U.S. IS DISAPPOINTED AT FRENCH REFUSAL TO SUPPORT EGYPTIAN-ISRAELI PEACE TREATY

WASHINGTON, June 6 (JTA) — The White House said today that tit was "somewhat disappointed" that France has failed to support the Irraeli-Egyptian peace treaty, following French Foreign Minister Jean-Francois Poncet's talks with President Carter and Secretary of State Cyrus Vance this week.

CLARK SAYS HE WILL KEEP CAMPAIGN RLEDGE TO MOVE CANADIAN EMBASSY By Michael Solomon

\*\*OTTAWA, June 6 (JTA) — Prime Minister Joe Clark sold yesterday, at his first press conference, that he/is fully determined to follow through with his campaign promise to move Canada's Embassy from Tel Aviv to Jerusalem despite the opposition from the United States and Arabicountries.

"I camot give you a time flame at the moment. We certainly intend to do that. From now on this is the policy of the Canadian government," he declared. As for any reservations the senior officers of the Midistry of External Affairs might have, Clark rejected them by saying: "I expect their collaboration by showing me the way how to implement technically a political engagement." The Prime Minister made it clear that "the signature of the Egyptian-Israelli peace treaty created flavorable conditions for fifte transfer of the Canadian Embassy to Jerusalem. Fahmy retierated that in the question of Jerusalem, the Egyptian government is in solidarity with all other Arab countries.

It is expected that in the coming weeks, the Canadian government will be subjected to know pressure from the Arab countries as half of the oil consumed ineastern Canada comes from the Mideast Arab pountries. WEIZMAN BLAMES U.S. FOR PROBLEMS IN NEGOTIATIONS By Yitzhok Shargil

JEWISH A GENCY ASSEMBLY A GENDA TO STRESS INCREASED IMMIGRATION By Gil-Sedon

JERUSALEM, June 6 (JJA) — Various proposals aimed at Increasing immigration to Israel, especially by Jewi-leaving the Soviet Utalon, are high an the agenda of the Jewish Agency Assembly which will convene here June 24-30 with the participation of Jewish headers from Israel and abroad. Must of the measures were discussed at the recent meeting in Rome of the Presidium of the Brussels Conference on Soviet Jewry, chapted by Leon Dulzin, chairman of the World Zionist Organization and Jewish Agency Executives.

The Rome meeting called on the Israelli government and Jewish Agency to give top priority to solving the housing shortage. The lack of adequate housing to prospective immigrants was seen as a major factor Limiting immigration. The government and Jewish Agency were also urged to streamline the absorption process for Soviet and other immigrants by creating a single central authority that would deal with all aspects of the process. The Presidium thereby endorsed the recommendations of the Horey committee, submitted two years ago, which called for combining the functions of the Absorption Ministry and the Jewish Agency's Immigration Department. The Agency has been pressing for this measure which varieties are the submitted than the Absorption Ministry.

At the meeting in Rome and on his return to Istrael, Dulzin's greatest concern was with the high rate of drop-outs among Sovier Lews who choose to settle in countries other than Israel after leaving the USSR. He said the government and Jewish Agency must take measures in conjunction with overseas Jewish leaders and organizations to curtail these defections. The expressed hope that such measures would be adopted by the Jewish Agency Assembly.

## AMERICAN HELD IN ISRAEL

JERUSALEM, June 6 (JTA) -- A Jerusalem Mag istrate today ordered the extended detention of a 32-year-old American citizen, Iliya HaZeev, as the suspected leader of a gang of Jewish vandals who broke into Arab homes in Hebron, beat up the occupants and smashed their furniture two weeks ago. HaZeev, reportedly a wounded Vietnam war veteran, has a record of arrest in the U.S. on suspicion of conspiring to murder a Palestine Liberation Organi zation representative there. He was married to an Israeli woman who divorced him six months ago. He and six others arrested in connection with the assault are members of Rabbi Meir Kahane's "Kath". faction. The police are also holding Avigdor Erskin, 18, an immigrant from the Soviet Union and are searching for another man believed involved in the Hebron incident. The remaining five suspects have been detained for resisting a police search of their homes in the Orthodox township of Kiryat Arba near Hebron.

## SYMBOLISM SEEN AS DAYAN TOURS EGYPTIAN SITES By Dayid Landau

CAIRO, June 6 (JTA) — Yesterday Attne 5, was the 12th anniversary of the Six-Day Way. In early morning; a strem waited in the streets of Cairo. There were widespread reports this week that parcel bombs had been discovered in New Jersey. Illinois, Nebraska and Virginia. One of the news agencies receiving a call affirming the mailings was the JIA. The caller said the JCAN was responsible for the mailings and planned to deryore of them. He refused to give his name.

## U.S. FIRMS END SWASTIKAS ON MODELS

NEW YORK, June 6 (JTA) -- Two more U.S. toy manufacturers have agreed to knop producing model tanks, planes, ships and other military objects with Nazi markings, with the result that all U.S. production of swartike bearing toys had now ceased, the American lewish Congress reported Indox.

Aulius Schotz, director of the organization's Commission on Jewish Life and Culture, said the action by Revell, Inc. of Venice; Cal. and Lindberg Products of Skokie, III. had brought to a successful conclusion a national campaign launched by the American Jewish Congress 18 months ago to put an end to the production of toys carrying Nazi symbols.

Last week, the nation's largest toy manufacturer, Mattel Inc. of Hawthorne, Cal., announced it, would no longer provide the swastika insignia "in any of its domestic or international markets."
