SECURITY COUNCIL MEETS ON SITUATION IN LEBANON
BY YITZHOK ROBI

UNITED NATIONS, May 31 (JTA) -- The Security Council met brody on a complaint by Lebaron alleging an escalation of Israeli attacks but adjourned this afternoon without reaching a conclusion. Council President Vasco Futscher Pereire announced that private consultation among members would continue. Sources here said an effort would be made to draft a consensus statement by next week.

Addressing the Council earlier, Israel's Ambassador Yehuda Blum said his country recently received information. "Based on reliable sources," that the Palestine Liberation Organization has accided to step up violence in south Leb-anon. This information, Blum said, "Is undoubtedly the cause of the heightened tension in the

area in the last few days."

Blum charged that the Council's meeting was called to satisfy the domestic needs of the Leb anese government "whose predicament is well He declared that Israel supports the national sovereignty and territorial integrity of Lebanon and "believes that the time has come to move towards a negotiated peace between Israel and Lebanon." He charged the terroris He charged the terrorist groups under the leadership of the PLO with res ponsibility for the chaos in southern Lebanon. There are some 2000 armed PLO terrorists south of the Litani River," Blum said, who constitute a threat to the citizens of Israel, to the villagers in south Lebanon and to the troops of the United Nations Interim Force in south Lebanor (UNIFIL). JUSTICE MINISTRY ASKS RELEASE OF AMERICAN WOMAN JAILED FOR AIDING-TERRORISTS By Yitzhak Shargij

ELL AVIV. May 31 (JTA) — The Justice Minstry today, recommended the early-release from prison of Terry, Fleener, 24, an American woman serving, a five-year sentence on Charges of spoting-for a Palestinian, tetrorists organization. It also recommended the release of Ludving Jannsen, 26, of Hokland, serving a lix-year termion similar charges. A Ministry pokesman said Fleener bould be freed by the end of June and Jannsen in September, both for "good conduct."

Ms. Fleener, who admitted to the charges be fore she was sentenced 15 months ago, has been the subject of representations by the U.S. government on the highest levels. On May 14, Secretary of State Cyrus Vance asked Justice Minister Shmuel Tamir to take action for her release; (In Washington yesterday, State Department spokesman Thomas Reston said the U.S. Embassy in Tel Aviv has been informed that Tamir-would recommend to President Yitzhak Navon that Fleener's sentence be reduced to 2 1/2 years. He quoted an Israeli Justice Ministry spokesman as saying that it could be further reduced by one-third for good behavior if the prison warden and a special appeals committee concurred. In that case, the former Kuwait Airlines stewardess who comes from Texas would be eligible for release on June 25 / Reston said.)

Megnwhile, two Arab women suspected of terminist attivity, were detained following the arrest. Sunday of another woman, Ator Ashraf, 22, of Ramaltah, Ashraf was seized after she planted a bomb in a trash can at the Jerusalem central bus terminal. Her interrogation led to the arrest of the others, A military spokesman said the three women belonged to a gang that carried out a series of terrorist acts which claimed at least four lives and injured 53 persons.

KLARSFELD PRODUCES EVIDENCE ELKANIAN WAS EXECUTED FOR TIES WITH ISRAEL By, Yitzhok Sharail.

TEL AVIV. May 3T (JTA) — French lawyer Serge Klarsfeld produced occumentary evidence here last night that trainian Jewish community, leader Habib Elkanian was executed May 9 primarily because of his connections with Israel. At a dramatic midnight press conference at Ben Gurian Airportt, Klarsfeld showed reporters what he said was a photocopy of the charge sheet prepared by the revolutionary court in Tahanan against Elkanian.

The charges began with the words: "Habib Elkanian, Jew. Teheran-born, spy, rich and Zionist." It went on to claim that Elkanian, a millionaire industrialist, was a spy in the service of Israel, extorted money from poor Iranians and gave it to a hostile country, Israel "which kills our Arab brethren."

Klarsfeld, who with his wife-Beate, has been instrumental in tracking down wanted Nazi Way criminals and combatting arti-Semitism, visited Teheran last week to investigate the Elkanian execution and intercede for several Jews still imprisoned by the new regime, He reported earlier that he had been assured by fran's Foreign Minister Ibrahim Nazil, that "there was no reason for warry in the case of Jews or non-Jews simply because they had connections with Israel. Klarsfeld refurned to Paris yesterday and flew immediately to Israel.

POPE RESPONDS WARMLY TO WARSAW GHETTO MEMORIAL SERVICE

It steted that "In the April 22 commemoration of the uprising of his lewish fellow countrymen, the Holy Father sees a reminder of the need to safeguard at all times the objective and inviolable rights of every human being." The letter observed that "Man is made in the image and after the likeness of God. As such, he is superior to systems and ideologies. The repeated attempts to subordinate him to what is lower than him and the curtailment of the rights of any individual or group of human beings must be countered by vigilance and self-portaine. U.S. MAY SUPPLY EGYPT WITH F-4, PHANTOM JETS. By Joseph Polakoff

WASHINGTON, May 31 (JTA) — The Pentagon appeared to confirm today that Egypt is likely to receive a dozen F-4 Phantom jet warplanes by October even if they are to be drawn from the stocks of U.S. active forces, if not from reserverstocks.

