KNESSET REJECTS TORTURE CHARGES

JERUSALEM, Feb. 14 (JIA) -- The Knesset today approved by massive majority a government statement repudiating charages of torture on the West Bafik published lost week in the Washington Post. A RECORD 72 PERCENT WATCH FIRST PART OF 'HOLOCAUST' ON FRENCH TY By Edwin Eymn

PARIS Feb. 14. (JIA) — A record 72 percent of the audience watched the first episade of the American NBC-TV series "Holocoust" on French, television lost night, According to the first available date, only 28 percent opted for the other two-French channels. The French news agency Agence France Presse reported in its domesti service that a large number of people reacted antagonistically to the film, saying "It is the start of a political campaign against West Europe an unification." CHTNA AND ZIONISM ANTACKED

NEW YORK; Feb. 14 (JTA) -- Pravda, the official oban of the Soviet Communist I has launched a blistering attack against the People's Republic of China for "flirting with Zionism" and for "teaming up with Israel on anti Sovietism." Vladimir Bolshakov, in a recent issue of Prayda, wrote that following the estab-lishment of diplomatic relations with the United States, China will take steps toward "normalization of relations with Israel.

The Prayda article, released internationally by the Soviet news agency, Tass, noted that commentaries on this issue were prompted by a nfeeting last November between China's Deputy Premier Keng Piao and Howard Squadron, presi dent of the American Jewish Congress, who was visiting Peking as part of an American delegation of civic offairs leaders

Squadron, who was the only Jewish member of the delegation, first described his conversation with Keng in an interview with Victor Riesel on radio station WEVD on Jan 5: Squadron said that Kena's comments to him indicated the possibility that China may be easing its stand of refusing to recognize Israel

Significant New Departure: PRESIDENTS CONFERENCE HOLDS ITS FIRST MEETING IN CALIFORNIA

LOS ANGELES, Feb. 14 (JTA) -- In what a spokesman called "a significant new departure in our work," the Confessace of Presidents of Mai American Jewish Organizations held its first mees? ing in California here recently at the invitation of the Los Angeles-Jewish Federation-Council. Theo dore Mann of Philadelphia, chairman of the Conference of Presidents, said the meeting was "a region step forward in our efforts to bring West Coast Jewish communities into our deliberations and our policy-making process.

The visit was undertaken; it was learned, In a "feeling of isolation Los Angeles Jewish leadership. An estimated 500, 000 Jews live in the Greater Los Angeles area, making it the largest American Jewish community outside New York.

However, of the 32 constituent members of. the Presidents Conference, only two are headed by Californians, contributing to the sense of distance from the policy-making center in New York, It is understood that the two Californians -- Maxwell E. Greenberg, chairman of the Anti-Defamation

He said that "the implementation of the government's anti-boycott principles and decisions had to proceed on the basis of a case-by-case examination."

He cited as examples "negative certificates" which offirm "that the merchandige is "ing produced in Israel or statements of feet that the Loandian company does not trade with Israel." SIR ISRAEL BRODIE DEAD AT 83 By Maurice Samuelson

LONDON, Feb. 14 (JTA) -- Sir Israel Brodie, former Chief Rabbi of Britain and the Commonwealth, was buried today at Willesden Jewish Cametery here, He died yesterday at the age of 83. The present Chief Rabbi, Dr. (mmanuel Jakobovits, interrupted a visit to the United States to deliver a eulogy at the grave side. The funeral was ottended by a large gathering of Jewish clergy, Jewish lay leaders, israel's Ambassador Ayraham Kidron and Israel's Consul General Gideon Yarden.

Until he retired in 1965; Brodie was Chief Rabbi of the United Hebrew Congregations of the British Commonwealth; He was elected to the post in 1948, two years after the death of his predecessor, Robbi Dr. J.H. Hertz. Brodie was the first Chief Robbi who did not die in office. Following Brodie's retirement he was given the title of Chief Rabbi Emeritus, In 1969 he was made a Knight Bachelor of the British Empire, He also remained president of the European Conference of Orthodox Rabbis, which he founded in 1958.

Brodie was the sixth Chief Robbi of Britain,

a post regognized by act of Parliament as the figurehead of Anglo-Jewry, embracing all shades of Ashkenazim and the older established Sephand communities. He was the second Chief Rabb to be born in England and the first to be educat

ed here as well.

