks. On the contrary, if views that plan as armeans to avoid dealing with what France considers the basic issue. This position was made clear by the French government to all the Arab governments, to its West European partners and to President Carter during the recent summit meeting in Guadelobae.

Last month, France was the only member of the European Economic Community (EEC) that did not vote against a vehemently anti-israel, pro-Palestinian resolution presented in the United Nations by Libby and Iraq. Despite the

Navon congratulated the government for endorsing the cooperation plan worked out by Jerold Hoffberger, chairman of the Jewish Agency's International Project Renewal Committee and Yigael Yadin, Deputy Prime Minister. Navon spoke of Project Renewal as a "bold and broad venture". "He urged that the problem of housing for young couples be considered as part of the overall social project, since it was no less crucial and patentially explosive than that of the slum-dwellers whose living conditions Project Renewal will seek to alleviate.

#### CONSERVATIVE RABBIS TAKE NO ACTION ON ORDINATION OF WOMEN AS RABBIS

LOS ANGELES, Jan. 31 (JTA). Delegates attending the 79th annual convention of the Rabbinical Assembly, the International organization of Conservative rabbis, today passed on to the Jewish Theological Seminary of America the Final Report of the Commission for the Study of the Ordination of Women as Rabbis without recommendation. The action was taken by a varie of 127-110.

# CARTER URGED TO PERSUADE WEST GERMANY TO ABOLISH STATUTE OF LIMITATIONS FOR NAZI WAR CRIMINALS BY Resealle Soidel Wolk

ALBANY, N.Y., Jon. 31 (JTA) -- A joint Senother Assembly resolution exhorting President Carter to persuade West Cermony to abolish the statute of limitations for Nazi war criminals. and messages from Gov. Hugh L. Carey, Senate Minority Leader Manfried Ohrenstein and Nathan M. Goldberg, Jewish War Veterans national commander, were highlights of a rally here yesterday, part of an international peopoligh, to offer world opinion to the issue. An estimated 500 people participated in the relly. Passed by the New York Legislature on Mon

day and read at the noon rally yesterday by Albany Assemblyman Richard J. Conners (D.), the resolution not only urges the President to exert his powers of office, but also calls directly an the government of West Germany to "abolish the statute of limitations for crimes of murder com-

mitted by war criminals.

Stanley Fink, Speaker of the Assembly, and legislators from throughout the state were present at the rally which was sponsored by the Copitol District Ad Hoc Committee on Justice for Nazi. War Criminals. Carey, who posponed his annual budget message to the legislature from noon until 12:30 p.m. o that the legislators could attend the rally, sent a message which called the Holo-caust none of the most dastardly acts in the annals of human history.

#### No Time Limit On Justice

"I can testify personally to the fact," the governor's message, read by Menachem Shayo-vich, special assistant to the governor, said, "because' I fought in Europe during World War II. was in command of the unit that I berated the Nordhausen concentration camp, a place of horror which I will never forget. Every peaceloving individual has the moral obligation to bring to justice those individuals who share in the responsibility for the genocide which occurred in our generation.

"Unless the West German government acts to change the present law, no Nezi war criminal can be prosecuted after Dec., 31, 1979, "Carey said. "Moral obligations cannot be limited by said. "

Ohrenstein told the rally that he and his family were refugees from Nazi Germany, least ing the place of his birth, Wannheim, two months before Kristallnacht in 1938; "We know what happened to my friends and those of my family who stayed behind, "he said. "The need to re-move the statute of limitations is necessary not. because of vindictiveness but because of reverence for the memory of the millions of innocent victims of the Holocaust." It was on his initiative that the State Senate resolution was introduced and approved.

Goldberg reminded the rally participants that "in the United States, Latin America, even in Germany Itself, unprosecuted Nazi perpet-rators of these heinous crimes remain hidden, in obscority, waiting for their reprieve from focing the bar of justice, waiting patiently for the statute" it dend, "so they can once again assume their roles of fostering the Nazi ideology," if

### WEST GERMANY URGED TO REPEAL OR

-- LONDON, Jan. 31 (JTA) -- Four members

of Parliament, spearheaded by Winston Churchill, grandson of Britain's wartime Prime Minister, called on West Germany to repeal or amend the statute of Imitations for Nazi war crimes, which is due to take effect Jan 51, 1980.

Churchill, a Conservative, and three other

MPs had a one-hour talk yesterday with West German Ambassador Hans Ruethe who said he would convey their views "fully and urgently" to the

The MPs, who plan to seek private meetings with West German parliamentarions, told the Ambassodor that the statute of limitations could harm relations with West Germany. It would, they said, mean that Nazi murderers could emerge from hiding, write their memoirs and take the lead in extremist political movements.

Other members of the delegation, who are to form a permanent all-party faction, were Greville Janner and Col. Richard Grawshaw, Labor, and Douglas Henderson, a Scottish nationalist. (By Mourice Samuelson)

FORM COALITION TO FIGHT HATE GROUPS

NEW YORK, Jan. 31 (JTA) -- Acting upon the growing awareness of the rise of hate groups in the United States, such as the National Socialist White People's Party and the Ku Klux Klan, several Jewish and Black organizations have initiated the formation of a coalition to segve to unite minority groups on crucial issues of mutual concern, a spekesman for the coalition reported.

Several meetings were held to air the view points of these minority groups and lay the ground-work for future action, the spokesman said. The participating arganizations were the Peekskill Middle town (NY) branches of the NAACP, Westchester Coalition of Minority Organizations, Committee to Bring Nazi War Criminals to Justice in the United States, Jewish Identity Center, Interna-tional Committee Against Nazism, and the World Federation of African Peoples.

Representatives of these organizations, met several days ggo with Brody Tyson, foreign affairs officer for the U.S. Mission to the United Nations to urge the prompt ratification of the Genocide Con vention and to bring to the attention of Ambassador Andrew Young the importance of not allowing the West German statute of limitations on Nazi war crimes to expire, the spokesman said.

NEW YORK (JTA) -- Ilya Goldin, a leading refusnik from Minsk, has received an exit visa for Israel and expects to leave by Feb. 19, it was reported by the Student Struggle for Soviet Jewry. Goldin, a 29-year-old engineer, had been denied an exit visa since he first applied for one in 1972.

GENEVA (JTA) -- The NBQ-TV series "Holocaust," will be screened on the Swiss television in February. During the screening Swiss television will have two panels to discuss the film and The actual Holocaust. The list of participants has not yet been selected;

JERUSALEM (JTA) -- Premier Menachem Begin's advisor on Arab affairs, Dr. Moshe Sharon submitted his resignation to Begin Tuesday. He told reporters he would return at once to his teaching post at the Hebrew University. Sharon said he was resigning because he believed/the post was "obso-lere and redundant." The entire "Arab affairs ddvisor's department" at the Premier's office should be scrapped, he said. Anstead, he had recommended a new structure, in which a Cabinet Minister would be responsible for policy coordination in the Arabsector.
