## ISRAEL NAVY SINKS BOAT CARRYING TERRORISTS ON WAY TO COASTAL TOWN By Yitzhak Shargil

TEL AVIV: June 4 (JTA) --- An Israel Navy patrol boat intercepted and sagk a motorboat manned by terrorists with Katyusha rockets in an encounter off the Lebanese coast just north of Ras Haniqra shortly after midnight last night. it was announced today. Several bodies seen floating on the sea near the Israeli shareline this morning are believed to be the remains of the terrorists.

A military spokesman said the terrorists appar atly planned a hit-and-nin rocket attack on an Israeli coastal town or city in the Nahariya area depending upon the speed of their craft to make a swift approach and get-away. The limited cruising range of the boat indicated that they departed on their mission from a point close to the Israeli border with Lebanon. Terrorists attempted a similar attack on Eilat last year, using a small cargo vessel laden with high explosives and armed with Katyusha rockets. That too

was foiled by the Israeli Navy.

Naval experts said today that last night's action probably averted a major catastrophe. But they warmed that this does not guarantee that the Navy will always succeed in spotting and destroying terrorist boats. In another naval re-lated matter, the three landing craft that made the historic first passage through the Suez-Canal by units of the Israel Navy last week, sailed from their base this morning, headed again for the Egyptian waterway. They are bound for Sharm el-Sheikh af the southern tip of the Sinai peninsula where they will begin the evacuation of military vehicles and other equipment.

DORA BLOCH'S REMAINS TO BE BURIED By Gil Sedan and Yitzhak Shargil

JERUSALEM June 4 (JTA) - The remains of Dora Bloch will be laid to rest here tomorrow nearly three years after she was murdered at Kampala, Uganda on the orders of former President Idi Amin: Mrs. Bloch, who held Israeli and British citizenship, was a passenger on the Air France jet hijacked by Palestinian terrorists to Entebbe in June, 1976. When most of the hostages were rescued by an Israeli raiding party on July 3, she was in a Kampaja hospital from where she disappeared a day later.

"Her remains were discovered buried at a village near Kampala. With the cooperation of the new Uganda authorities, they were exhumed and flown to Israel where positive identification was made, by Dr. Maurice Rogov, a pathologist who obtained the deceased's X-rays and medical-

records.

Mrs. Bloch's sons, Bertram and Daniel, were relentless in their efforts over the years to verify their mother's death and place of burial. The were convinced she had been murdered by Amin secret police in an act of revenge against the successful Israeli rescue operation. Amin persisted in denying any knowledge of her fate.

Bertram Bloch accompanied his mother's cof-

fin on an El Al flight from Nairobi, Kenya, to Israel yesterday. She will be given a state

funeral tomorrow.

U.S. REGRETS SETTLEMENT DECISION
DEPLORES ASSASSINATION IN GAZA

WASHINGTON, June 4 (JTA) -- The United States said today that it "deeply regrets" Israel's decision to build another settlement near the Arab town of Nablus on the West Bank and that it considered "absolutely reprehensible" the Palestine Liberation Organization's acknowledged assassination of a Mostem religious leader in Gaza for supporting the Israeli-Egyptian peace treaty. But in neither case, however, did the Carter Administration indicate any moves to after its relationship with Israel or its policy toward the PIO

State Department spokesman Hodding Carter discussed both matters at his press briefing today. He said "the point most disturbing" about the Israeli Cat inet's decision yesterday is that the "establishment of new settlements is harmful to the peace process" and "it is particularly regrettable at this time with negotiations just beginning" among the U.S., Egypt and Israel "to establish a new relationship" for the West

Bank and Gaza Strip.

"We feel it is detrimental and pre-judging the outcome of the negotiations, Carter said: "The point we are trying to stress is that we are getting down to negotiating this real estate" and the settle ment "is bound to have a negative effect on the participants." Later he withdrew the term "real estate" and acknowledged that "obviousty we consider this an extraordinarily sensitive issue.

Carter said, however, that the U.S. would not take any steps to prevent further settlements in the future, observing rhetorically, other than diplo-matic steps between friends -- no. He said he was not aware of any pledge by Israel not to establish forther settlements. He replied "yes" when asked if

ked if privately owned land was being exprop rigted for the settlement near Nablus, Carter said "We don't know what the land is. If any private land is involved we would deeply regret that aspect of it. Taking private property is distressing.

Concerning the murder Friday night of Sheikh Hashem Al-Huzander, the Imam (religious leader) of Gaza, Carter said he was "incapable of making an accurate assessment of the effect of the assassina+ tion. "But it can't be anything but harmful," he opted. "We obviously condemn it in the strongest postible terms, Since the PFLP (Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine) seem eager to take credit, we include them in the condemnation, " Carter said.

Asked by the Jewish Telegraphic Agency what position the U.S. would take against the PLO if it seeks political control by assassination, Carter replied that assassination "is not acceptable." But he would not indicate any action that would alter the U.S. position toward the PLO of which the PFLP is an integral part.

BEGIN DEFENDS SETTLEMENT POLICY DECLARES TOTAL WAR ON PLC By Barbie Zelizer

JERUSALEM, June 4 (JTA) - Premier Menachem Begin delivered one of his toughest speeches at the opening of the Herut party's 14th national convention here last night, fervently defending Jewish settle-ment on the occupied West Bank as a "right" and

"duty," declaring total war against the Palestine Liberation Organization and warning President Amour Sodat of Egypt to refrain from critisizing lewish settlements or talking about the division of Jerusalem.

Begin't hard-line went well with his audience of 3000 Herut loyalists who cheered and stamped in the Jerusalem Convention Hall. "Settlement is a right and a duty. We have and will continue to fulfill that right and that duty," the Premier declared. He fiercely ruted out any notion of a Palestinian state or divided sovereignty over

Jenualem.

