MODAI DEMANDS SPEED UP OF ENERGY SAVINGS PLAN By Gif Stedon

FRUSALEM, July 12 (JTA). Series Of Proposals Rejected

The committee similarly turned down a proposal to require each motorist not, to use his cerone day a week. "A proposal which would allow residents of coadominiums to detach, themselves from the central heating system in order to purchase solar heating units was dropped after tigtries. Minister. Shawel Tamir explained that Twas difficult to carry this change out because of the legal status of condominiums. A proposal to introduce daylight saxings time was dropped at the objection of the religious ministers who claimed that it would inconvenience worshippers, especially during the Hish Holidays.

The only measure in sight at present is a substantial rise in the price of fuel. It is expected that by the end of the week, prices will rise by 25-30 percent. The Energy Ministry claims that given the recent hikes in world bill prices and the continuing devaluation of the Pound, the real increase in oil prices here should be 55-60 percent.

Five months ago, Modal, presented to the Cabinet an II-point plan to conserve energy. The plan called for a savings of sight percent in the consumption of energy, later modified to five percent savel planned to spend about \$11 bill flow on all this year. A five percent savings would amount to about \$55 million. But with the recent Organization of Petroleum Exporting. Countries price hike, the expenditure for all is estimated at \$1.5 billion, neutralizing the planned savings.

In a speech to the Knesset last week, Modal said hardly a day, passed that Israel did not re-zeive "almost ultimative" notices on cuts in oil sales or an price hikes even in deals already signed. Israel consumes eight million fons of oil annually. About 20 percent of it will come from the Singl oil fields which will be returned to Egypt at the end of November.

Says Sadat's Promise Of Oil Was Vague

Premier Menachem Begin said last week, on his return from Alexandria, that President Anwar Sadar had promised him to sell Israel oil from the Sinai, fields at "market price."

But Modal told the Knesset committee that the promise was "only a vague and generalized and commitments" and therefore was not eneigh. He warned that after the Atmo oil fields in Sinai are handed back to Egypt, '98 percent of the country's fuel will be cominal from foreign sources.

With the cut-off of oil supplies from Iran, Israel has increased her purchases from Mexico which now covers a great part of its energy needs. But a third of Israel's fuel comes from—"changing and temporary" sources, which may be closed any day. Modal also complained that the country was short of fuel storage capacity. He said no progress was being made on the proposal for a nuclear electric power station.

Committee chairman Moshe Arens called for an immediate decision to be ild the first nuclear power station. Israel possesses all the manpower and the technologies required, he said.

ISRAELI SPORTS CIRCLES CONCERNED ABOUT 1980 MOSCOW OLYMPIC GAMES By Yitzhak Shargil

TEL AVIV, July 17 (JTA) — Concern has grown, in israel i sports circles that the Soviet Union may, resort to the denial of entry-visos or other administrative measures to prevent Israel from participating in the Olympic Games in Moscow next summer despite its promise that every nation will be welcome to compete. The possibility of such action by the Soviet authorities seemed likely after Alex Giladi, a senior israel i television official, received word last night that his application for a visa to enter the USSR was rejected.

Giladi, who had covered the Olympic Games in Munich and Montreal for Israel I television, is slated to head the Israel: I TV crew at the 1980 Games in the Soviet capital. He was scheduled to go to Moscow next Sunday along with 39 sentor officials of the European Broadcasting Union (EBU) to cover the "Spartakiada," a general rehearsal for the Olympic Games. Of all the applicants; he apparently was the only one dented a visa.

Doubts about Soviet intentions toward the Israeli Olympic feath were increased by the discriminatory treatment given 40 travels positived scientists who had asked to attend the international Congress of Political Science which opens in Moscow on Aug. 12.

ASPEN INSTITUTE PRESSURED TO WITHDRAW INVITE TO ISRAELI PROF. By Judith Rosen

NEW YORK, July 17 (JTA) — The American Jewish Committee sold today that it backed the board of trustees of the Aspen Institute for Humanistic Studies in their dispute with the East-West Foundation over the latter's alleged injection of anti-largel bias into the fonding of the Aspen's. Middle fast studies program.

