#### NEO-NAZI LEADER RELEASED By Agron Meler

PARIS, Sept. 29 (JTA) — French police released reas—Nazi Jeoder Marc Fredriksen from custody last night on grounds that they had roevidence to link him to a series of machinegun otocks on Jewish institutions in Paris year, the weekend. Fredriksen and five other suspects were arrested last Friday night when police raided the offices of the outlawed Federation of European Nationalist Action (FANE) but all have been freed for lack of evidence.

On Friday morning, unidentified gunmen sprayed bullets into the Great Synagogue, a memorial monument to Jews departed by the Nazis, a Jewish-run children's home and the Lucien Hirsh School. The pre-dawn attacks caused no casual-ties, Early yesterday, another synagogue was riddled with bullets. Anonymous telephone callers told the French news media that the attacks were the work of the European Nationalist Fasces. (FNE), a neo-Nazi group set up by Fredriksen after FANE was bonned.

The attacks were generally believed to have been in relating in for beatings administered to Fredriksen's supporters by Jewish activisk in a sages of clashes outside a Paris courthouse Sept. 18. The nea-Nazi leader was convicted on that date for inciting race hatted. He will be sentenced next month.

But police sources soid today that Fredriksen and the other five suspects had managed to prove that they had no connection with the weekend's attacks on Jewish premises. According to the police, the attacks could have been carried out or another hoos Nazi group.

#### OUTLAWED NEO-NAZI GROUP HELD RESPONSIBLE FOR MUNICH OUTRAGE By David Kantor

BONN, Sept. 29 (ITA) — The outlawed neo-Nozi para mill tary organization, Wehrsportsgruppe Hoffmann, wa responsible for the bomb blast that killed 12 people and injured 144 at the Skuberdess in Manich last friday evening, West, German General Prosecutor Kurf Rebmann declared yesterday. The outrage was the bloodiest act of terrorism-since the establishment of the Federal Republic and marked a further escalation of neo-Nozi violence in the flast few weeks.

After the Munich bombing, police arrested six leaders of the group, including Karl-Heinz Hoffmann, 42, its founder, and self-styled "Judente." "A search of members' homes yielded a small auantity of explosives."

Police at that time confiscated military material, including an old amored vehicle, arms and ammunition. The group was soid to be planning to overthrow the democratic system by violence.

Notional Democratic Party (NPD) called for the expulsion of all non-Germans from the country in an election film it produced which was broadcast on state television several days ago. A month ago. Two Vietnamese refugees were murdered in Hamburg by neo-Nazis and attacks have been made on hastels housing foreign visitors.

The spread of violence, culminated by the Munich explosion, has anoused new sensitivity to the nea-Nazi danger which had been played down. But with elections only a few days away, political parties are using the issue to accuse each other rather than to analyze the mistakes made in dealing with the pheromeron.

#### SHAMIR WARNS IRANIAN-IRAQI WAR HAS FAR REACHING IMPLICATIONS FOR MIDEAST PEACE AND WORLD AT LARGE By YITZDOK ROBI

UNITED NATIONS, Sept. 29 (JTA) —
Inveli Foreign Minister Vitzhok Shamit declared today that the Iraqi-Itanian war "demolishes" the betief "that the world's oil supply is dependent on a pro-Arab solution" to the Arab-Israeli conflict. "It is all too a lear that the solution of the Arab-Israeli conflict will not provide any miracle fast the region as a whole or eliminate the many other grave conflicts raging in it, "Shamir said in an address this aftermon to the 35th session of the United Nations General Assembly."

much of the world's regular supply of oil, "he said His remarks on the war in the Persian Gulf area were part of a 14-page speech outlining Israel's foreign policy principles and views. His speech included references to the following matters:

\* Autonomy for the Polestinians on the West Bank and Goza Strigs: Shamir expressed hope that the autonomy talks will be resumed "In the near, future." He said that Israel also hopes that the process of romalization with Egypt "will be intensified and will serve as the best possible proof, as a living symbol of the fact that peace can and

must take the place of war."

