### CABINET DECIDES TO EXTEND LIFE OF ELON MOREH BY A NOTHER FIVE WEEKS

JERUSALEM, Dec. 30 (JTA) — The Cabisper decided by majority vote today to extend the life of Elon Moreh for at Heast another five weeks the estimated time required to complete construction of a new settlement at Djebil Kebir six miles away. It was the second extension granted by the Cabinet since the Supreme Court ruled last October 22 that Elon Baoreth was built it legal by onseized Arob lands and must be removed in 30 days.

The first extension expires January 3. Cabiner Secretary Any Proof wead a Cobiner statement that blamed fregretfully. The difficult topographical conditions at the new site and recent heavy rains that slowed down work. It was clear when the Cobiner met that even with helicopters lifting tractors and other heavy equipment to Djebit Kebir, the deadline this Thursday could not be met.

Nevertheless, the three Democratic Movement, ministers voted against the second extension. Justice Minister Shauel Tamir told reporters that he hoped to avoid a clash between the militant Gust Emunin settlers and the army and for that reason he had voted for the original sixweek extension last month. "In my opinion, that was time enough," Tentr soid.

Deputy Premier Simcho Ehrlich, leader of the Liberal Party, supported the extension but said his approval was conditional on formal assurances from the settlers that they will leave Elon-Moreh peacefully. Amnon Rübinstein, Jeader of the opposition Shai faction, denaunced the Cabiner's decision, "There is apparently no limit to the government's readiness, to demean itself and kowtow to the Gush Emunin," he said. Similar comments were made by Labor Alfghment spokesment.

#### Rejects Attorney General's Advice

The Cabiner acted on its own initiative, in reflect rejecting the advice of Atlansey General YItzhak. Zamir who stated, in a written opinion submitted to Premier Menachem Begin, that it was not reasonable to extend the deadline. He soid the extension would be impossible to defend in court should the owners of the affected land, decrease to bring new legal cation. Therefore, Zamir questioned the wisdom and propriety of applying to the Supreme Court fer an extension of the long possed time limit.

Technically, that limit was complied with when several parcels of land were returned last month to Arab villagers, who had filed the original complaint. The government bas acknowledged that the entire settlement must be removed since it had been established for "security" reasons that the high court found not to exist.

Work at Diebil Kebir, which is located on Spate-owned land, began only three weeks ago after the Elon Moreh settlers indicated that they would leave peacefolly. Subsequently, they made, their compliance contingent on the adoption of new legislation to change the legal status of Jewish settlements of the West Bank in a way that would bor future court challenges.

Any such measure is almost certain to be defeated in the Knesset and is therefore unacceptable to the government. A violent controlation between the settlers and the army is still possible. Regin apparently is banking on the assurance by National Religious Party right-winger Haim Druckmon-that the, Gush Emunim leadership has promised that the Bland Moreh settlers would transfer peacefully to Diebil Kebir.

When Israeli officials realized that this was becoming a regular event since the imprisonment and subsequent release of Mayor Bassam Shaka of Nablus, it was decided to use physical means to enforce the ban. The Military Government informed the East Jerusalem Arabs today that if they wanted to convene they would have to obtain the proper permits.

TRAGIC SITES FOR JEWS IN POLAND TO BE MEMORALIZED By Joseph Polakoff

WASHINGTON, Dec. 30 (JTA) Polish Embassy has given assurances that work is proceeding on memorializing Umschlagplatz inl Warsaw, the place of deportation for more than a half-million Warsaw Jews to Nazi death camps, and the gravesite of more than 300 Jews, mostly children, in the village of Pysznica, near Treblinka.

Polish Ambassador Romald Spasaski has wri ten Rep. Elizabeth Holtzman (D. NY) that the works have already started to restore the mass grave" at Pysznica. He wrote "the surrounding area was leveled and fenced. The memorial stone commemorating the victims of Nazi activities is

also being prepared.

Bronislaw Stowinski, the first secretary for information at the Embassy, told the Jewish Telearaphic Agency that "work already has started" on Umschlagplatz where only a small plaque has marked the site and a gas station was built. Polish government has given assurances to Elie Wiesel, chairman of the President's Commission on the Holocaust, it would refurbish the site.