The Aspen board has charged specifically that Christopher Beim, president of the non-profit rax-exempt East-West Foundation, threatened to terminate an annual \$600,000 grant to Aspen unless it withdrew its invitation to an Israeli academician to participate in a seminar on "The Areb World in Transition."

Irg Silverman, director of Special Programs of the AJCommittee, told the Jewish Telegraphic Agency today that the foundation's action was a another example of deplorable attempts by the Arabs and their representatives in the business world here to subvert academic institutions for their political purposes."

their political purposes."

He said the A /Committee has "full confidence in the integrity of the Aspen Institute with the long tradition of intellectual integrations with Israelis, among other scholars, which will continue. Silverman said the "A /Committee has been in-volved in regular contact with Colin Williams, and we throw him to be committed to fair practice."

According to reports here, Aspen invited a Hebrew University professor of Arabic literature. Menachem Milaon, to participate in the seguinar bot withdrew the invitation after being informed by the State Department that Milaon, a reserve officer in the Israeli army, had served as an aide to the Military Covernor of accupted territories in 1977. No other Israeli was subsequently invited Joseph E. Stater, president of Aspen, denied that this was due to pressure from Beim but other sources said Beim had profested to Aspen against inviting any Israeli.

Aspen Rejects Interference

The alleged threat by Betin to withdraw his foundation's grant to Aspen was said to have been in response to a resolution drawn up by the Aspen board of thustees objecting to interference by the foundation in its Middle East programs. The resolution offirmed that Aspen would have "absolute control" over the choice of participants.

The agencies work in close cooperation with the Swiss government.

Weill said much credit for the success of the

Weill said much credit for the success of the program could be attributed to the use of intensive training given the refugees in the languages and customs of Switzerland, a program modeled on Ismel's upparism used in the acculturation of immigants from many countries.

A conference on the refugees, called by United Nations Secretary Genetal Kurt Waldheim, will convene here July 20-21. The UN-has invited 72 courtries and 12 foreign ministers have indicated they would participate. Issue will be represented by its Minister of Absorption, David Levy, and the U.S. by either Vice President Walter Mondale or Secretary of State Cyrus Aunce.

Meanwhile in Brussels, the Jewish Community Cenner (JCC) has agreed to take in three refugues, families as a first step to aid the Belgian government's plan to admif 10,000. The JCC said its action was in memory of Jewish refugees seeking haven from the Nazis 40 years ago. "These tens of thousands of people are being expelled-like we were at the time," a spokesman for the Brussels community said. The JCC called on Belgian Jewish families to follow its example and adopt groups of refugees/from Indochina.

JÁKOBOVITS WARNS AGAINST BREEDING "HOLOCAUST MENTALITY"

GENEVA; July 17 (JfA) -- A sharp critique of present Jewish priorities and concerns was expressed by Dr. Immanuel Jakobovits, Chief Rabbi of the British Commonwealth, who warned against "breeding a Holocaust mentality" and emphasizing the survival of Jews over the survival of Judaism. Jakoboxits spoke on "a cultural prospectus for the "80s" at the annual meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Memorial Foundation for Jewish Culture held here earlier this month. He urged the Foundation to undertake a alobal and historic review of its tasks.

He said it should see the Holocaust, for example, not as a reason for perpetual despair but as a good to affirmative Jewish living in order to assure the survival of Judaism. He said he regret-ted that Zionism had set itself too limited a goal. The creation of a Jewish State to secure the survival of Jews is not enough; Israel must aspire to become a state exemptifying the survival of Judaism through the realization of the noblest Jewish virtues in the prophetic tradition, the

British Chief Rabbi said.

Would it not be a catastrophic perversion of the Jewish spirit if broading over the Holocaust were to become a substantial element in the Jew-ish purpose and if the anxiety to prevent another Holocaust were to be relied upon as an essential, insentive to Jewish activity?" he asked. "The slogan' Never Again, 'now so popular, is a poor substitute for purposeful Jewish living as a potent driving force to promote Jewish vitality:"
Continuing, Jakobovits said: "We exist not in order to prevent our own destruction; but to ad-

vance our special assignment, embodying the age less values which are our national raison d'etre. We must shift the current emphasis on the survival of Jews to the survival of Judaism. For without Judaism, Jewish survival is both questionable and meaningless.