He was born in Newcastle-Upon-Tyne, Eng land's major northeast port, on May 10, 1895, the second of five children of Aaron and Sheina Brodie, His father came from Koyno, Lithuania. in about 1890, and was descended from Zvi Hirsch Braude, the saintly and learned Rabbi of Salant. His maternal grandfather, too, was from Kovno, where he was a preacher at a synapoque Brodie's father was a humble peddler who rejoiced in study of the Torah and imbued a love of learning into his children:

In addition to attending the local Talmud Torah, Brodie had Hebrew lessons from a local rabbi and later studied under Rabbi Y.M. Sandelson, the Ray of Newcastle. Although he did less well in his secular studies, the young Brodie for a time considered entering the Indian Civil Service, in which a number of other English Jews had achieved distinction

Chose Path Of Jewish Studies

"However, he chose the path of Jewish stud-les and, in 1912 at the age of 17, was enrolled at Jews Callege; London, founded in the previous century to train Anglo-Jewish ministers. He immediately excelled in Hebrew and Semitics both at Jews College and at University College, London) where, in 1915, he graduated as Bachelor of Arts in Hebrew, Syride and Arabic

The following year he won a scholarship to Ballial College, at Oxford University, to read for a higher degree. But with Britain at war he was impatient to join the forces. In 1917, he was commissioned as the youngest Chaplain in the British army and served on the Western front

with distinction .

After demobilization in 1919, he returned to Oxford and became a Bachelor of Literature for his thesi's entitled "An Inquiry into the Sources of the Book of Anan, the Founder of Karaism. On returning to London, he combined studies at Jews Cottage with welfare work among the poor Jewish communities of the East End . There he met Fanny Levine who became his wife 23 years

-later and who survives him.

In 1923, after receiving his Jabbinical dip-Brodie accepted a call to the ministry of the Melbourne Hebrew Congregation, Australia, and became Ray Beth Din of the State of Victoria, He remained in Australia for more than 14 years during which he played an important part in the Jewish community's development throughout the country. was especially active in youth work and encouraged the creation of the Jewish Welfare Society to assist. the Jewish unemployed during the depression of the

Was A Dedicated Zionist

As a dedicated Zionist, affiliated with no single party, he became the first president of the Zionist Federation of Australia and New Zealand, with Gen. Sir-John Monash as honorary president. He also helped form the Women's Zionist Organization in Australia.

But increasingly he was homesick for England and in 1937 he returned to Oxford intending to work for a doctorate in Talmudic studies. He also became visiting lecturer in homitletics and a tutor at Jews College and did gett-defamation work on behalf of

the Board of Deputies of British Jews

Once again war interrupted his academic studies. In 1939, he rejoined the Army Chaplaincy Corps and in 1940, he was sent to France with the British Expeditionary Force and took part in the evacuation of Dunkirk. Later, he became senior Jew ish Chaplain to the Royal Air Force in the Middle East with the rank of Squadron Leader. In Cairo he was in spiritual charge of more than 10,000 Jewish troops, mostly from Palestine . They included a num ber of young airmen banned from becoming pilots by the government in London. Brodie intervened and the ban was removed.

His last years as Chief Rabbi Were overshod-Affair. " It centered on Rabbi Dr. Louis Jacobs, the gifted lecturer at Jews College, who had been expected to become the college principal after the retirement of Rabbi Dr. Isidore Epstein But Blodie and the Beth Din prevented this following criticism of some of Jacobs views on Jewish tradition. Jacobs shocked the Orthodox United Synagogue, Britain's largest lewish organization, by contending that the Torah contained human as well as divine elements. Subsequently, too, Brodie prevented don's New West End Synagogue.

WELZMAN INSTITUTE, HEBREW U. GET

NEW YORK, Feb. 14 (1)14) — Two grains, totaling \$1,500,000 to promote higher education and scientific research in Israel have been awarded to the Hebrew University of Jerusalem and the Weizmann Institute of Science of Rehovot by the Charles H. Revson Foundation of New York. Announcement of the award, which will be shared equally by the Israeli institutions, was made in a joint statement by Avraham Harman, president of Hebrew University, and Prof. Michael Sela, president of the Weizmann Institute.

Under terms of the four-year grant,-funds allocated to Hebrew University will be used to create

22 new Charles H. Revson-Fellowships for postdoctoral lecturers and to provide refured datulty.appointments for a small number of outstanding academicians. funds designated for Weizmann Institute will be used to establish seven new Career Development Chairs to provide follow-through support and research underwriting for select young scientists upon completion of their doctoral and postdoctoral studies.
