AUTONOMY TALKS ROUND ENDS By David Landay and Yitzhak Shargil

JERUSALEM, June 20 (JTA) — Israeli and Egyptian officials trying to haamer out an agenda for the next round of autonomy talks ended two days of discussion at Herrillya this ofternoon with no sign, that any substantial bridgess was made. DAYAN TOTALLY REJECTS EEC'S CRITICISM OF ISRAELI POLICY By David Landau

JERUSALEM, June 20 (JTA) — Israel has "orally rejected" this week's Mideast statement by the nine European Economic Community (EEC) foreign ministers. A letter sent today by foreign Minister Moshe Dayan to his European calleagues, which Dayan read out from the Knessel podium, termed the EEC statement "ministers to the entire process of negotiations." The EEC ministers, in their statement, criticized "certain positions and actions" of the Israeli government as detrimental to the peace process and specifically criticized 'sraeli settlements in the administered areas as Illeads.

Dayan's reply, which was handed to the ELL ambassadors at the Foreign Ministry this marining, said "The position taken by the EEC car only discourage the negatiations between the parties on all the various issues involved in autonomy and the future of Judeau, Samaria and the Gaza district. Speaker Yisrael Yeshayahu, a leader of the Yemenite Jewish community ionstreel, died today after a
long illness. He was 59. His body will lie in state
at the Knesset tomorrow before burial later in the day.

against his advancement because he was a Yemenite.

of Posts.

In 1971, he was elected secretary general of the Libbar Party and in 1972 he became Speaker, a post he held until 1979. He was not selected for the Labor Party 1979 election list. During his lifetime, he published numerous ar

ticles on the history and folklore of Yemenite Jews and on problems of absorption into Israeli society.

LAMM ATTACKS FRAGMENTIZATION AMONG ORTHODOX JEWS IN U.S.

FALLSBURG, N.Y., June 20 (JTA) — Dr. Naman Lamin, president of Yeshiva University; decired last night the "Intolerant fragmentization, which endangers the continued vitality and creativity of the Orthodox Jewish community, in the United States."

Lamm made his comments in an address to 400 delegates at the annual convention of the Rabbinical Council of America here. He said "a monistic approach within Orthodoxy which imposes a homogenized somenes in thought and practice is both religiously inputhentic and socially destructive. It has the virtue of consistency but it lacks a communal conscience. Unity is confused with unitermity and a divisive inholerance is remport within our ranks."

"Diversity within the discipline of Jewish law,"

Lamm explained, "is a reflection of the dynamics of our faith, the sages of the Talmud offered varying opinions but a harmonious unity emerged to guide. Jewish practice. In philosophic Maught a variety of systems coexisted, such reflecting one of the 70 faces of the Torah, A mutual respect of each other's singularity in interpretation and style generally prevailed."

Lamm also seld "one can even respect the dissenting views of the Samar Hasidim in their antiZionism but one must uterly reject their going public