INDUSTRIALISTS REVOLT AGAINST CABINET DECISION TO END LOW COST LOANS By Yitzhak Sharail

TEL AVIV. May 31 (JTA) — Three of lirael's largest firms — Koor Industries, Klal Industries and the Discount Investment Co. — announced today that they will freeze all plans for investments in developing Israel's industries. The firms handle the bulk of Israel's industries and the industries from with an annual turbover in the biblions of Pounds.

The impact of the decision was heightened when Mark Moshevitz, head of the Economic Advisory. Committee to the government and former president of the Manufacturers Association, announced his resignation.

These moves followed on the heels of a Cabinet decision this week to link 100 percent of development loans to industries to the cost-of-living index which would eliminate cheap loans fol monufacturers. The Cabinet's action-was vehemently protested by the Manufacturers Association, whose president, Abraham Shavit, tried popersuade Premier Menachembegin to have it rescribed. But the government seemed to panic over the industrialists' revolt. Finance Minister Simche Efficied wrote to Moshevitz urging him to reconsider his resignation. BRAZIL RECOGNIZES PLO BUT BANS PLO OFFICE FOR TIME BEING By David Markus

RIO DE JANEIRO, May 31 (JTA) — The Brazilian government has officially recognized the Polestine Liberation Organization at the "sole legitimate representative of the Polestinian propile" but for the time being, at least, it has resided to outhorize the PLO to lopen an office in Brasilia, the capital. Recognition was announced in a joint communique released at the end of a five day with the Brazil by the Vice President of Iraq. Take Muhyidinne Macrouf. The commonique also stated that Brazil recognizes "the rights of the Polestinians to self-determination, independence and national sovereignty in their homeland."

NEW YORK, May 31 (JTA).— A major effort is underway throughout the United States to turn more than half-a-million-holders of 1967. The AlCongress brief was prepared by Stern and Nathan Z. Dershowitz, director of the agency's commission on law and social action.

The brief declared that religious haliday observance in the public schools violated the first amendment's church-state separation guarantee, as well as burting Jerkish children in such schools. The case, "Florey vs. Sioux Falls School. District," deals with guideljines adopted by the Sioux Falls, S.D. school board for the public schools under its jurisdiction. Sioux Falls is within the Eighth-Federal Court District.

Six Other Jewish Groups File Briefs

A joint friend of the court brief also has been filed with the St. Louis appeals court by the National Jewish Commission on Law and Public Affairs (COLPA) and the Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith, Martin Cowan, COLPA secretary and Richard Weiss of the ADL wrote the brief. It pointed out that the Sloux Falls school board rules provide not only for Christmas and Easter. pageants in the public schools but for the display of religious symbols, such as the cross and nativity creches in the classmons. Others joining in the brief are Agudath Israel of America, National Council of Young Israel, the Rabbinical Council of America and the Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregations of America, according to COLPA and the ADL.

Howard Zuckerman, COLPA president, said that unless the lower court decision is reversed; school districts throughout the pation will be-lieve themselves free to engage in religious activities resulting in exposure of Jewish, children to Christian doctrine.

The guidelines were challenged in 1978 by a group of students, parents and taxpayers, who sought to enjoin their promulgation on grounds they were in conflict with the first amendment. The local idstrict court upheld the school board and the case was appealed to the Circuit Court of Appeals. The brief argued that the guidelines were unconstitutional because, first, they have a religious purpose; second, they have the direct effect of advancing religion, and third, they excessively entangle the government in religion.

Stern said this is the three-part test used by the Supreme Court inssuch cases.

Observance Distressing To Children

The brief declared that "the long-standing concern of the Jewish community with religious holiday observances in the public schools is prompted not only by its commitment to religious-freedom but. also by purely partial practical considerations. The experience of Jewish children in public schools hav ing Christological holiday celebrations has brought about virtual unanimity in the Jewish community in opposition to these sectarian practices." Asserting that "Christological holiday celebrations in public sthootprare-deeply distressing to children who are to brought up as Christian, "The AJC orgress brief also declared that "religious celebrations of this type introduce tension and divisiveness into public schools and often harass and hurt children of minority faiths. Such children face a conflict between the religious teaching they receive at home and the quite different teaching conveyed by the religious practices in their schools.

The brief declared that "Jewish parknis — as well as non-believers and adherents of son-Christian-sects — are often mode resentful and apprehensive because their children are forced either to participate in Christological observances; or, what is equally—hurtful and unjust, to isolate themselves by abstaining from participation." The brief said that "when subjected by pressure an them to conform, Jewish children may find it easier to submit than to resist. The Jewish child, or his parent in his behalf, is left with the cruel chaice of participating in religious observances contrary to his belief or of standing exposed as add and on-conformist."

Asserting that majority religions suffer as well when their beliefs are "watered down" to make them acceptable for use in public schools, the brief asserted that "it should be emphasized that this case extends beyond the question of Christmas observance. Periociples enunciated by this cooff in this case will apply equally to religious holldays of all faiths. We recognize that Chanukah and Passover have no greater egittlement to observance in the public schools than Christmas or Easter."