He observed, in that connection, that "Instead of making and holding up Israel as the only country in the world where one can live a fully Jewish life, our propaganda -- whether for fundraising or aliya -- has projected it not as a sanc thary, attracting Jews by its holiness, but primar-ity as an asylum for the homeless, a haven of security for Jews in danger. And once it can no longer offer this security, the attraction is vitiated and the supporters are liable to be disenchanted. " Jakobovits said.

Situation Of Soviet Jews

He clied the struction of Soviet Jews as an example, recalling that on his return from a visitto the USSR several years ago he was a target of a abuse for advocating adding "Let my people live" to the slogan "Let my people go," convinced that if we did not work hard at the regeneration of some Jewish life inside Russia and among the emigrants as soon as they left Russia, the wells of Sovier ally a would dry up for lack of Jewish idealism.

Jakobovits noted that "Now, with 70 percent of more of Russian emigrants opting for settlement in other countries because they were not induced bringing them out if, as a result, they will be even less conscious of being Jews than they were before?" he asked.

Jakobovits said that Zionism has failed to realize one of its primary goals. "By creating a motional bastion of levish life, the Zionist idea was to fortify the ramparts of Jewish pride and belonging against the tide of drift and defection Nothing like this has happened," the Chief Rabbi observed. "We now sustain more casualties by assimilation and intermarriage in the free world than through persecution, war or terror in the whole world.

HAIFA PREPARING FOR SADAT'S VISIT By Yitzhak Sharail

TELAVIV, July 17 (JTA) -- Haifa, "the forgot-ten jewel of Israel" as its Mayor Arieh Gurel describes it, is sprucing up for President Anwar Sadat's visit next month aboard his yacht. The visit has brought to 11e of project begun 25 years 1990 — the construction of a modern possenger reminal in the port area -- which observers say would have taken another 25 years to complete were it not for the impending arrival of the Egyptian leader.

Now, workers are swarming over the partly built structure in a crash effort to get it ready in time for Sadat. Haifa, which many people consider the scenically most beautiful city in Israel 2- it has been, compared to Naples and Rio -- is Israel's laraest seaport. But as travel by sea declined and most tourists arrive and depart from Ben Gurion Airport, the city on the slopes of Mt, Carmel, overlooking a crescent-shaped bay, tended to be bypassed by

visitors.

There are relatively few hotels, except on the high ridge of the Carmel where Israeli and foreign right right of the season and the Mt. Camel hotels, already heavily booked, will have to find rooms for representatives of the world news media as well as hundreds of local journalists. SPECIAL INTERVIEW THREAT OF PETRODIPLOMACY By David Friedman

NEW YORK, July 17 (JTA) — Nathan Perlmutter; the national director of the Anti-Derfomation Legace of 8 mai 8-tith, believes that the greatest threat to the Jewish people today is the increasing influence of Arab period

The world is much more complicated than, when the ADL was combathing such homegrown anti-Semiles as Gerald I. K. Smith and other racists in the 1940s and 1950s, he said in an interview with the Jewish Telegraphic Agency. COMPANY ASKED TO BOYCOTT ISRAEL By Ben Kayfetz

TORONTO, July 17 (JTA) — Due to the jurisdictional and political divisions that exist in Canada a major telephone equipment company may be able to slip-through a contract with an Arab power that contains an anti-largel clause stipulating. "no commercial relations with savel and no branches or agencies in Israel: "Northern Telecom, the largest telephone equipment suppliers in Canada and the supplier to Bell Canada, is considering supplying equipment to the Emirates Telecommunications.

Corp, Ltd.

The bidding form for the contract contains a boycott clause and one official of the tirm, Dick Wertheim, has told the press the company is considering the contract though he "could not answer as to what route we might find to satisfy the boycott clause." A second official, Roy Cothier, the vice president of corporate relations, said the company would not harve a clause like that. "We do not break the law."

However, the law; or rather laws, are unclear. The Province of Ontario has a full-dress anti-boycott law categorically forbidding companies in the Province to agree to curtail trade with Israel in return for doing business with Arab states. The federal government of Canade was about to pass such a law recently when the general elections intervened. What is on its books now is only a requirement for firms to report requests to agree to such boycott clauses with no serious sanctions attached.