Referring to warnings that I srael's aggressive settlement policies undermine. Sodat at a time when he is being attacked by the Arab rejectionist states, Begin asserted, "We do not need anyone to preach to us about the delicate position of President Sodat vis-a-wis the Arab world. CAIRO, June 4 (JTA) — Foreign Minister
Moshe Dayan received a tumultuous welcome
here today from shoppers and store owners at the

The retire area of the Pyramids and the Sphinx, which usually homs with tourist traffic was cleared for Dayan's visit in mid-offernoon and a series stillness pervaded the otherwise raucous site.

#### DAYAN'S GOAL: OPEN BORDERS By David Landau

CAIRO, June 4 (JTA) -- Foreign Minister Moste Dayan said here today that he fully intends to have people moving across the borders between Israel and Egypt in both directions soon Precisely how soon and how many people are among the myriad details under discussion here between Dayan and his Egyptian counterpart.

Egyptian President Anwar Sadat arranged what Dayan called "a pleasant surprise" by inviting the Foreign Minister to come and see him as soon as he touched down at Cairo Airport this morning. Dayan and his aides were whisked off by helicopter to the President's residence at Ismail ia. After the meeting, Dayan told Israeli newsmen that Sadat "stands firm" on the pledges of accelerated normalization that he gave to Premier Menachem Begin last week in El Arish. During their conversation, said Dayan, Sadat repeat edly pointed an authoritative finger at Ghali instructing him to implement the various issues touched upon Dayan seemed pleased with the meeting, terming Sadat's attitude "entirely positive, not only in respect of the treaty provisions but also as regards speeding-up the pace of the normalization process.

Also present at the meeting were, an the Egyptian side, Vice President Hosni-Mobarak, and, flanking Dayan, his Dreeter Geleral Yosef Ciechanover and his legal aide Meir Rosenne. This evening Dayan and his team began the down to earth business of negotiating the normalization together with Ghali and Egyptian officials at the ornate, Foreign Ministry building here. There will probably be a further session Wednesday morning before Dayan leaves for home. Dayan will spend, them tour touring Luxar, in upper Egypt. But It Is

already clear that more negotiating will be required, on a lower level; before the tangible effects of the "open borders" begin to be applied.

Civil aviation experts from both countries will have to delineate together the precise details of the proposed air corridor between Cairo and Tel Aviv before commercial airliners can fly the route. Israelis sources dee hoping, though, that the rough path of this corridor can be agreed upon during the present round of talks. These sources said that both TWA, the U.S. carrier, and the Dutch airline KLM have shown an interest in flying the Tel Aviv-Cairo route. The air corridor is not likely to connect the two cities in a straight line over the Negev. Planes will be required to fly out to sea before swinging back over the Egyptian coast.

Both Sadat and Dayan at the time seemed attracted to the idea of a partial Israeli pullback from the Suez Canal as a step towards peace. But Sadat's terms were an israeli commitment to a timetable for ultimate total withdrawal and the Golda Meir government rejected this out of hand. Some observers felt, and some still feel, that Israel should have explored that "first Sadat initiative" more probingly. Dayan himself refused to say what measure agreement he and Sadat had achieved in their study of what might have been. Dayan said he and Sadat steered clear of such thorny subjects as West Bank settlements, the autonomy talks and Palestinian aspir-ations. He said Sadat spoke at length of Egypt's difficulties in the Arab world but seemed to draw comfort and encouragement from the fact that his own people were so determinedly supportive of his policy. Sadat noted that the Arab hardliners were riven with feuds.

The West German Ambassador to the United States, Report you Staden, in overenting the check to mem-

The West German Ambassasor to the United States Berndt von Staden, in presenting the check to members of the synagogue, spake about the excellent relations between the Bonn government and Isroel and noted that a government spansared Jewish theological seminary will open in Heidelberg at the end of this year.

Commenting on the significance of the German gift to the synapogue, the Ambassador said, "We are every bit as indebted to the Jews as to all our intellectual forefathers. We ought to be aware of the expulsion of the Jews and that the murder of innumerable Jewish citizens robbed our action of creative minds who to this day have not been replaced and who remain irreplaceable.

Von Staden also paid tribute to the Jate Roy.

Von Staden also paid tribute to the late Ray. Blumenthal, the brother of a synagogue member, and long-time public relations consultant to West Germany Blumenthal was instrumental in arranging the historic meeting between Chancellor Konrad Adenquer and Premier David Ben Gurion which decided the question of German reparations to Israel after World War II.

#### DEVICE PERMITS SHABBAT DRIVING

JERUSALEM, June 4 (JTA) -- Orthodox engineers at the Institute for Science and Torah in Gush Extrant claim to have invented devices that will allow observant Jews to drive vehicles in entergencies on the Sabbath withour violating tolatchic injunctions. Rabbi Yisrael Rosen, one of the inventors, said in an-Amy Radio interview that the new devices have rabbinical approval.

Religious law permits riding on the Sabbath in cases of dire emergency by physicians or security men. But it does not permit them to turn their motorsand headlights on or off because those actions are not included under the dispensation. This posed a severe problem for the strictly observant who had to leave their motors running and lights on until the Sabbath ended. The new devices, according to the rabbi, allow the religious driver to press a button which is not linked to any electric circuit but causes the automatic switch-off of engine and lights. A similar device allows a pious driver to start his vehicle on the Sabbath without touching the ignition. If furned on before the Sabbath, it feeds a small amount of fuel to the engine. The driver only has to steer and does not have to use the clutch pedal in vehicles with conventional transmissions. Another electronic device operates windshield wipers without the intervention of the driver. \* \* \*