Holtzman appealed to the State Department and the Polish Embassy to memorialize the Pysznica gravesite after Marris Krantz, a survivor of Treblinka, was unable to persuade Palish authorities to do it. Holfzman's office reported that as a feen-aget in 1942, Kantz "sow almost the patite Jew ish population of Pysznica sent to concentration camps . Krantz , himself , was sent to Treblinka , but later escaped . He hid in the woods along with other Jewish children. One by one, these children were caught and executed and buried in a mass grave in a field near Pysznica.

"Krantz witnessed exterminations from his hiding place in the woods. For 37 years he has been determined that this sad burial ground not go annoticed. In 1974, he learned from friends that the site bas become a littered dump....He went to Poland and pleaded with the authorities. Promising a marker, they did nothing. Krantz then turned

#### CHANUKAH MARATHON FNOSIN RUMANIA

BUCHAREST, Dec. 30 (JTA) -- The Chanukah marathan ended in Rumania last week . Chief Rabbi theses Rosen, accompanied by several hundred, lew-ish youngsters, boys and girls, visited 27 communities, from the capital to the smallest of towns, during the 10-day celebration of the Festival of Lights

In each place, the entire Jewish population participated. Youth orchestras and choirs performed Hebrew and Yiddish songs. Rosen, in his speeches, expressed gratifude to the Rumanian government for allowing Jews complete religious and cultural freedom and the right to emigrate for those who wish to join their families in Israel.

At a dozen communities, the Chief Robbi was accompanied by 10 American rabbis representing the Rabbinical Council of the United Jewish Appeal The leaders of the mission, Robbi Stanley Robins—witz-of Washington, D.C., and Robbi Wolf Kelman, of New York, praised Rosen for his leadership of a vital Lewish community in Rumania and thanked the Rumanian government for its humanitarian approach to Jewish problems.

#### RALLY SLATED TO PROTEST FINAL RESTITUTION PAYMENT A GREEMENT BETWEEN BONN AND JEWISH GROUP By Yitzhak Sharail

TEL AVIV. Dec. 30 (JTA) -- The World Jewish Pederation of Nazi Victims has announced that it will hold a demonstration outside the West German Embassy on January 21 to protest the final restitution agreement recently signed between the Bonn-government and the Conference on Jewish Material Claims against Germany. The agreement calls for the payment of 440 million Marks over a three-year period. It will be the last payment to Jewish survivors of the Holocaust.

The Israeli government has endorsed the agree ment. But Juvia Friedman, chairman of the Federa tion, said at a press conference that his group will. challenge it. He said they were dissatisfied by the way Dr. Nahum Goldmann, chairman of the Claims Conference, handled the negotiations and are convinced that the payments are too small.

According to Friedman, the payment of restitu-

tion should continue for at least another 20 years by which time most of the survivors will have passed away and that all payments should be made through Israel, not through the Claims Con-ference in New York. Friedman claimed that the 100.000 Holocoust survivors living in Israel constitute the bulk of the claimants,

The January 21 date was chosen for the demon stration because it will mark the 37th anniversary of the "Final Solution" decision of Wansee which put the Nazi death machine into action.

### HOSPITAL RAPPED FOR BILLING PATIENTS FOR KOSHER FOOD By Ben-Gallob

NEW YORK, Dec. 30 (JTA) == The National Council of Young Israel, an association of Orthodox synagogues, has issued a statement, criticizing the University Hospital of the New York University Medical Center for its "discriminatorys-practice of billing patients for kosher food."

Nothaniel Saperstein, Young Israel president; soid, "kosher food is an inalienable right-of all observant" Jews, "adding that "the practice of billing the partient" at New York Hospital "a surcharge far this food is unconscionable. "He said that, in recent months, several cases have been disclosed of Orthodox patients at New York University Hospital being Charged extra for kosher food. Saperstein said that despite repeated requests, the tospital has refused to correct this situation.

Efforts by the Jewish Telegraphic Agency over the weekend to obtain comment from the hospital were unavailing.

Sperstein declared that persons requiring special diets were not billed by the hospital "unless that special diet happens to be kasher. This is eleerly discriminatory, and smacks of anti-Semitism," He added that "what makes this situation especially galling is the fact that the major hospital insurance companies do consider kosher food as a namal expense and reimburse the haspital trip."

Saperstein said that "in all the cases which have come to our attention, the patients were insured. Not only does the hospital, bill them improperly in the first place, but they are billed even shough the kaster diets are paid for by their insurance policies."