The Israeli Foreign Minister called on all mations that genuinely seek peace to encourage the progress which has been achieved through the Camp David process. "Let them also bear in mind and give due regard to the fact that by proposing the idea of authonomy in Jadaes' Samaria and the Gaza district, Israel has taken on itself great risks for the sake of peace," Shomir said.

#### Survey of Other Developments

• The Polestine Liberation Organizations Shamir stated that "Anyone who is familiar with the ideology and the terminology of the murder organization which calls itself the PLO as well as the declarations of the various Arab rejectionist states, 'can see beyond all doubt that the term self-determination' as they use it is nothing more than a eighteenism for the destruction of strack."

He contended that the Palestinian Arabs have achieved their self-determination in Jordan, "a state which is the Arab state in Palestine by wirthe of its history, territory, population, bullure and all aspects of its national life."

Jerusalem: Shamir observed that "for the last 150 years there has been a Jewish majority in Jedisalem. Whoever seeks to sever Jerusalem from Israel seeks to decapt not the Jewish peoper." He said. "We hope that nations that seek peace and know the reality which prevails in Jerusalem today will respect the city as the sovereign capital of Israel, the city which will not be divided again, in the same way as Israel, respects the fiby placessof all religions and their freedom in the city."

"The arms race: Shamir charged that the quantity of arms and orders for arms by the Arab countries "have reached astronomical sums." He said there was no precedent "for the amassing of arms on this scale in our regions." He warned that "these arms are designated first and foremost for use against Israel" and called on the UN to urge the Arab states to decrease their armaments. He said Israel is prepared to join efforts to bring about the limitation of arms in the Middle East.

\*Nuclear weapons: Shamir reiterated Israel's proposal for an international conference of all states in the Middle East and adjacent to it to reach a "formal, contractual, multi-lateral convention be "ween all states of the region" on nuclear angs. He also reiterated the Israel government's position "that Israel will not be the flight to introduce nuclear weapons into the Aribi-Israel dispute."

"The situation of Jewish communities around the world: Shamir, drew attention to the worsening situation of Jews in the Soviet Union, Syria and Iran. He charged that in the past year, harsher measures have been imposed on Jews who seek to leave the Soviet Union and appealed to the Soviet government "to remove the restrictions and facilitate the immigration of Jews to Israel."

Anxiety About Jews In Syria, Iran

Ahamir expressed anxiety over the condition of the "bortured" Lewish community in Syria. He said that human rights for Jews in that country are severely curtailed and many Jews "have been imprisoned and their property impounded." He charged that Syria holds its Jews hostage by preventing them from leaving the country.

On the situation of Iranian. Jews, Shamir declared, "The Jews of Iran have suffered painfully in recent months and their situation is deteriorating from day to day. Many Jews have been thrown into joil; others have been given the death sentence, in most cases on charges of contact with Israel." He said Israel is aware of the difficulties of dealing with the present Iranian regime. But he expressedhope that "sight will not be lost of the situation of Jews there who are, peyhaps, among the most vulnerable of the minorities in that troubled land."

Israel yearns for peace: "I wish to call on the Arab strites which are our neighbors and also on the Palestinian Arabs living in Judaea, Samaria and the Gaza district to follow the dictates of reason and to join the peace process," he said. "I wish to call on the other nations of the world to support this course and to prevail upon the Arab states to adopt it. The world at large and not merely our region alone would be settly from this.

## NON- EWISH SPOUSES ACTIVE IN REFORM SYNAGOGUE CONGREGATIONS ACCORDING TO A SURVEY CONDUCTED BY UAHC

NEW YORK, Sept. 29 (JTA) — Growing numbers of non-Jewish spouses in mixed morried couples are being accepted as members of Reform synagogues and enjoy full congregational privileges, according to a survey released yesterday by the Union of American Hebrew Congregations (UAHC), the synagogue arm of Reform. Judaism.

The study, believed to be the first largescale examination of the synagogue status of nonlews, was made public by Donald Day of Buffalo, chairmon-of the UAHC's board of trustees, at a meeting of the board's executive committee.

Responses to the survey were received from 138 Reform syragogues, amounting to nearly 19 percent of those polled. The survey was understaken in response to requests by Reform congretagations for guidance in formulating membership criteria for mixed married couples, according to Robbi Sanford Seltzer, UAHC director of planning-and research, who conducted the survey.

"It had formetly been presumed that typagogibe affiliation was a prerogative limited to Jews, whether they be Jews by birth, or 'gerim' iconverts'), Jews by choice, "Seltzer, explained, adding: "In recent years, however, the situation has changed radically. Not only have mixed marrice couples sought synagogue membership in ever greater numbers, but non-Jewish spouses have actively involved themselves; when permitted, in the life of the synagogue."

#### Survey Findings

Last September, a questionnaire was mailed to the robbi and president, of every member congregation in the UAHC -- 736 Reform synagogues in the U.S., and Canado. Of the 138 congregations that responded, less than one-quarter said they restrict membership to persons of the Jewish faith.

At the same time, nearly one-third of the congregations permit ron-levs to participate in all pulpit ceremonials, while the remainder vary in their degree of permissiveness regarding such activities.

Almost all of the responding congregations sold they allow the non-lewish parent of a Bar. Bar Mirror sold in the column of the congregation, while almost nine out of 10 permit the buried of the non-lewish spouse in the congregational demotery.

The survey also showed that in the overwhelming majority of congregations, rabbis are willing to aftidiately the marriage of children of non-tewishing their and Jewish fathers who identify themselves of Jews, Almost all congregations said they accord the rabbi the right to make such a decision.

Rabbi Alexander Schindler, UAHC president said the survey hesults underscored. "the importance of Reform Judaism's journach' program for those who-seek to embrace judaism."

#### WERNER CAHNMAN DEAD AT 77

NEW YORK, Sept. 29 (17A) -- Funeral services were held today for Dr. Werrier Cahnman, professor emeritus of sociology at Rutgers. University and an activist in the United States and in pre-war Germany in Devish affairs, who died here Saturday of cancer at the age of 77.

Born in Munich, Germany, he was educated

at the University of Berlin and the University of Munich where he received his Ph.D. in sociology. During the 1930s he was a spokesman for Jewish groups in Germany and was the leader of the Central Union of German Jews.

After Hitler's rise to power, Cohagian, wis imprisoned in the Dachau concentration comp. After a year, he was released on the condition that he would know Germany: He came to the University in Nashville. He was also a visiting scholar at the University of Chicago.

During World War II, he was chairman of the American Committee for Dachau and participated, ofter the war in efforts to noise funds for constructing an international memorial on the site of the death camp. During those years he joined the Rurgers University stoff as an assistant preferency.

Cohmon was chairmon of the Rayli Association for the preservation of Lewish cultury trapturents in Europe. He also served as a consultant to the Federation of Jewish Philanthropies and wave aleader in current efforts to promote understanding among racial minorities.

Known for his contribution to the development of historical sociology in the U.S. and Europe, Cahnman was the editor of several books, including, "Sociology and History" (1965), and "inter-Marriage and Jewish Life" (1963).

#### ASSISTANCE SOUGHT IN HUNT FOR WAR CRIMINALS LIVING IN THE U.S.

NEW YORK, Sept. 29 (11A) — The Jewish Community Relations' Council of New York is assisting the Department of Justice's Office of Special Investigations in its altempt to develop new information and evidence against alleged Nazi war criminals and collaborators believed to be living in the United States.

According to Richard Berman, chairman of the JCRC Committee on the Holocoust and Nazi Prosecutions, the JCRC sent a detailed list of cities, villages and concentration comps in the Baltic states, Hungary, Poland, the Ukrajine, Pyelorussia, Rumania, Yugoslavia and Germany to its member agencies, to Jewish community Jeadgrs, to the Jewish media, and to metropolitan area synagogues and centers with a request that it be circulated and posted.
